The "normal" age at which a child begins to read can be anywhere from three to eight years old. Adult participation through the lower levels is very helpful for providing encouragement, discussing storylines, and sounding out unfamiliar words.

No matter which level you select, you can be sure that you are helping your child learn to read, then read to learn!

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
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Let's Play Soccer


Today was Erik's first day at soccer practice.

He pulled his socks over his shin guards.






"Welcome," said Coach Smith to the players.

"Play your best, play fair, and play without using your hands or arms—unless you are the goalie!"








"First, we have to warm up," said Coach Smith.

"Dribbling is hard work!" he said.






"Let's shoot some goals," said Coach Smith.

Erik dribbled the ball and passed it to Beth. Beth kicked the ball into the goal. "Super teamwork!" said Coach Smith.


"The score is 1-0," said Coach Smith, "and it's the yellow team's turn to kick off."


