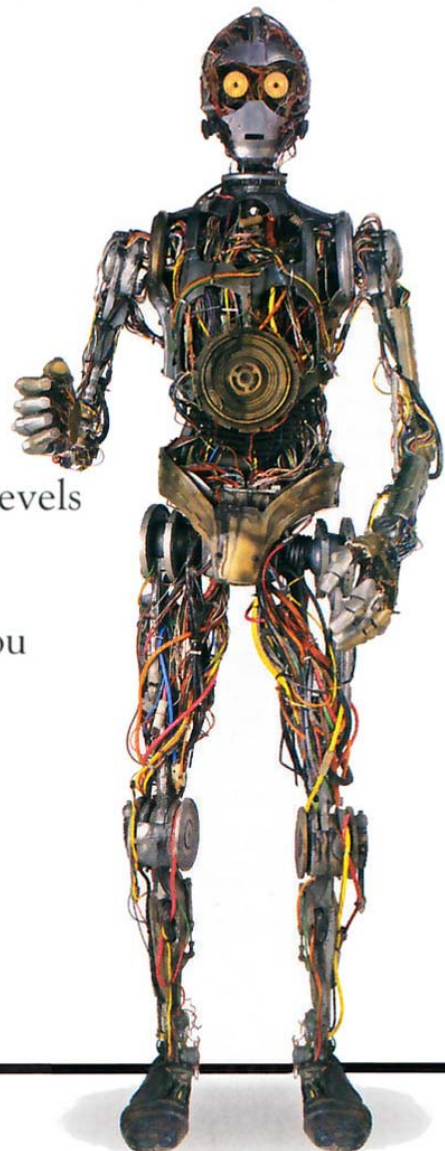

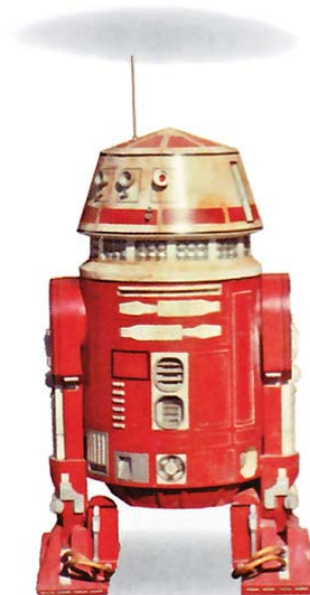

Droid height

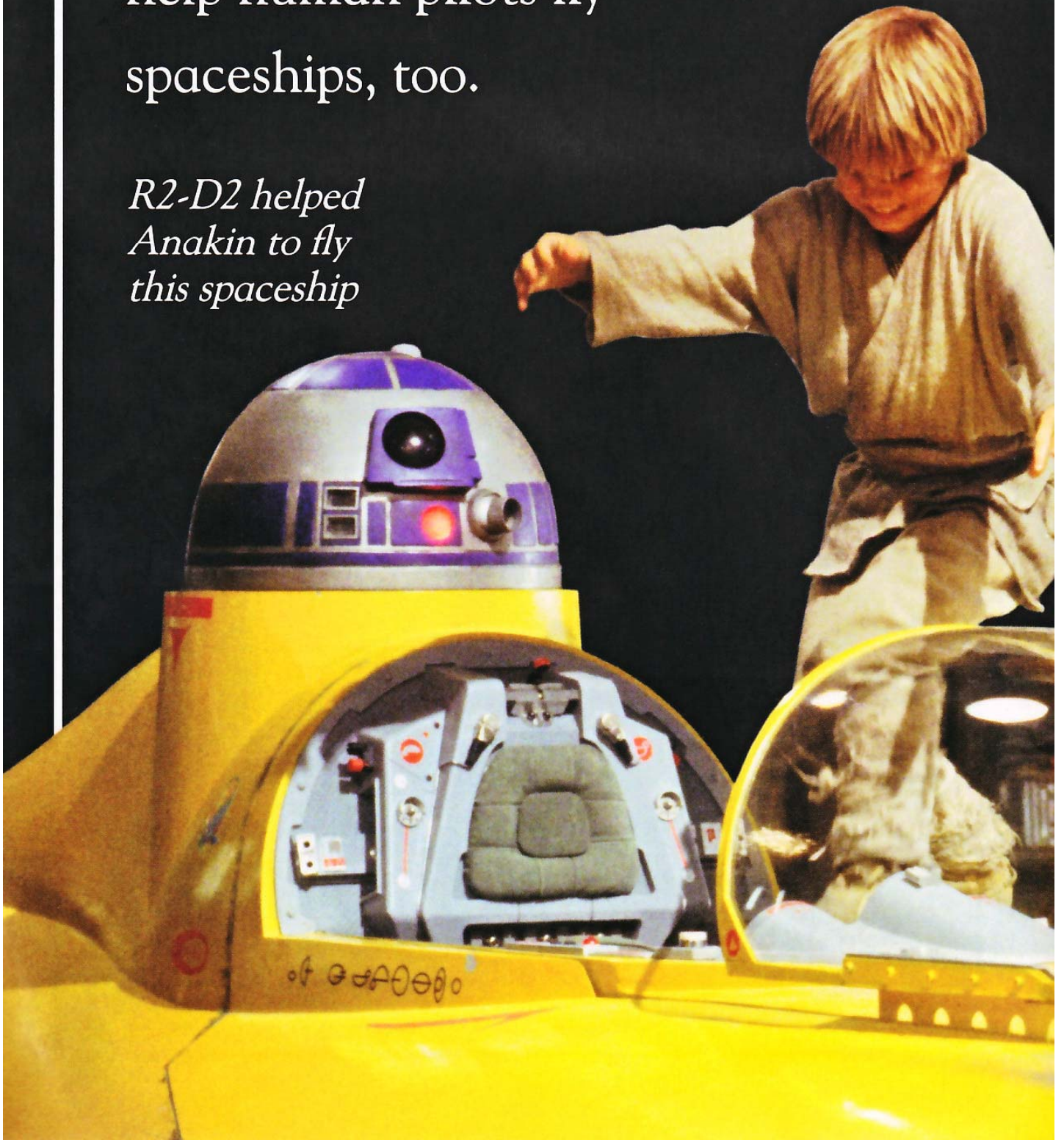
R2-D2 is just under one metre tall. He's only a little bit shorter