to keep warm.



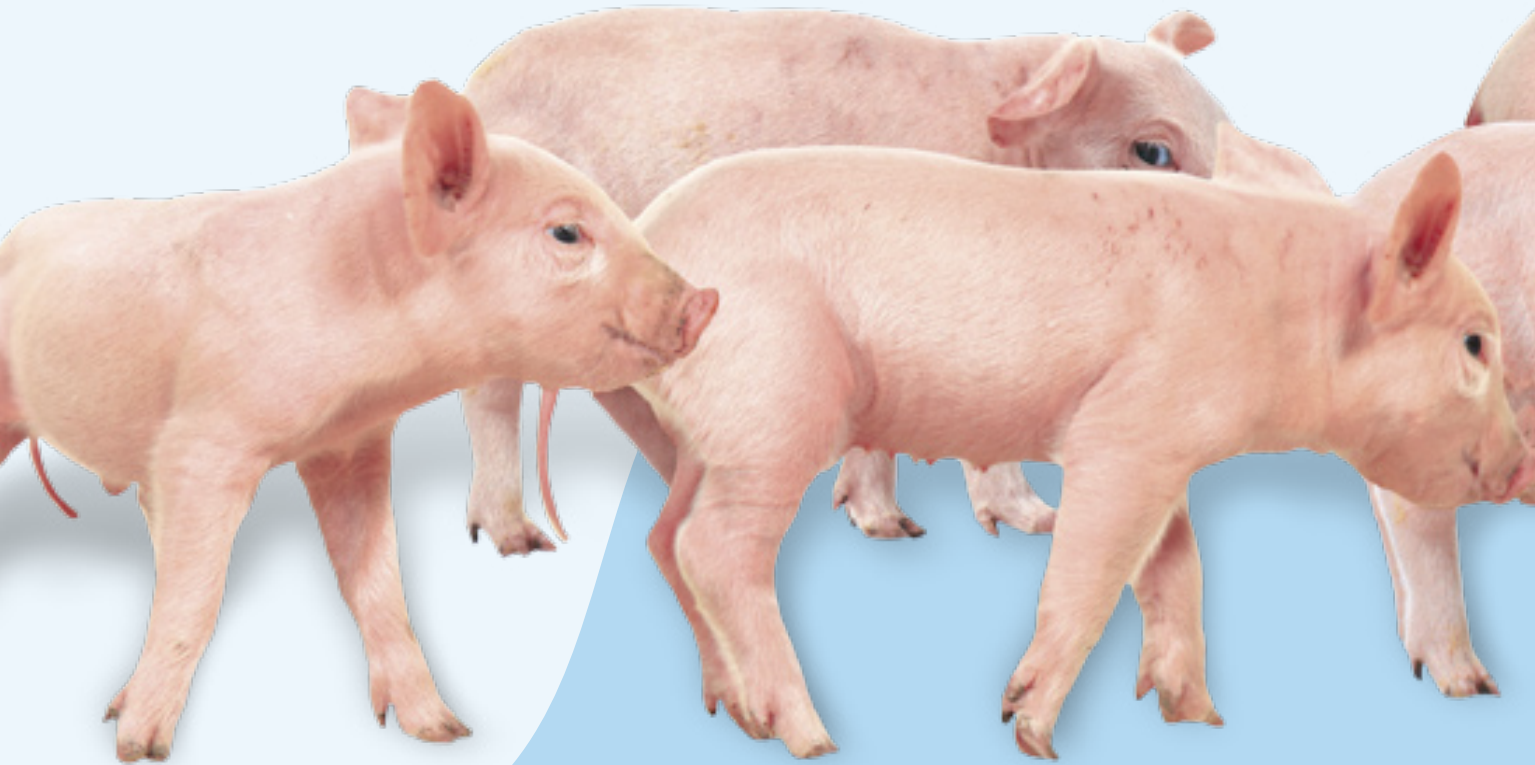
Trotting around

Big pigs

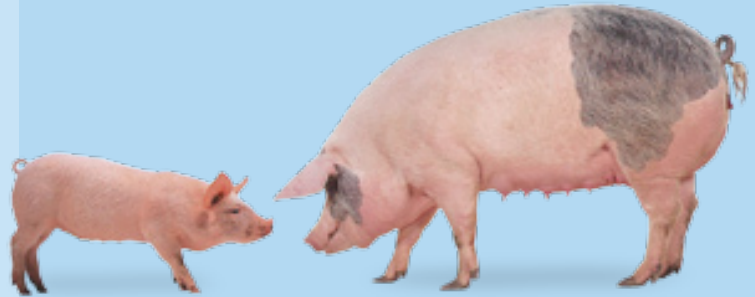
I am six weeks old.

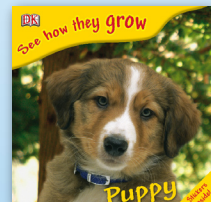
