



HOW MANY OTHER FICTIONAL characters can claim to have been in continuous publication, with new adventures featuring in as many as six magazines per month, for more than 65 years? Okay, there's that guy with the big "S" on his chest. But this book's not about him. It's about Batman. The Dark Knight Detective. The Guardian of Gotham.

The guy's a major household name. Even his supporting cast is familiar to the entire world: Robin, Batgirl, Commissioner Gordon, Alfred, the Joker, Catwoman. Well, I could go on and on. But that's what this book is for – to chronicle the long history of, in my professional opinion, the greatest comic book character ever devised.

Created by a teenaged Bob Kane in the 1930s, Batman combined the best of a dozen great fictional heroes (and a few villains). He's equal parts Sherlock Holmes, Zorro, Scarlet Pimpernel, Shadow, and Dracula; with a host of gadgets and vehicles that even James Bond could never equal. Batman's origin was the stuff of classic literature. An orphan alone in a cruel world that Dickens never dreamed up. The most self-made of all self-made men in popular culture. This guy can't fly or see through walls. He's not superfast and has no retractable claws or magic ring. He's just the guy that any of us could be if we dedicated our lives to being really smart, really athletic, and really scary. He's survived countless traps. He's been frozen, beaten, burnt, broken, and riddled with bullets. He eyen survived that silly TV series in the 1960s.

In fact, each decade seems to bring us a new Batman; never changing but adapted for the times. He was born of the Great Depression and his early tales are dark and brooding. In the 1940s he became more upbeat, more patriotic with an emphasis on detective work with his new sidekick, Robin the Boy Wonder. The 1950s saw him traveling to outer space or dealing with strange scientific anomalies created by the Atomic Age. In the tragically hip 1960s his adventures bordered on parody. The 1970s saw a return to his darker side with a more hardboiled approach to crime. In the 1980s we saw his darkest transformation into a haunted loner obsessed with the vow to his long dead parents. The 1990s saw more emphasis on stories on a grander, apocalyptic scale.

Through all of this Batman and company remained essentially the same. That just goes to show what an indestructible template this world of Gotham is.

And here, in your hands, is the world of Batman in the 21st century.

This is the most exhaustive volume of Gotham lore ever compiled. Scott Beatty and the wizards at Dorling Kindersley have put together an invaluable reference that I know will have a permanent place by my keyboard. Bat-Gadgets and locales are shown in minute detail. The science and technology behind each is explained. Many of these images appear here for the first time. And the Rogues Gallery! All the most memorable foul fiends, twisted geniuses and career criminals that Batman has defeated or fought to a draw are given full biographical treatment.

Batman's friends and allies are also here with their full histories and vital stats.

I wish I'd had this book ten years ago when I was first hired to write Batman adventures. It would have saved a lot of hours poring over old comic books. (But that was fun too!) The Batman universe is a fascinating one to play in and I love losing myself in it.

As I say when I'm heading to the office to write, "Well, time to get back to Gotham City..."

PIATH OF THE BATMAN




Bruce Wayne's Childhood ended the night his parents were brutally murdered before his eyes in Gotham City's notorious Crime Alley. The young orphan swore a solemn oath to avenge their deaths, embarking on a worldwide odyssey to forge his mind and body into a living weapon.

Years later, he returned to Gotham a master of virtually every known fighting discipline, as well as a cunning detective and relentless manhunter. Believing criminals to be "a cowardly and superstitious lot," Bruce crafted a new face to strike terror into their hearts. He would become a creature of the night, descending upon evil clothed

in the mantle of the bat!

The time was 10:47 p.m., a moment burned indelibly in Bruce Wayne's memory. As the Waynes were returning home from the cinema, Dr. Thomas Wayne was shot dead by a gun-toting hoodlum. Martha Wayne's screams for help were silenced by further bullets, leaving young Bruce sobbing beside his parents' still bodies on the trashstrewn pavement of Crime Alley as the unidentified gunman fled into the Gotham night.

Though he swore to avenge his parents' deaths by warring on all criminals, young Bruce was unaware that a crucial part of his destiny lay quite literally right beneath his feet. As a toddler, he had fallen into the bat-infested limestone caves beneath Wayne Manor. And as an orphan child, those same bats haunted his nightmares with the

nightmares with th rush of leathery wings. Only in adulthood would Bruce embrace the bat as inspiration.

Whether Bruce realized it or not, the image of a bat was deeply-rooted in his childhood psyche.








A LASTING IMPACT There are 127 major styles of combat. While abroad, Bruce learned them all, from Aikido to Yaw-Yan. His knowledge of so many varied disciplines has made Bruce an unconventional and unpredictable opponent, quite capable of countering a Savate kick with a Caporeira dodge, then kayoing with a paw-knuckle strike!



At age 14, Bruce Wayne began his global sojourn, attending courses at Cambridge, the Sorbonne, and other European universities. Beyond academia, Bruce acquired more "practical" skills. Frenchman Henri Ducard made him an apprentice in manhunting. The ninja Kirigi schooled Bruce in steath and the ways of the shadow warrior. African Bushmen taught hunting techniques, while Nepalese monks revealed healing arts. And so it went for 12 years as Bruce matured into manhood.