than Anakin when he was a young boy.

R2-D2 is an astromech droid.

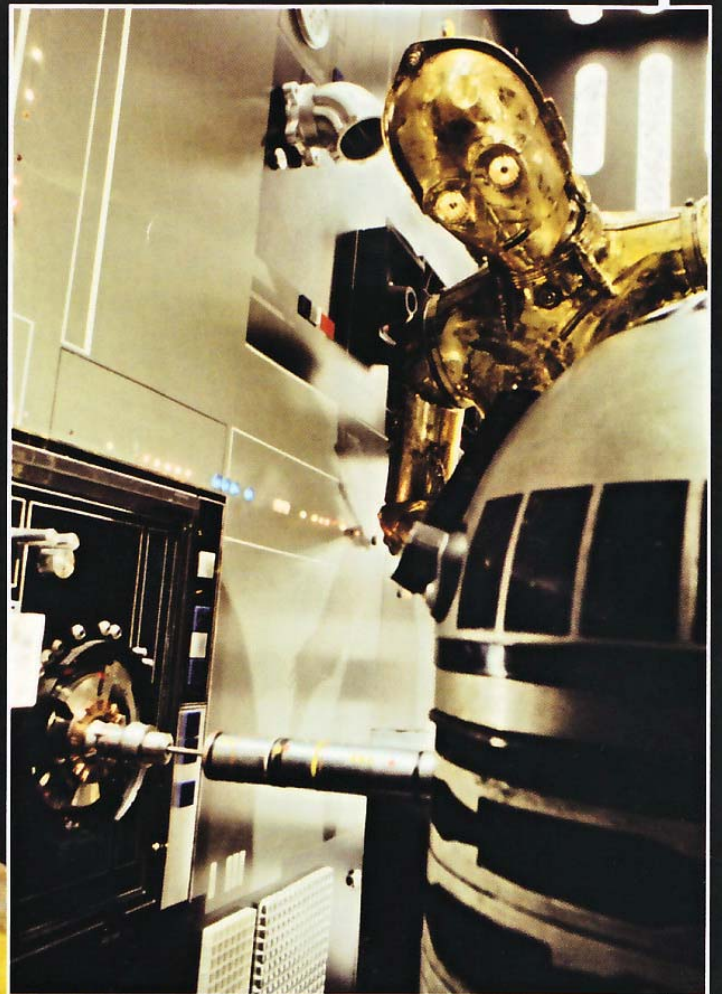
Astromech droids take care of spaceships. Sometimes they help human pilots fly spaceships, too.

