

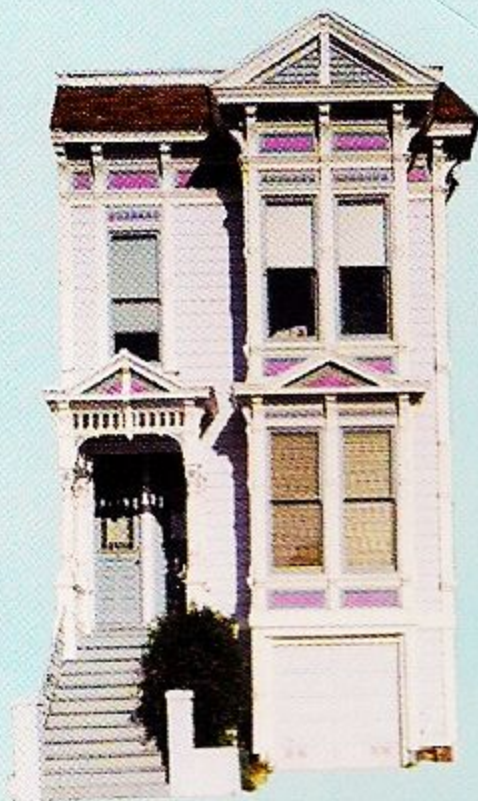

Super school bus

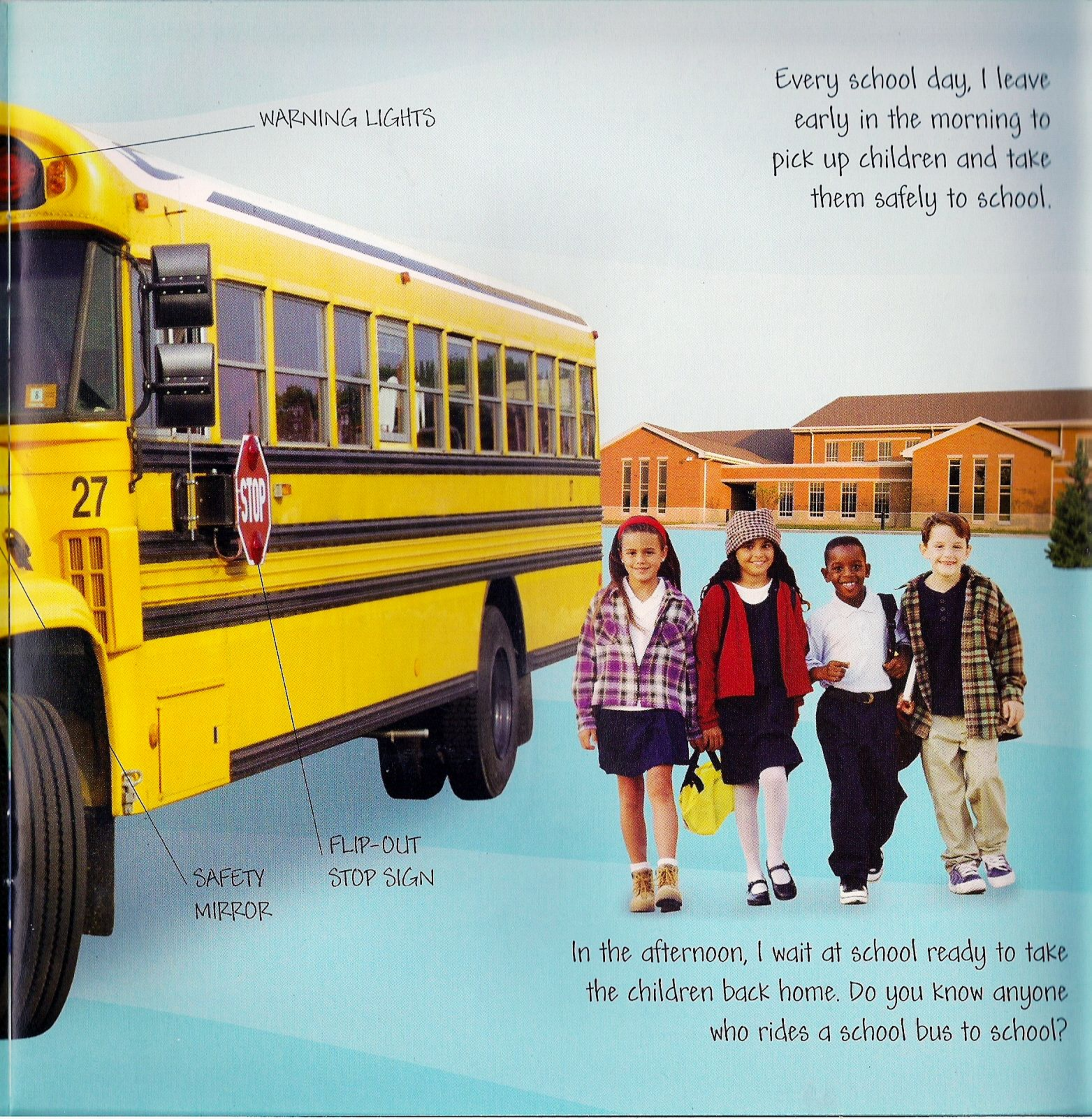