THE BAT-SUIT



Pound for pound, body armor pales in comparison. Designed for maximum utility, the Dark Knight's costume is both fire-retardant and chemical-resistant, with triple-weave Kevlar positioned primarily around the torso's Bat-Symbol, an intentional and well-protected target. In addition, Batman's scalloped cape doubles as an offensive weapon: its weighted ends provide a physical wallop in tandem with its proven psychological impact upon criminals. The cowl – Kevlar-lined with a steel gorget – features various micro-electronics links, as well as night-vision technology to allow the Dark Knight to see in the dark. The main purpose of the Bat-Suit is to act as camouflage and to instill fear. Its basic design has remained virtually unchanged; however, it has been frequently updated to advance the Dark Knight's war on crime.

THE TRANSFORMING MASK

Donning his cowl is a symbolic act for Batman. By putting it on, he reaffirms his oath to avenge the murders of his parents. Physically, the cowl allows the Dark Knight to mimic a bat's natural abilities with technology: Starlite lenses to stalk in utter darkness; auralelectronics to discern his prey's faintest whispers; and inertial

navigators to keep him flying straight and true.



THE COWL

Impacts to Batman's cowl are dissipated by a complex weave of selectable para-aramid fibers and exotic metal threads. The cowl's internal comm-link enables voice-command control of various equipment.

BEHIND THE MASK The standard cowl (sans electronics) is sewn in a single-piece memory-weave pattern, stretching over Bruce's head and returning to normal shape. 
ALL WIRED UP

HE WOULDN'T USE A GUN – EVER. So indelible was the memory of his parents' fatal shootings that Bruce Wayne vowed never to take up firearms to fulfill his crime-fighting agenda. Justice, not vengeance, was his goal, requiring the Dark Knight to equip himself with non-lethal weapons. To make the Batman a real and visceral presence, penetrating grapnels would give the illusion of swooping flight high above Gotham's streets. Batarangs would meld razor-sharp shuriken with the Outback boomerang to create

> an unerring signature weapon. A potent array of chemical gas grenades and explosive capsules would provide just the right distractions needed to end a fight, while flexible, reinforced Bat-Cuffs would truss up his foes for the G.C.P.D. to haul away!

WALL-PENETRATING GRAPNEI Though not normally an offensive weapon, the Dark Knight's wall-penetrating grapnel is still an indispensable addition to his arsenal. GOTHAM (ITY



GOTHAM CITY IS ONE of the oldest-established Eastern urban centers in the US. It nestles at the mouth of the turbid Gotham River upon islands once peopled by the vanished Miagani tribe of Native Americans. Though it now resides in infamy for its rampant per capita crime rate, florid urban legends, and brooding Gothic spires, Gotham's 19th-century patrons once envisioned their community as a concrete and steel stronghold for pious righteousness and booming industrial growth. Bolstered for generations by the business ventures of the wealthy Wayne family,

Gotham's economy has indeed helped the city to flourish as a technological hub, but one founded upon the swampy soils of slow and inexorable moral decay, despite the best of intentions.

SANCTUARY

Historians possess no concise annals detailing the 17th-century origins of Gotham Village, which remain a mystery. However, the chilling "Peniteace Tale of Gotham" establishes that the hambers very first dwelling was, in fact, an asylum predating the city's infamous Arkham madhouse.

As the story goes, a devoutly religious mulatto named Hiram (surname, if ary, unknown) abandoned plans to erect a chapel of faith when London-born Epsilpah Clevenger implicate chimself and Hiram in a web of murder. By Clevenger's insistence, Hiram's church became a sanatorium, and if the legend is to be believed, Gotham's first two residents were self-



CIVIC DUTY

Batman is by no means the only heroic presence associated with the city that once boasted the headquarters of the mighty Justice Society of America. Gotham has also been home to the original Green Lantern and to the Black Canary. Other masked vigilantes waging private war on wrongdoing have included the Ragman, Black Lightning, Joe Public, Geist, Pagan, and teenager Lonnie Machin, who attempted to abolish Gotham's "inadequate system of justice" as the authority-bashing Anarky (right).

GOTHAM FACED ITS DARKEST HOURS. Having just barely contained "The Clench," a virulent outbreak of Ebola Gulf-A which killed thousands, Gotham City was illprepared when the Cataclysm struck. The earthquake's tremors measured a staggering 7.6 on the Richter Scale, but its aftershocks were far more unsettling. Declared a Federal "No Man's Land" by the US Government, Gotham's bridges were dynamited and its arteries to the civilized world were severed. But the Dark Knight would not concede. Even as Gotham devolved into violent fiefdoms lorded over by liberated criminals and industrious street

> gangs, Batman and his closest associates remained, fighting from within to take the city back one sector at a time.



GOTHAM REBUILT



LEX LUTHOR SUCCEEDED where Bruce Wayne failed. Openly defying Congressional edict, the power-hungry Metropolis mogul capitalized on public opinion rallying to reverse Gotham City's status as a condemned No Man's Land. While the US Government argued whether or not Gotham deserved a second chance at life, Luthor set his plans in motion, descending upon Gotham and establishing his "Camp Lex" in Grant Park as a beachhead for retaking the city. After fierce debate, Congress reneged and the ambitious "Billion Dollar Build-Up" Federal Works Project began, teaming LexCorp, STAR Labs, Wayne Enterprises and its charitable arm the Wayne Foundation, as well as the US Army Corps of Engineers in rebuilding Gotham from the ground up.

MASTER BUILDER Lex Luthor's plans to rebuild Gotham were wholly motivated by corporate greed. Even while galvanizing Gotham's residents to pull together and dig their way out of NML, he plotted to destroy the city's property records so that he could seize any land he desired. Amazonian bodyguard

GOTHIC TO GLASS

New Gotham's skyline is an amalgam of vesterdays and tomorrows. Newly-erected towers of glass stand side-by-side with granite Gothic citadels preserved from the old city. This dichotomy of architecture appeals to both native Gothamites and the city's teeming newcomers, the latter attracted to the blank slate afforded by a reborn Gotham. The city once described as a "sinkhole of corruption" now looks forward to a hard-won era of peace and prosperity.