R2-D2 has lots of tools hidden inside his body. So don't be surprised if a cutting arm or a grasping arm pops out of a panel in his body.

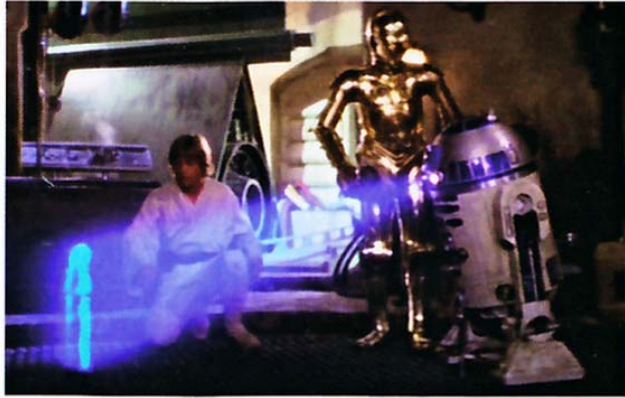




Special Powers

He once repaired Padmé Amidala's spaceship from the outside while it was flying in space.

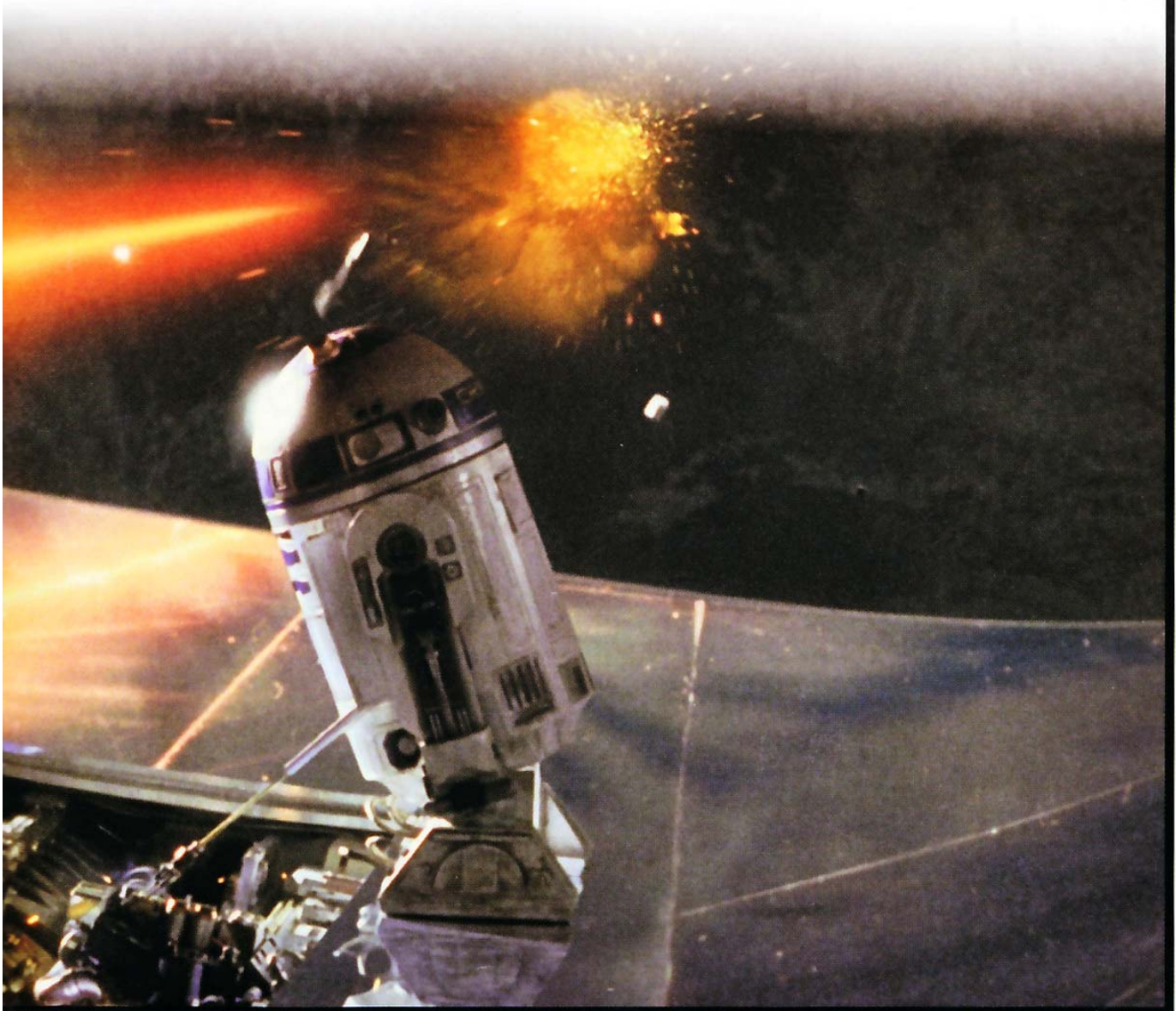


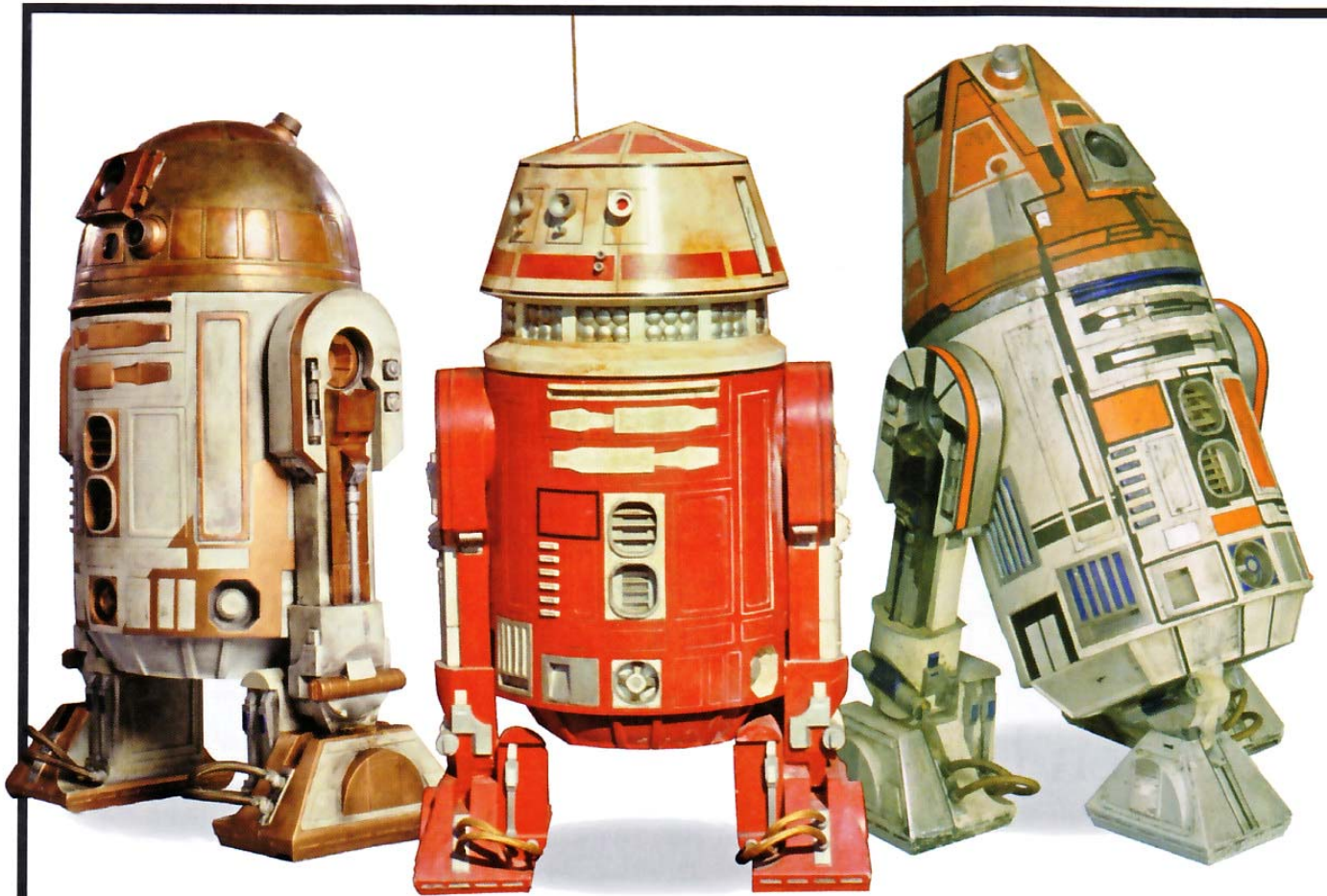

Another time, some Jawas captured R2-D2. The Jawas sold R2-D2 to Owen Lars, Luke Skywalker's uncle.