I AM A SCHOOL BUS

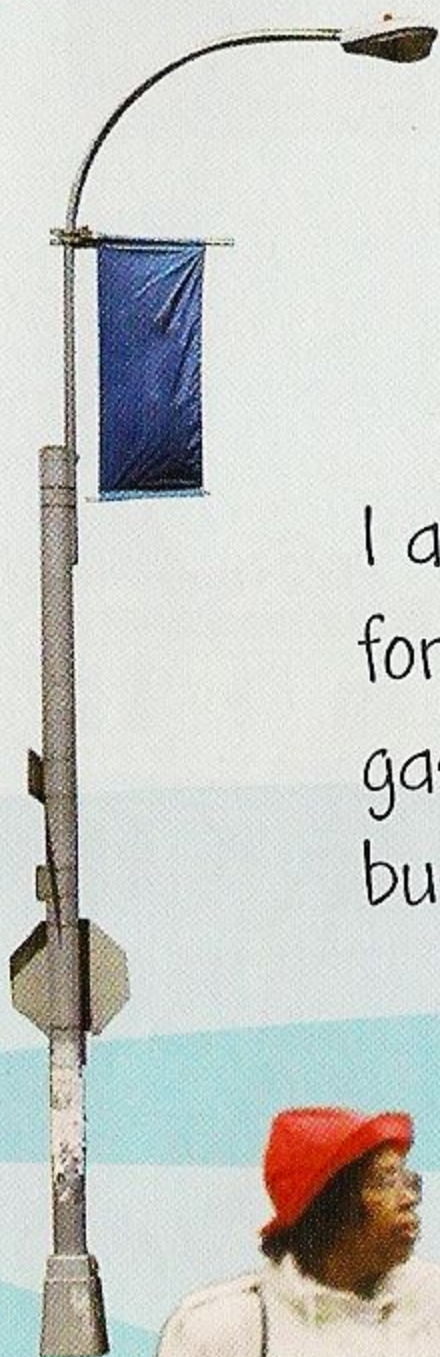
I AM AN ELECTRIC BUS

SEE HOW I GO!

