These giraffes live on the hot, grassy plains of Africa.





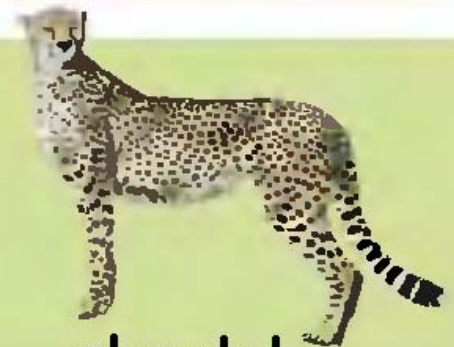

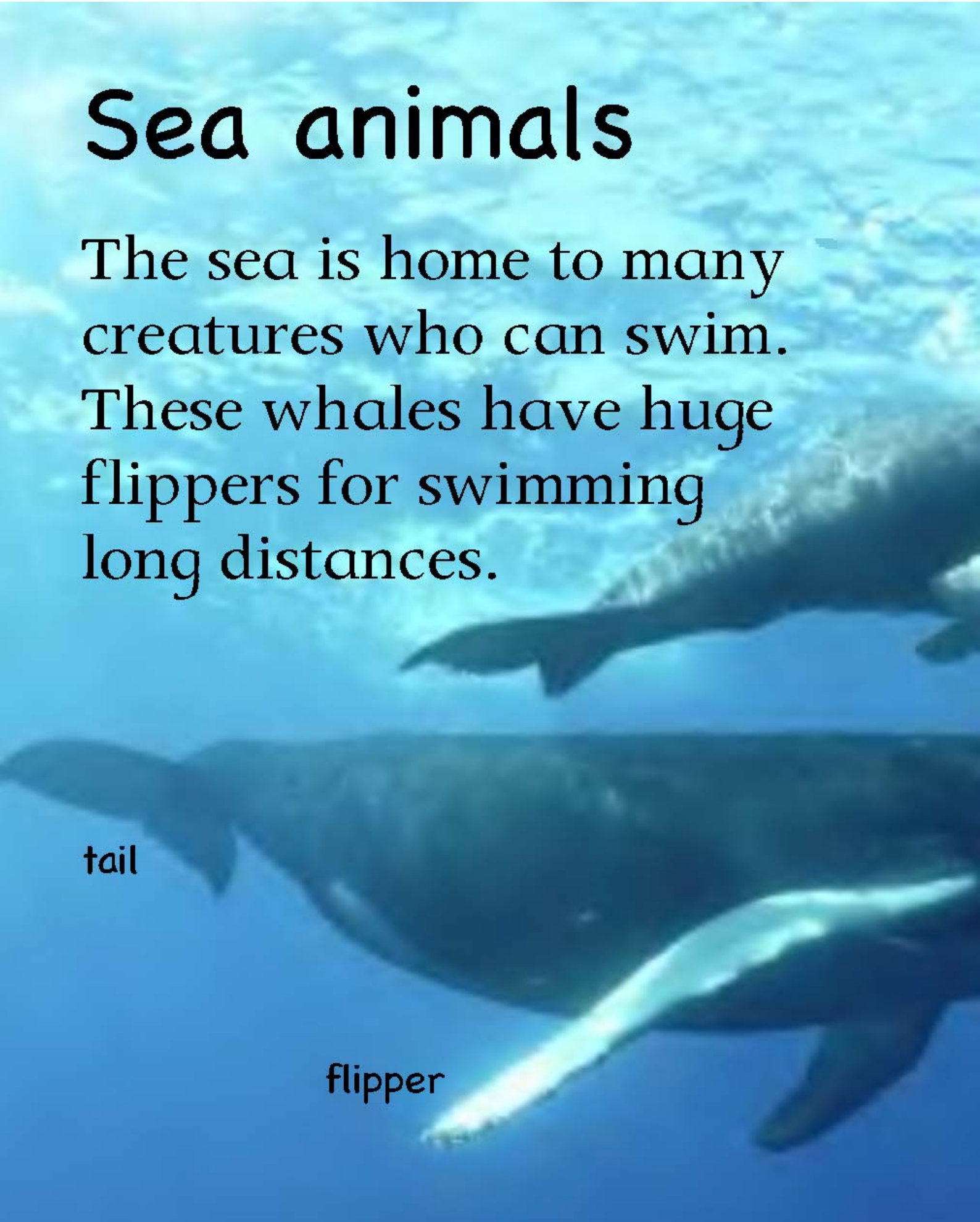


Sea animals