ARCHITECT OF HOPE

By committing the construction might of his company LexCorp to rebuilding Gotham City, Lex Luthor scored an incomparable public relations coup. But while Luthor's efforts were lauded as worthy of a Nobel Prize, the powerhungry tycoon had his eyes on a more lucrative trophy. As LexCorp re-rooted itself in Gotham's financial district, Luthor capitalized on his new humane image to make a successful bid for the US Presidency!

MASS TRANSIT

While repairs to Gotham's antiquated subway continue, commuters can now travel on the new Rapid Transit System monorail. Spiraling through Gotham on 134 miles of elevated track, the G.R.T.S. monorail is the world's longest independently-operated conveyance.

In Bruce's own mind, Batman became the dominant reality from that moment forward as his quest for justice overshadowed all other personal needs or desires. So single-minded in his crusade, Bruce thinks of himself only as the Dark Knight. The bored billionaire playboy Bruce Wayne – so well known to Gotham City – is merely a ruse, distracting all those around him from the fact that his beneficent concerns take a decidedly more hands-on approach when day turns to night and the Batman changes into his "working clothes."



MOST ELIGIBLE BACHELOR

For a bevy of starlets, sirens, and socialites, Bruce Wayne will always be "the one that got away."
Though spied by paparazzi on the arms of such fetching beauties as diva LaDonna Diaz or cover-girl Lydia Granger, the confirmed bachelor, so often "called away on business," rarely finishes a late-night tryst. This only makes Bruce's potential paramours all the more ardent, each convinced she might be the one to finally reel him in.



FOATO THE FORE



SOMETIMES LOVE can be the greatest foe of all. Although the Dark Knight's relentless crusade ill affords time for dedication to affairs of the heart, Batman has found himself distracted by romance more than once. In the seemingly endless queue of beautiful women spied on the arm of billionaire Bruce Wayne, only a handful have glimpsed the "real" man behind the bored playboy facade. And of this chosen few, the names Julie,

Vicki, Talia, Silver, Shondra, Kathy, Vesper, and Ivy have all given the Dark Knight significant pause over the years. In her own way, each of these women has forced Bruce to choose between true love and the war he has pledged to fight until his dying day.

THE HEART OF THE BAT

Batman protects his heart with body armor; Bruce Wayne shields his by being distant and aloof. Bruce has surrendered to the realization that true happiness will always be secondary to his crusade. No other woman has kindled greater passion in Batman than the daughter of Rā's al Ghūl. But the Dark Knight will not compromise his devotion to justice for perhaps the love of



DR. SHONDRA KINSOLVING

Before Bruce could reveal his feelings to personal physician Shondra Kinsolving, Bane crippled him. Shondra, meanwhile, was kidnapped by her evil half-brother Benedict Asp, who warped her latent empathic abilities to evil. Though Bruce defeated Asp and rescued Shondra, the damage to her mind was too great. As she healed Bruce's lingering injuries, Shondra's psyche regressed into childhood.

KATHY KANE

When Bruce dreamt of the future, he often found Kathy Kane - once the girl-gangbuster Batwoman - the focus of an idyllic life with the Dark Knight happily married and satisfyingly retired. But neither Bruce and Kathy, nor their masked alter-egos, ever acted upon their mutual attraction. And when the lovely circus owner was killed by the League of Assassins' Bronze Tiger, it was far too late.

Her first kiss is poison; the second its antidote. When they first met, lyv's toxic lips planted a seed of toxic rapture in Bruce. But when she later kissed a dying Dark Knight, Ivy unknowingly cured her intended victim and established a budding sexual tension between them!



Just as Bruce began to acknowledge his ardor for WKGC DJ and "Siren of the Night" Vesper Fairchild, the city's great earthquake fractured their relationship. Vesper chose to leave Bruce and Gotham behind during No Man's Land, a decision she regretted on her return to the rebuilt city. Only time will tell if their love will find more solid footing... or remain on shaky ground.







THE WAYNE BUILDING

Erected in 1939, the Wayne Building – headquarters of WayneCorp and the Wayne Foundation – is one of the few remaining landmarks of Old Gotham to survive the city's great earthquake. At 78 stories (1, 207 ft to the tip of its antenna), the Wayne Building is also Gotham's tallest pre-quake structure. It continues to be the nerve center of the city's financial district.

CONSIDERED THE BACKBONE of Gotham, Wayne Enterprises and its various subsidiary corporations employ the largest portion of the city's considerable work-force. From wealth amassed by the extensive real-estate holdings of Judge Solomon Wayne, His Honor's heirs established Wayne Shipping and Wayne Chemical, companies energized by America's booming Industrial Revolution. As the 20th century dawned, WayneCorp and its fledgling aviation division ushered the city past the woes of the Great Depression and two World

Wars. Today, WayneTech and Wayne Aerospace stand at the forefront of pharmaceutical and technological research and development. The charitable Wayne Foundation reinvests the fruits of the Wayne holdings' labors in philanthropic endeavors at home and abroad.

AFTER THE CRASH

Wayne Enterprises is perhaps the only Gotham-based corporation to weather the city's calamitous earthquake and year of No Man's Land. The company ensured its continued survival by transferring the burden of its manufacturing to satellite facilities elsewhere. Profits earned during NML were some of the first capital funds applied to the city's eventual rebuilding. Without hesitation, Wayne Enterprises exceeded Lex Luthor's investments in Gotham's future.