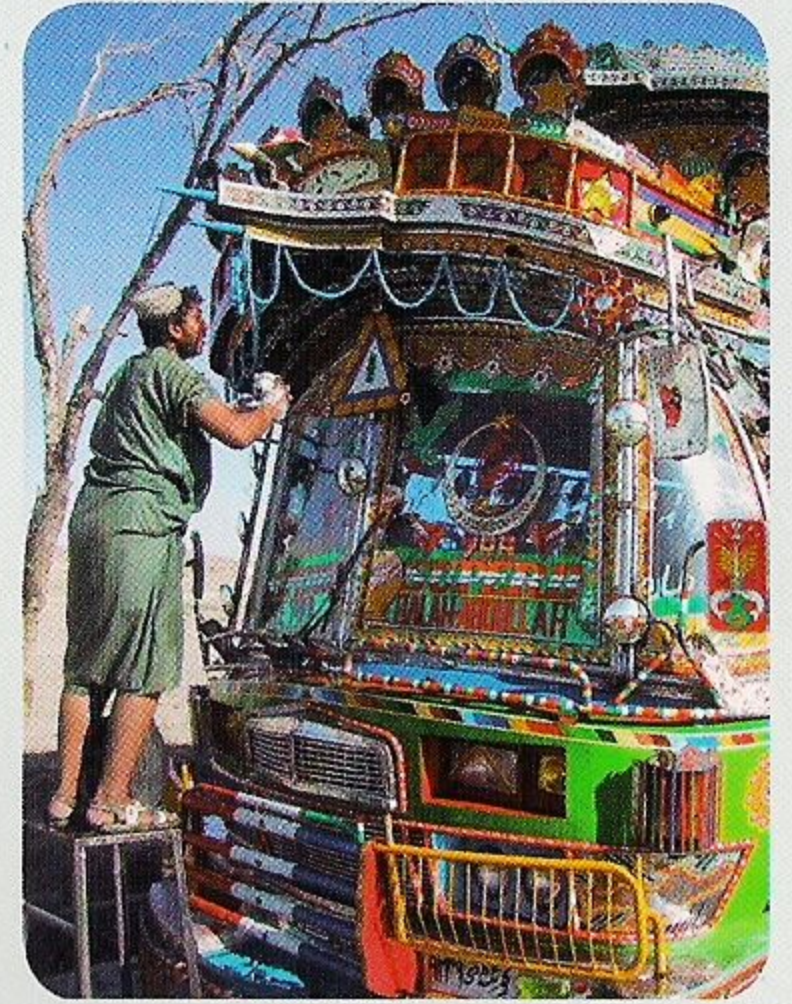
In some countries like

FLAGS

