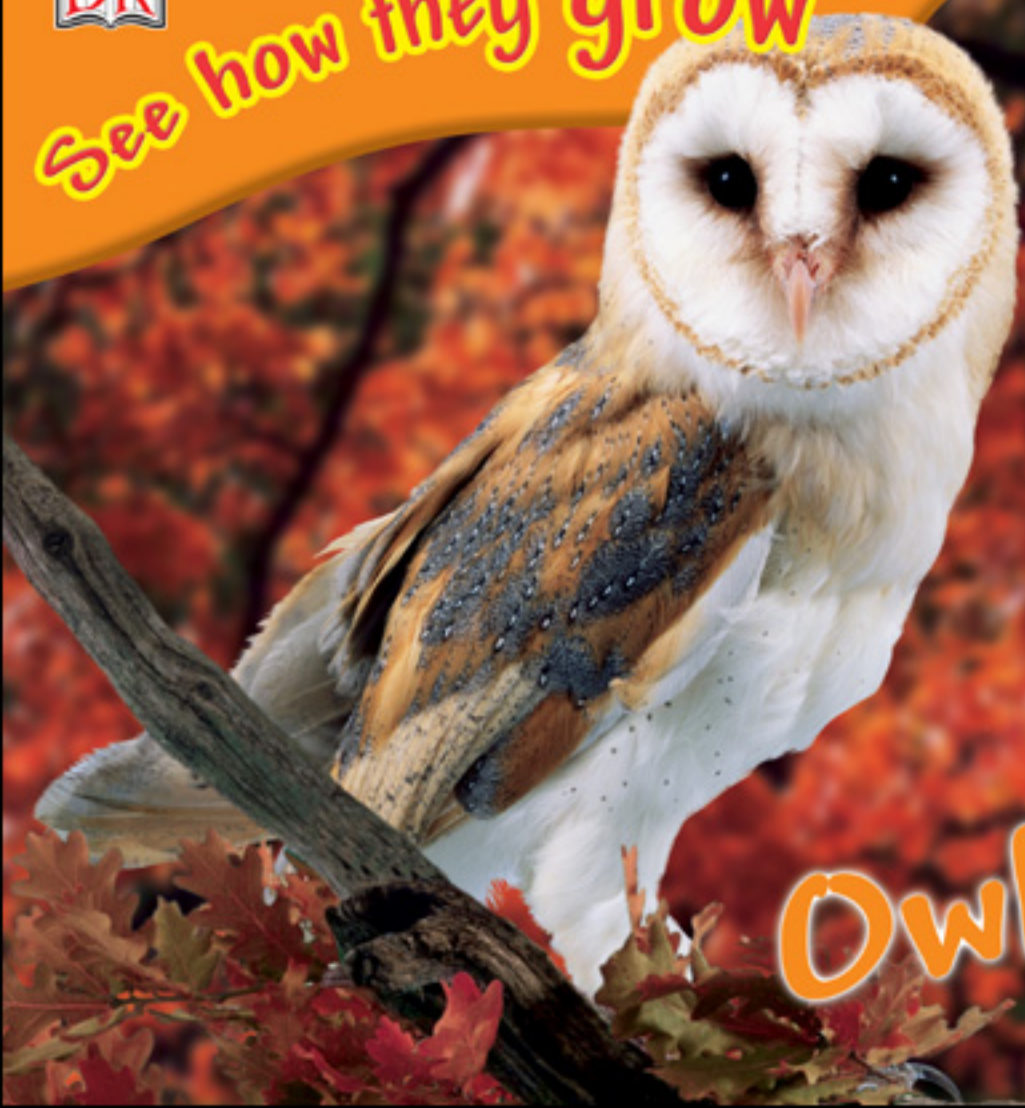

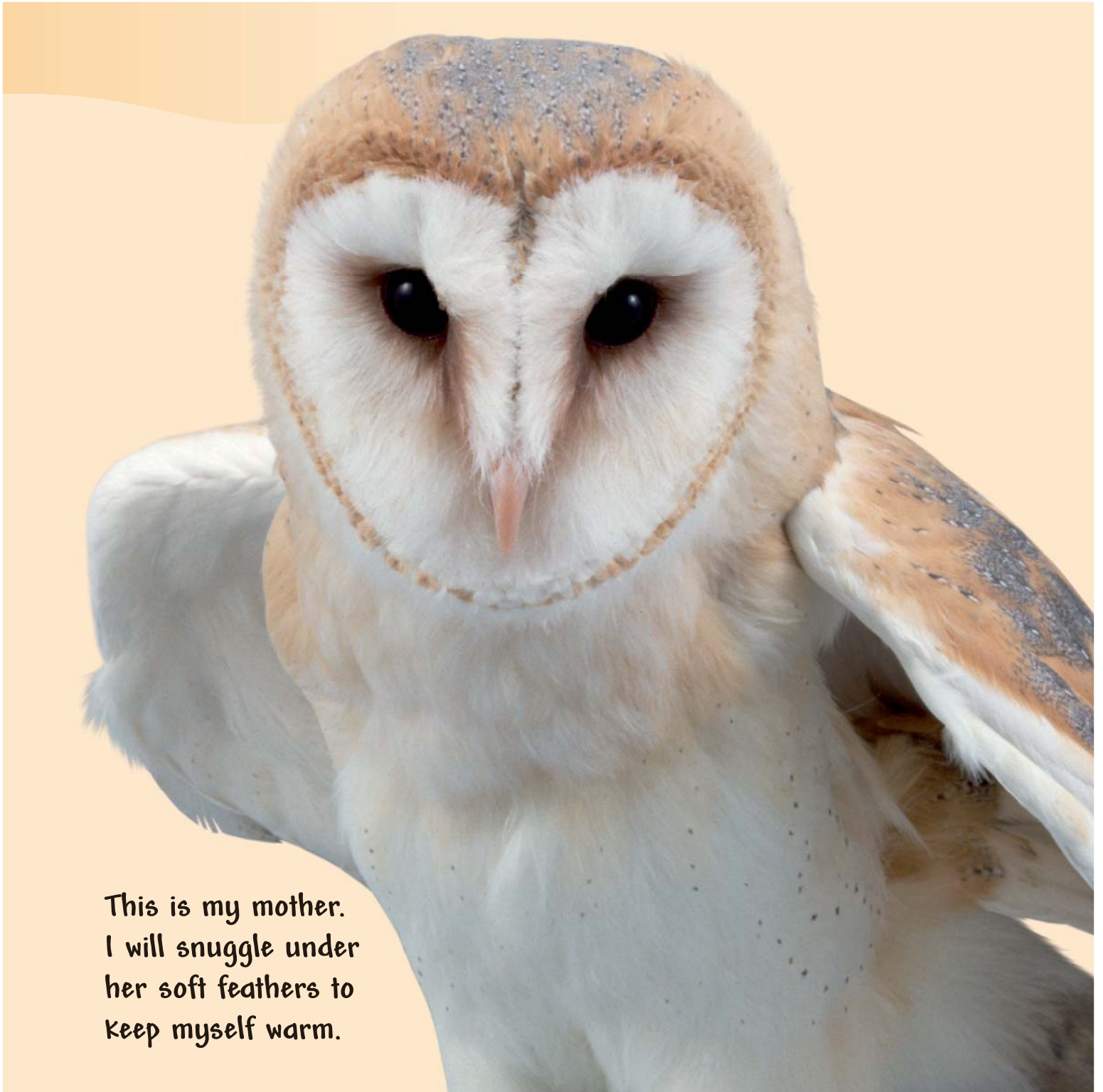

I am a barn owl chick. I am hatching out of my eggshell.



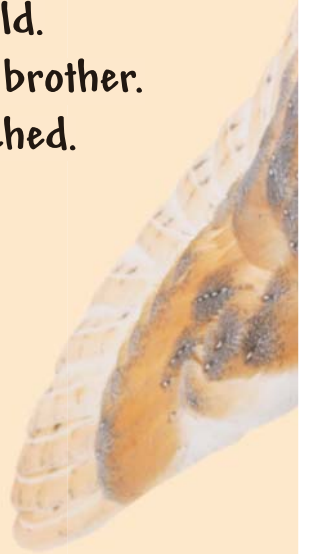
I chip around the shell and push myself free.