A missing WayneTech prototype hydrogen generator, a clean and efficient electrical source, produced its fuel via bi-photolysis of the green algae *Chlaymydomonas MGA 161* and the bacterium *Rhodovulu n sulfidophilum W-1S*. Now it powers the Baicave!

HOISTED ASSETS

Wayne Shipping is at a loss to explain a pur loined 10-ton capacity rail crane. Leased from Gotham's Met-Rail, this invaluable piece of heavy equipment went missing from the company's Tricorner Yards division. Wayne Enterprises was forced to pay the crane's manufacturer more than \$1.5 million as reimbursement.

THANKS TO NO MAN'S LAND, the Gotham City Police Department has earned a new level of public respect. Dubbed the "Blue Boys" during that terrible year, a cadre of Gotham cops led by Jim Gordon remained behind to keep the peace in the quakedevastated and isolated city. With Gotham rebuilt, Gordon has retired, knowing that a few honest cops remain, including Det. Renee Montoya new Commissioner Michael Akins and Chief of Police Mackenzie "Hardback" Bock. As before, Lt. Harvey

Bullock's Major Crimes Unit boasts detectives Renee Montoya, Crispus Allen, Joely Bartlett, Vincent Del Arrazio, Dagmar Procinow, Tommy Burke, Ivan Cohen, and Andrea "Andi" Kasinski

STATELY HOME to the Wayne family for nearly 150 years, Wayne Manor overlooks Gotham City from the wealthy Crest Hill community of Bristol Township. The sprawling mansion was commissioned by railroad mogul Jerome K. van Derm in 1855, but was unoccupied until Solomon Zebediah Wayne – Bruce Wayne's great-great-grandfather – and his brother Joshua set up residence in 1858. Domicile to the generations of Waynes who followed, the Manor sadly fell victim to Gotham's terrible earthquake. His home damaged beyond repair, Bruce Wayne reluctantly elected to totally redesign the Manor, erecting a veritable fortress inspired by the Gothic edifices of Old Gotham architect Cyrus Pinkney, High battlements and parapets adorn the modern Manor, making it a fitting sanctuary for the Dark Knight who dwells within.





HOME WRECKER

Though his properties in Gotham had been quakeproofed, Bruce Wayne's own home was not. Wayne Manor sat directly above a geological fault-line. When the tectonic plates slipped, the Manor was cleaved in half, collapsing into the Batcave below.

CASTLE OF THE BAT

The new Wayne Manor is a pastiche of Gothic architecture combined with the castle dwellings of Bruce's own Scottish and Norman roots. The Manor's foundations are composed of aggregate salvaged from the original mansion, while its formidable turrets – shipped to Gotham stone by stone – once belonged to the 15th-century Scottish keep of the MacDubh clan.

During the Civil War, the brothers Wayne hid Southern slaves in the caverns beneath Wayne Manor, an artery of the "Underground Railroad" leading to freedom in the North.







THE NEW BUTCHAL



IN THE AFTERMATH of the earthquake that decimated Gotham City and razed the original Batcave, a redesigned headquarters reflects a new era in the Dark Knight's crusade. The rebuilt complex utilizes the cavern's height to greater advantage, with eight separate levels now making up Batman's underground refuge. Amid limestone stalactites and stalagmites, retractable walkways bridge multi-tiered structures, including an "island" computer platform with seven linked Cray T932 mainframes and a state-of-the-art hologram projector. Similar hi-tech updates to training facilities, forensics laboratory, library, and vehicle access have made this re-imagined Batcave a more formidable garrison than ever before.





INFORMATION OVERHAUL

Situated atop a rock ledge on the main level of the new Batcave, the island computer platform has been upgraded to permit speedy access to Batman's copious criminal files. Holographic displays Building wire provide three-dimensional imaging of various frames and egress routes rogues, while a retractable glass map features detailed diagrams of New Gotham, as well as archival maps of the ruined city beneath.





TO THE DARK KNIGHT, it is simply "The Car." But on the mean streets of Gotham City, the Batmobile has become the stuff of urban legend to the unfortunate criminals who have stared upon its ominous bat-headed grille-work. Modified from the chassis up by Bruce Wayne himself, the current Batmobile is a turbo-charged and armor-plated street fighter specially outfitted for Batman's unrelenting war on crime. Equipped with the latest technology – including several pirated WayneTech prototypes – the Batmobile's versatility as high-speed transport, roving forensics lab, and armored dreadnought has made it an indispensable addition to Batman's crusade.

REAR DEFENSES

Few cars can match the Batmobile for sheer speed and acceleration. Nevertheless, Batman has installed several deterrents to thwart any criminal fool enough to give his vehicle chase. These reardeployed defenses include high-viscosity, Teflonbased lubricant slicks, blinding smoke-screen clouds, and tire-piercing caltrops.

ABSOLUTE CONTROL The fully-automated Batmobile may be operated by voice-command radio links in Batman's cowl, as well as by a limited-function, hand-held key-pad and Remote System Controller.

If Batman is incapacitated or rendered unconscious, the Batmobile initiates a five-tier defense system to protect both its driver and itself. Phase 3: Hypersonic trilling spheres are released. Phase 4: Motion-tracking glue nozzles eject superadhesive foam. Phase 5: The Batmobile self-destructs!