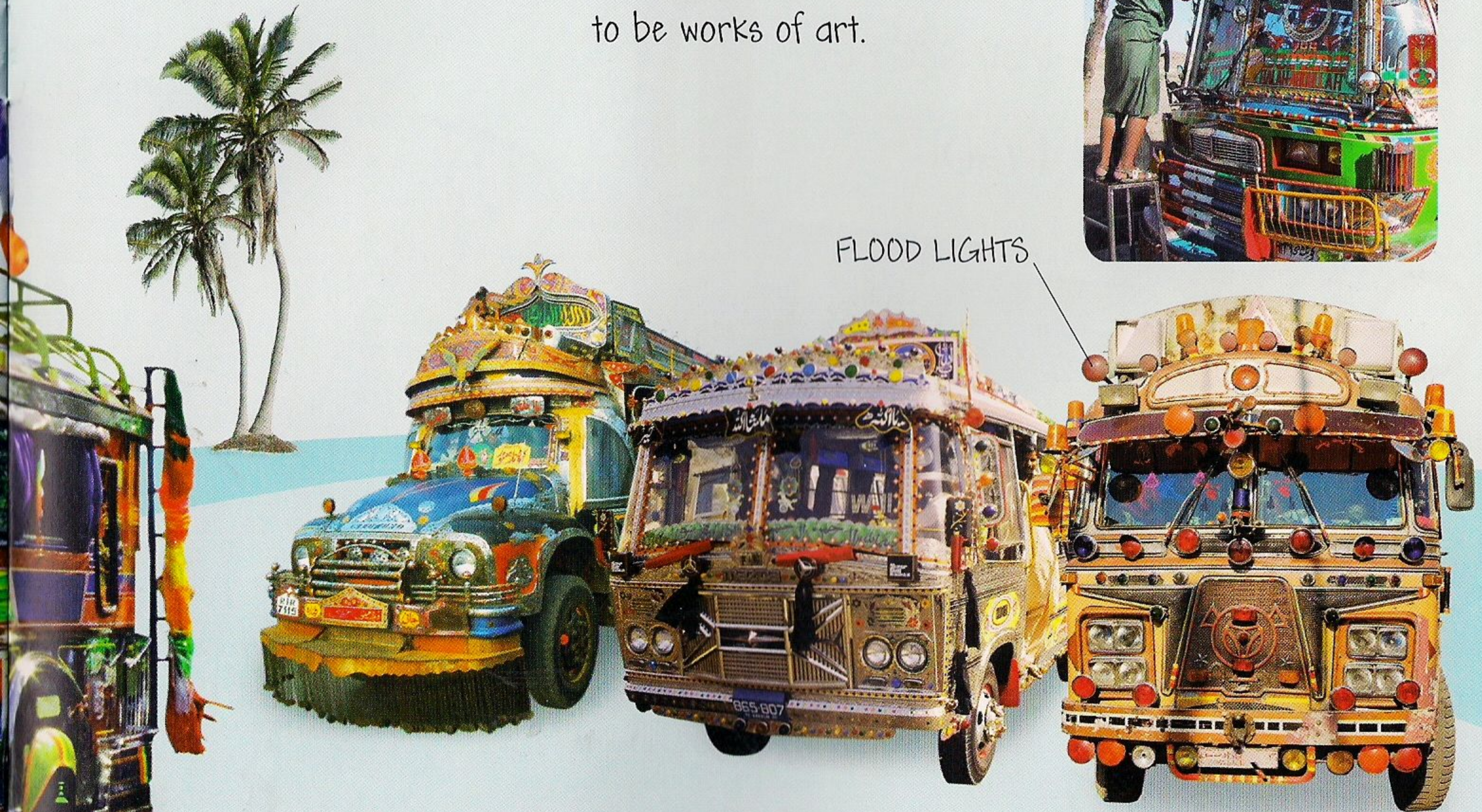


RAINBOW

FLOOD LIGHTS

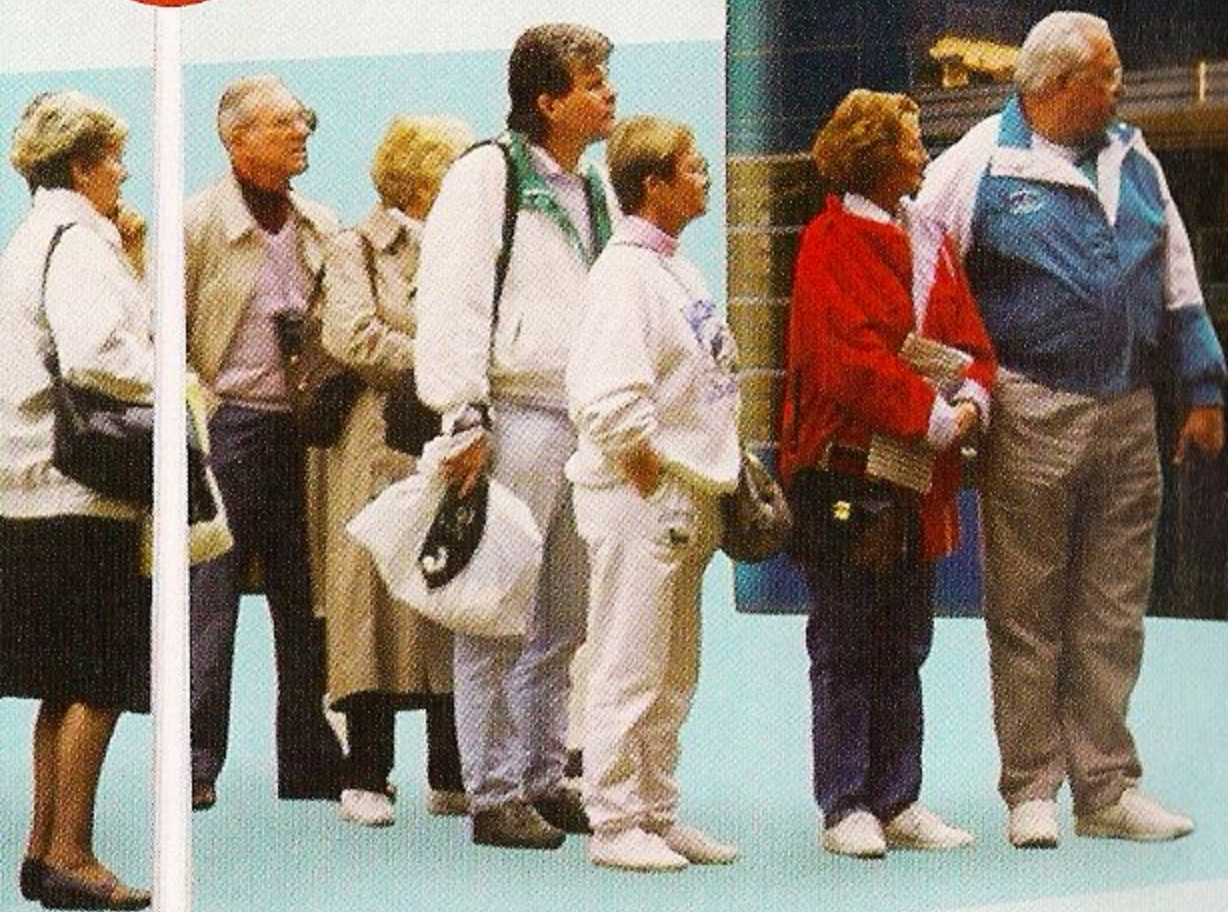
