Level 1: Beginning to read

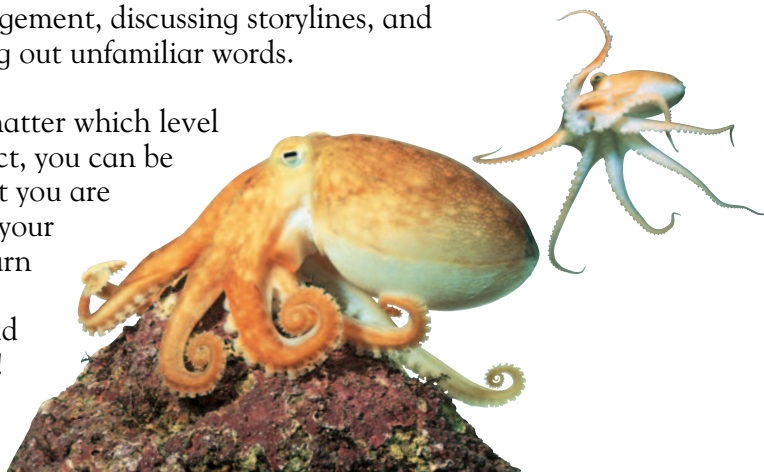
Level 2: Beginning to read alone