From stealthy leather-winged hang-gliders and collapsible single-occupant



ON BORROWED WINGS

Batman once maintained aircraft in his original Batcave, although launching these vehicles so close to Wayne Manor's neighboring estates threatened to compromise his secret identity. The Dark Knight now "borrows" speciallymodified jets and helicopters from Wayne Aerospace's business and military contracts. A few very specific craft remain fueled and ready for Bruce Wayne's private use, no questions asked.





THE DARK KNIGHT'S LONE VIGIL was not to last. From the very start, Bruce Wayne trusted a scant few with the details of his secret life. His stalwart valet Alfred would be the first, witness to the birth of the Batman following the tragedy befalling young Bruce's beloved parents in Crime Alley. But as time and his crusade wore on,



Over tea and conversation, the two enjoy a tender kiss, before a wounded Dark Knight spoils the mood.

MERCEY MANSION

Patients newly committed to Arkham
Asylum are greeted with a nightmarish
facility that seems hardly conducive to
mental health! When Bane demolished
the more modern hospital complex,
Dr. Jeremiah Arkham was forced
to occupy the labyrinthine
Mercey Mansion. Located just a
few short miles fromGotham's
DiAngelo Sewage Treatment
Plant, Arkham smells of
more than just fear.

ACCOMMODATIONS

The incarceration of Gotham's criminally insane necessitates specialized cells for each inmate. Serial killer Mr. Zsasz requires maximum restraints at all times while Poison Ivy is kept behind shatterproof Plexiglas to avoid contact with her unique pheromones.



SECURITY PERSONNEL

Arkham's security monitors maximum-risk patients via closed-circuit TV. Batons and side-arms are standard for all guards, while orderlies are permitted tasers and pepper-spray.

MADHOUSE RULES

Following Gotham's horrific earthquake, Dr. Arkham was left utterly alone to guard his crazed charges. To prevent their escape, he sealed the building with steel shutters controlled from his office suite. Meanwhile, the inmates ran amok while food and other supplies dwindled!

Dr. Jeremiah Arkham

Psychotherapist Jeremiah Arkham has dedicated his life to curing the dangerously deranged, no doubt to atone for the sins of his uncle, Dr. Amadeus Arkham, founder of the Asylum which bears their surname. Preeminent among the Dark Knight's rogues gallery, the Joker is certifiably psychotic, driven to the lunatic fringe by a chemical bath which bleached his skin white, dyed his hair shocking green, and peeled his lips back into a leering scarlet rictus. Accessorized with electrocuting joy-buzzers and acid-spurting boutonnieres, the Joker has reinvented mass-murder and terrorism as comedic chaos. His crimes, however, are no laughing matter. Utterly unrepentant, the Joker has

delightedly maimed or killed several of the Batman's closest allies... and would gladly do worse if given the chance.

ORIGINAL SIN

Though his story changes from day to day, details of one possible "origin" suggest that the Joker was formerly a failed comedian coerced into crime after the deaths of his wife and unborn child.

CHEMICAL PEALS

Barely surviving his toxic swim, the failed comedian emerged from the chemical sludge reborn as an unhinged and ironic clown determined to drive the world just as crazy as himself!



As "Catwoman," she lined her purse in a long string of daring heists, eluding capture by the Dark Knight... but not escaping his notice. More altruistic than she would ever admit, Selina occasionally plies her larcenous trade in order to help Gotham's fellow "castaways." A bright, shiny bauble, however, can still catch this thief's sultry green eyes.

DRAMATIC PAWS

Make no mistake, this kitten has claws... and she isn't afraid to use them! Though not a formal martial arts stylist, Selina practices a smattering of several disciplines, including leet Kune Do and Jujitsu, as well as a few boxing moves taught to her by ex-heavyweight champ Ted Grant, once the hard-hitting hero Wildcat!








Two-**L**ace

"APOLLO" DENT As handsome as he was brilliant, Harvey Dent was dubbed "Apollo" by a Gotham media enamored with the young, crusading district attorney.





Facing an airtight case against him, crime boss Vincent Maroni refused to go down without evening the score against Dent. Maroni threw acid - smuggled to him by Assistant D.A. Adrian Fields - in Dent's face and was shot dead by court bailiffs!



IN SICKNESS AND IN HEALTH

Despite Harvey's horrific injury, Gilda Grace Dent trusted that facial reconstruction would mend her husband's ghastly profile. But Harvey's scars were more than skin deep, and Gilda divorced Harvey after numerous plastic surgeries and years of psychiatric care failed to eclipse Two-Face's evil.

HARVEY DENT is a man divided. Childhood abuse fractured Dent's psyche right down the middle, leaving respected Gotham District Attorney Harvey Dent subconsciously sublimating a darker and more violent persona as an adult. Fittingly, this duality was mirrored in Dent's good-luck charm, a "two-headed" silver dollar. Once Batman's ally in justice, Dent's evil side reared its ugly head when,

amid a packed courtroom, gangster Vincent Maroni hurled acid in the D.A.'s handsome visage. As the left side of Dent's face dissolved, so did the psychic walls keeping his dark reflection in check. With good and evil wrestling for control, Dent scarred his lucky piece so that it would be the final arbiter for his new persona, Two-Face,

a schizoid criminal mastermind, whose every vile act would be decided by the flip of a coin!