I land carefully.

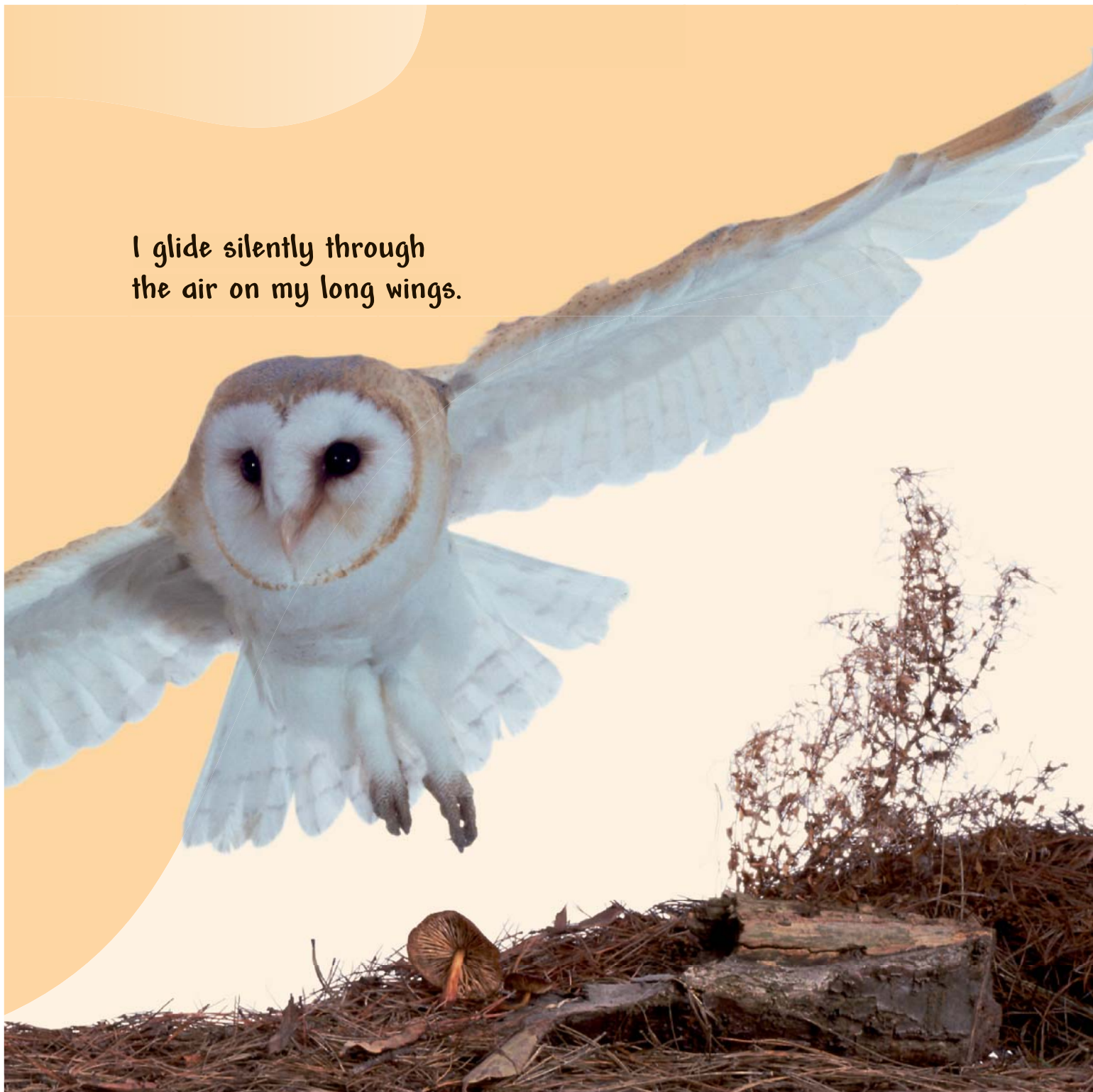
On the wing
