This is R2-D2. He is a clever machine called a droid.


R2-D2 talks using whistles and beeps. He can talk to other droids, and some humans can understand him as well.

Droid height


R2-D2 is just under one metre tall. He's only a little bit shorter than Anakin when he was a young boy.




R2-D2 can talk to computers that help fly the spaceships. He plugs a special tool into the computer to talk to it.

panel in his body.






Special Powers


R2-D2 moves around on his three wheeled feet.

R2-D2 can record and play messages. Here's Princess Leia, who recorded a secret message for Obi-Wan Kenobi.






Deadly Missions


R2-D2's life is very exciting.

Another time, some Jawas captured R2-D2. The Jawas sold R2-D2 to Owen Lars, Luke Skywalker's uncle.







Parts of C-3PO's body would sometimes fall off. Luckily, it doesn't hurt him and he can be repaired.


Once, a big machine in a factory pulled off C-3PO's head by mistake. The machine put a different head onto his body. Fortunately, R2-D2

his head!


On another mission, C-3PO met the furry Ewoks, who live in tree houses. The Ewoks thought that such a shiny droid must have great magical powers!


Medical Droids

If you are ill or hurt, you might need a medical droid to take care of you!


A team of medical droids rebuilt Darth Vader's body after he was hurt in a fight with Obi-

Droidekas roll into battle like a ball. Then they unwind and shield




Battle droid


themselves in

They have blasters on both arms.




Spider droids walk on four legs.

Droid starfighters can fly in space, with their guns blazing. They can also walk into battle on the tips of their wings. Either way, watch out!






Spy Droids


