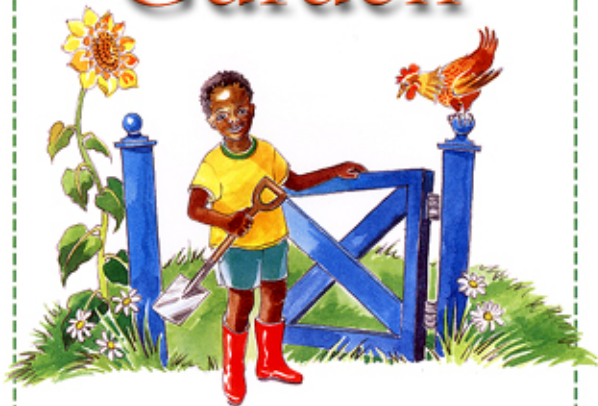

She grows her food instead.



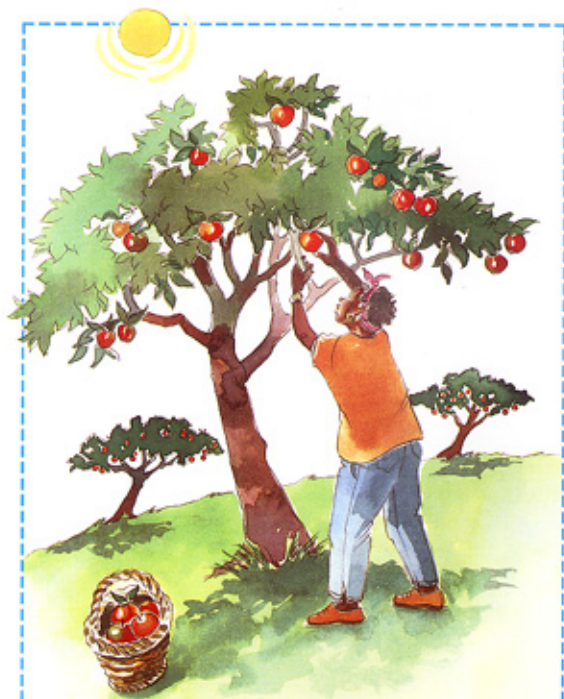
She has a cow to give her milk,

She picks apples from her trees.



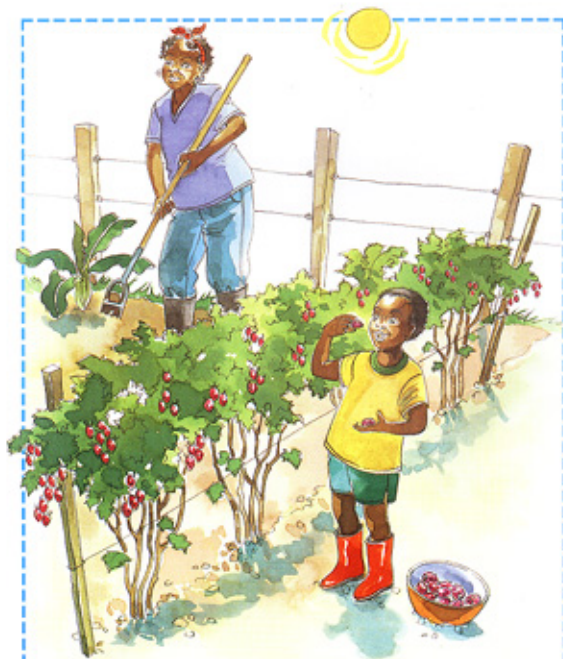
Her cabbages all grow in rows.

I like to eat it best of all.



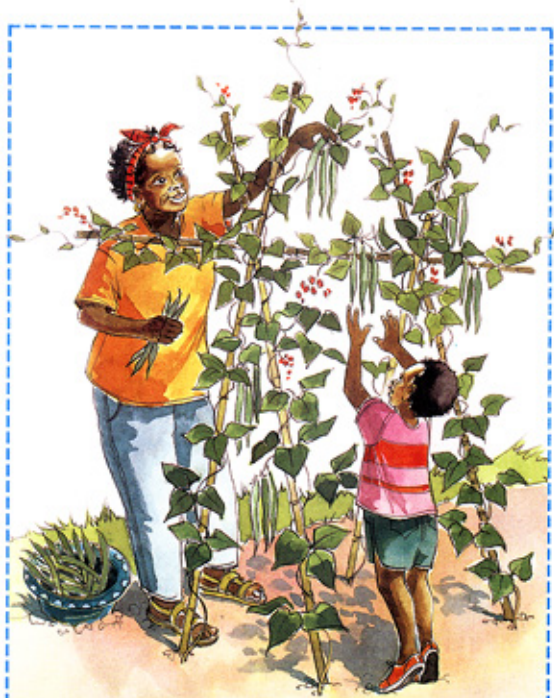
In the spring, we dig the ground