DOUBLE JEOPARDY

Without Dr. Rudolph Klemper, Two-Face might not exist! Apprehended by Batman, Klemper had savagely murdered 16 elderly Gothamites. But prosecutor Harvey Dent lacked sufficient evidence to convict the serial killer, who was acquitted of all charges. Knowing he could not be re-tried for his crimes, Klemper who admitted to multiple personalities – gleefully confessed his sins to Dent, whom he believed to be a kindred schizophrenic spirit. Klemper was too correct in his diagnosis, perishing shortly thereafter from a bomb planted by Dent's emerging dark half.

KILL ALL THE LAWYERS Believing that justice is arbitrary, Harvey Dent holds any practitioner of the law in great contempt. As judge, jury, and executioner, Two-Face has murdered his own courtappointed attorneys and carried out lethal litigation against scores of Gotham legal eagles.





Sometimes the good side prevails. Never one to turn down an even bet, Two-Face let his lucky silver dollar decide the fate of a dying Batman, poisoned by himself, the Joker, and the Penguin. When Robin offered a coin-toss for the antidote, Dent lost the flip and strong-armed the Penguin to relinquish the cure!

OSWALD CHESTERFIELD COBBLEPOT is a rare bird among the Batman's foes: he has actually made crime pay! Nattily attired in top hat and tails, Cobblepot is better known as "The Penguin," a criminal mastermind with a penchant for ornithology and trick umbrellas concealing automatic weapons, flame-throwers - or worse. Tiring of the Dark Knight foiling his every scheme, Cobblepot abandoned his parasols and opened

Gotham's most famous nightclub, The Iceberg Lounge. Behind this less-than-legitimate business front, the Penguin continues his larcenous ways as a "fixer" entrenched in the Gotham underworld and one step removed from Batman's reach.

BIRDS OF A FEATHER

Cobblepot's fascination with ornithology dates back to his early childhood when his widowed mother ran a pet shop specializing in exotic birds. Short, paunchy, and burdened with a prominent, aquiline nose, Oswald's school-yard nickname, "Penguin," was made worse by his mother's vehemence that he carry an umbrella, even on cloudless days. Mrs. Cobblepot feared that her son might succumb to pneumonia - just as his father had - after a sudden, sharp, cold rain shower. Oswald's spirits were comforted by his feathered friends in the pet shop. These birds became his constant companions in the years that followed, when the Penguin turned to crime in order to acquire the wealth and power necessary to rise above all those who ridiculed him.



CORPORATE TAKEOVER

The Penguin recently weathered an attempt to close down his celebrated Iceberg Lounge nightclub when Bruce Wayne purchased the building and became his new landlord! Rather than evict his unsavory tenant, Wayne has allowed Cobblepot to remain, keeping the black marketeer right where the Dark Knight can watch over him.

THE RIDDLER




CONUNDRUMS are the mania of Edward Nigma. Suffering an obsessivecompulsive desire for attention, Nigma's disorder unfortunately manifests itself in

malfeasance. As the Riddler, he has attempted to steal the spotlight from Gotham City's other notable career criminals by concocting the most cryptic crimes, each prefaced by clues in the form of inscrutable riddles. Though utterly perplexing to Gotham's Finest, Nigma's puzzles find a formidable opponent in the Batman, whose deductive skills have proven superior to the Riddler's enigmatic engineering. Incarcerated more often than not, Nigma wracks his brain to plot that one mystery the Dark Knight won't be able to solve.

ANSWERS TO EVERY QUESTION

In psychological interviews, Edward Nigma admits that his quest to rise above anonymity has roots in his youth. In a school contest, Nigma (then Eddie Nashton) cheated in order to assemble a puzzle more quickly than his classmates. With the prize came respect, recognition, and the notice of bullies who rarely appreciated Eddie's "cleverness." As an adult, Edward would have demonstrated his mental superiority to Gotham's police if not for a bullying Batman. Though he claims that his crimes are "performance art," Nigma's misdeeds mask a deeper yearning – to be loved!



SLEIGHT-OF-HAND An admirer of late great escape artist Harry Houdini, the Riddler's tangled trap displays a similar flair for dramatic SHOCK ATTACK!

Ivy used

Only time will tell if their blossoming friendship means more to Ivy's personal growth than just a comely criminal collaboration.



BAD MUSHROOMS







AA'S AL GHŪL





Bane injected measured doses of Verom into his cortico-implants via controls on his wrist-gauntlet.



AWKWARD AND GANGLY as a youth, Jonathan Crane overcame the school yard bullies who called him "Scarecrow" by conquering his own fears and delving into the study of dread. A professor of psychology

and biochemistry in adulthood, he revenged himself on the Gotham University regents who fired him for his unorthodox teaching methods by quite literally scaring them to their deaths. As the Scarecrow, Crane used fright as a weapon, creating personalized phobias with his diabolical "fear gas" in order to further his criminal reign of terror.

ANXIETIES OF YOUTH

Jonathan Crane endured the taunts of his fellow schoolchildren, who likened the youth - with his herkyjerky gait - both to a cornfield Scarecrow and the spindly, bookish Ichabod Crane of Washington Irving's The Legend of Sleepy Hollow.

THE TASTE OF FEAR Crane immersed himself in the biochemical analysis of fear during his years at Gotham University. In time, he would synthesize terror into his own potent potable, a hallucinatory fear gas capable of creating waking nightmares!

His bat-gland extract did that and more, mutating Langstrom into a crazed half-human/half-bat monstrosity when he foolishly tested the serum on himself. Only through the intervention of his fiancée Francine and Gotham's *other* "Batman" would

Langstrom regain his humanity. Though Kirk later refined the extract and aided the Dark Knight as an occasional crime-fighting comrade, his animal side would eventually dominate, making "Man-Bat" both a blessing and a curse to Kirk, Francine, and the burgeoning Langstrom family.

MAN-BAT FAMILY

Though still wrestling with his Man-Bat persona, which reappears occasionally when latent elements of the Bat-Extract bring about his physical transformation, Kirk has settled into a modicum of "normal life" with his family. Kirk, Francine, daughter Rebecca, and son Aaron have settled in a rural hamlet midway between Gotham and Blüdhaven, where the former Man-Bat now serves as Director of Genetics Study at STAR Haven Labs.



BAD MEDICINE

The bat-extract restored Kirk's hearing, though not without unwelcome side-effects. As his ears became hypersensitive, a horrified Kirk found his entire genetic structure transforming into a hideous human/bat hybrid.



The shock of Gotham's Cataclysm may have precipitated another of Wesker's personas, Quakemaster. Claiming responsibility for the devastation, Quakemaster demanded a \$100,000,000 ransom or else he would unleash another "crustal displacement"!

When Wesker finally loosed his pent-up emotions, he killed a man in a barroom brawl and was sentenced to Blackgate Penitentiary. There he first encountered the puppet Scarface, who had been whittled by an inmate named Donnegan from the wood of Blackgate's Gallows Tree. Wesker murdered Scarface's maker and gave the gruesome gangster doll a voice. Together, Scarface and the allegedly "unwilling" Ventriloquist carved out a significant niche in Gotham's underworld. It remains unclear who's really pulling the strings in their bizarre relationship. THROWING THEIR VOICES Pleading himself an accessory to

Scarface's crimes, Wesker has successfully convinced Gotham's courts that his sanity is in question, necessitating treatment in Arkham Asylum. Dr. Jeremiah Arkham's psychological profile finds that Wesker's anti-social personality uses the Scarface dummy as a conduit to commit violent crimes. Wesker himself believes that Scarface is haunted by the souls of the 313 men hanged upon the Gallows Tree from which the dummy was sculpted. 

But as the "Paper Monkey" - ranking warrior in the clandestine Cult of the Monkey Fist – Shiva has also faced the Dark Knight and his squires in mortal combat. They trust Shiva only as far as they can throw her.

MARTIAL LAW

To hasten Bruce Wayne's return after he was injure by Bane, Shiva killed an armless sensei while wear the mask of Tengu, a bat spirit. She passed the tote to Bruce, who was soon faced with seven deadly martial artists seeking vengeance for their master's death.

KUNG-FU FIGHTER

Formerly Sandra Woosan's ally in her hunt for her sister's killer, martial arts guru Richard Dragon briefly became a reluctant operative of the spy network G.O.O.D. with Shiva and Bronze Tiger, Dragon retired from adventuring to seek the path of peace, but has emerged from seclusion to impart his unique expertise to Oracle and the Huntress.

A FAMILY AFFAIR

Batman encountered Shiva in the Middle East during Jason Todd's search to discover the identity of his real mother. One of three

possible candidates, Shiva divulged that she was not lason's mother only after the Dark Knight had bested her in personal combat and injected the martial mistress with the truth serum Sodium Pentothal.







Hugo Strange turns men to monsters with mind and body-altering drugs. Nocturna bewitches with her own patented perfumes. Maxie Zeus rules over mortals convinced by his claim to godhood, while Black Mask instills his fellow False-Facers with the belief that they are

similarly empowered by their own masks. General McGog dominates his well-trained regiments with fear, punishing insubordination with death, while King Snake outsmarts and outfights any minion fool enough to mistake his blindness for weakness.



GENERAL McGOG

Supreme commander of the Trojan Army - a legion of elite mercenaries - General Horatio McGog sentenced Jean Paul Valley to death when the Agent of the Bat entered the Trojans' secret Middle Eastern camp in search of his true origins. But McGog denied Jean Paul the answers he sought, shooting a woman who may have been Azrael's birth-mother. The truth died with her as she leapt into McGog's line of fire in order to save Jean Paul's life.

KING SNAKE

International crime lord Sir Edmund Dorrance hates Robin with a blind rage. His first battle with Tim Drake ended in King Snake's defeat and a loss of face with the Ghost Dragons, his former gang of street punks, now led by the lovely Lynx. In their last meeting, Robin foiled Dorrance's attempt to seize leadership of the criminal Kobra cult. Dorrance was plotting to restore his eyesight using a healing Lazarus Pit under Kobra's control. But in a pitched battle, Robin accidentally spilled cobra venom in the raging King Snake's eyes, undoing the Pit's





HARD TIME is the only time served in Blackgate Island Maximum Security Penitentiary, Formerly a Civil War gun battery defending Gotham Harbor from Confederate Ironsides, the stone fortress of Blackgate later found new purpose in keeping Gotham City's criminal populace at a safe distance. Just a few degrees southeast of the sandy Chalfont Shoal, Blackgate is separated from the larger Gotham Island by "The Rip," a 30-knot current even more intimidating than the northerly swimming sharks basking offshore. Home to an incendiary mix of Gotham's deadliest felons, Blackgate resides in infamy as perhaps the most dangerous prison in America, if not the world!

THE RATCATCHER

Otis Flannegan plagued Gotham with an army of trained rats. Despite his incarceration, the Ratcatcher utilizes a brood of loyal rodents to relay messages to other convicts via the maze of ventilation ducts within Blackgate's superstructure.

HIGH TIDE!

Rocked to its foundations by Gotham's earthquake, Blackgate weathered even harsher aftershocks in the hours that followed, including a series of 10 seismic-generated tsunamis led by a tidal wave cresting nearly 80 feet!

PROS AND CONS

With a population topping 2,000 inmates, Blackgate's charges are watched over by a force of only 200 corrections officers – unsettling odds considering the significant ratio of dangerous costumed criminals incarcerated among them.

m For\ DC\ COMICS'}$ Dark Knight Detective, the leap from pulp fiction protagonist to literary icon was accomplished in a handful of decades. Creator Bob Kane's vision of an urban guerrilla clad in the night itself burst his way out of a genre peopled with all manner of costumed mystery men and women, each drawing a line against crime gone unchecked. But the cape and cowl of Batman overshadowed many of his vigilante peers, enduring in popularity for more than 60 years and counting, spanning the 20th century's surrender to a new century and millennium. Today, the Dark Knight and his supporting cast belong to the collective consciousness, a mass media phenomenon borne out of well over 3,000 comic book appearances read, shared, and enjoyed by fans of every demographic in more than 50 countries where "hero" can also be defined by the silhouette of a bat.

GOLDEN AGE BATMAN



DC COMICS' DARK KNIGHT DETECTIVE has changed little in nearly seven decades. But while Batman's costume and mission have remained a constant following the Caped Crusader's debut in *Detective Comics* #27 in May 1939, elements of the various Bat-series have frequently reflected an evolving hero, changing times, and the often-mercurial interests of comic book readership. In his first few adventures, the Dark Knight brandished an automatic pistol. By 1941, however, Batman's personal ethos against firearms became one of his most defining characteristics. And as this "Golden Age" of comics continued, the Bat-Family got bigger, while the Bat-Rogues were quite literally out of this world!



THOMAS WAYNE

It's true! Years before Bruce donned cape and cowl, Thomas Wayne battled bank robber Lew Moxon and his gunsels while wearing a "bat-man" costume. Of course, Dr. Wayne was attending a masquerade ball at the time, but the image of his father thus disguised left an indelible imprint in the mind of young Bruce Wayne.

ALIEN INVADERS

Batman and Robin spent many an adventure defending Gotham City and the world against threats from beyond the stars. If not for the Dynamic Duo (as well as Superman in the pages of *World's Finest Comics*), Earth might have been overrun by the space pirate Kraak, invaders from Zoron, or the gargantuan Creature from Planet X (left)! Naturally, some of these alien enemies were fakes.

Like many of his crime-fighting contemporaries during World War II, Batman did his bit for the Allied war effort. In the early 1940s, the Dynamic Duo encouraged readers to buy war bonds and stamps on patriotic-themed covers adorning Batman and Detective Comics.



Fear of the nuclear bomb in the 1950s gave rise to stories of science gone awry and villains such as Dr. Simon Ecks (Doctor X) and his evil twin, Double X, a creature composed of pure energy! Double X, the repressed side of Dr. Ecks's personality, was kept alive by a machine fueled by a chemical solution.

BATWOMAN

In 1956, Batwoman entered the Bat-canon as both a romantic foil and comely competition for the Caped Crusader. Inspired by Batman, circus daredevil and wealthy heiress Kathy Kane used her fortune to contruct her own Batcave and adopted a red-and-yellow costume to fight injustice as the "Girl Gangbuster," Batwoman!

A JOKER IN EVERY DECK

Of all Batman's adversaries, the leering Joker stands out as the most famous... and most fearsome! From his first appearance in Batman #1 in Spring 1940, the "caliph of crime clowns" or "grand mogul of mountebanks" dabbled in deathtraps and clown-themed capers. However, the Joker of the "Golden Age" distinguished himself by refusing to unmask or kill Batman in order to continue their ongoing battle of wits.



SILVER AGE BATMAN



DC COMICS' SHOWCASE #4 in 1956 signaled the "Silver Age" of comic books with radical reintroductions of many classic characters. Batman was left mostly untouched, although DC's newly minted "Earth-2," populated by Golden Age characters, explained away an older Dark Knight's exploits during World War II. Meanwhile, Earth-1's Batman continued the good fight, adding a yellow oval to his bat-emblem Detective Comics #327 in 1964. His supporting cast grew to include new allies and adversaries as the Dark Knight's Silver Age extended through the early 1970s.

FEAR THE REAPER

In Batman #237, Batman met a grim Reaper, a Jewish doctor determined to deliver justice to the Nazi death camp commandant who butchered his family decades before.



GREEN-EYED LADY

Catwoman traded her traditional purple for green sequins during the Silver Age. She longed to steal Batman's heart, and was jealous of Batgirl, whom she mistakenly assumed was Batman's girlfriend.



RIDDLE ME THIS ...

Batman in jail? Robin siding with the Riddler? Readers during the 1960s often faced cover teasers that showed the Dynamic Duo divided. Sometimes Batman and Robin fought; other times a villain or Batgirl came between the Caped Crusaders.




JOKER TIME!

Batman snapped the villain's spine, stopping him once and for all.









Things had changed in the three years following the Dark Knight's return to action. Carrie Kelly was now Catgirl, field leader of the vigilante "Batboys" that Batman had molded from ex-Mutants. The Dark Knight was ready to rally Earth's remaining super heroes to resist the new, insidious world order. Batman counted the Atom, Green Arrow, the Flash, and Green Lantern among his allies, but the puppet masters pulling Earth's strings still had Superman, Wonder Woman, and Captain Marvel in their thrall.



August: DC Comics publishes CATWOMAN: THE MOVIE, the official motion picture adaptation of the Feline Fatale's leap to film!