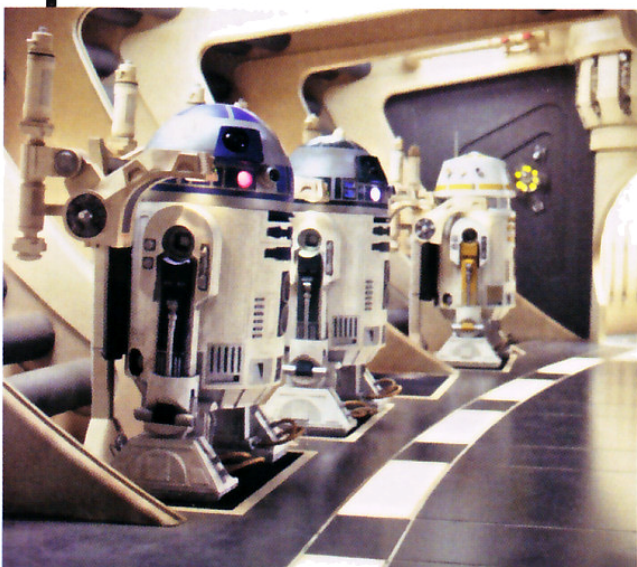

Astromech droids like R2-D2 come in all sorts of colours and styles.

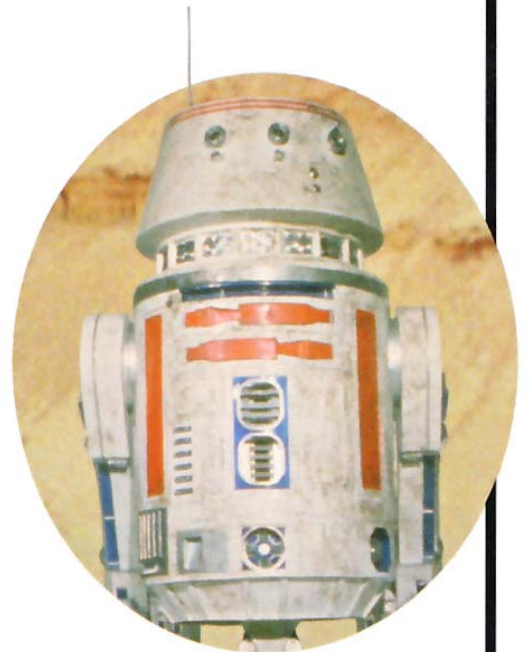


R2-D2 used to work with a team of astromech droids in Padmé Amidala's spaceship.

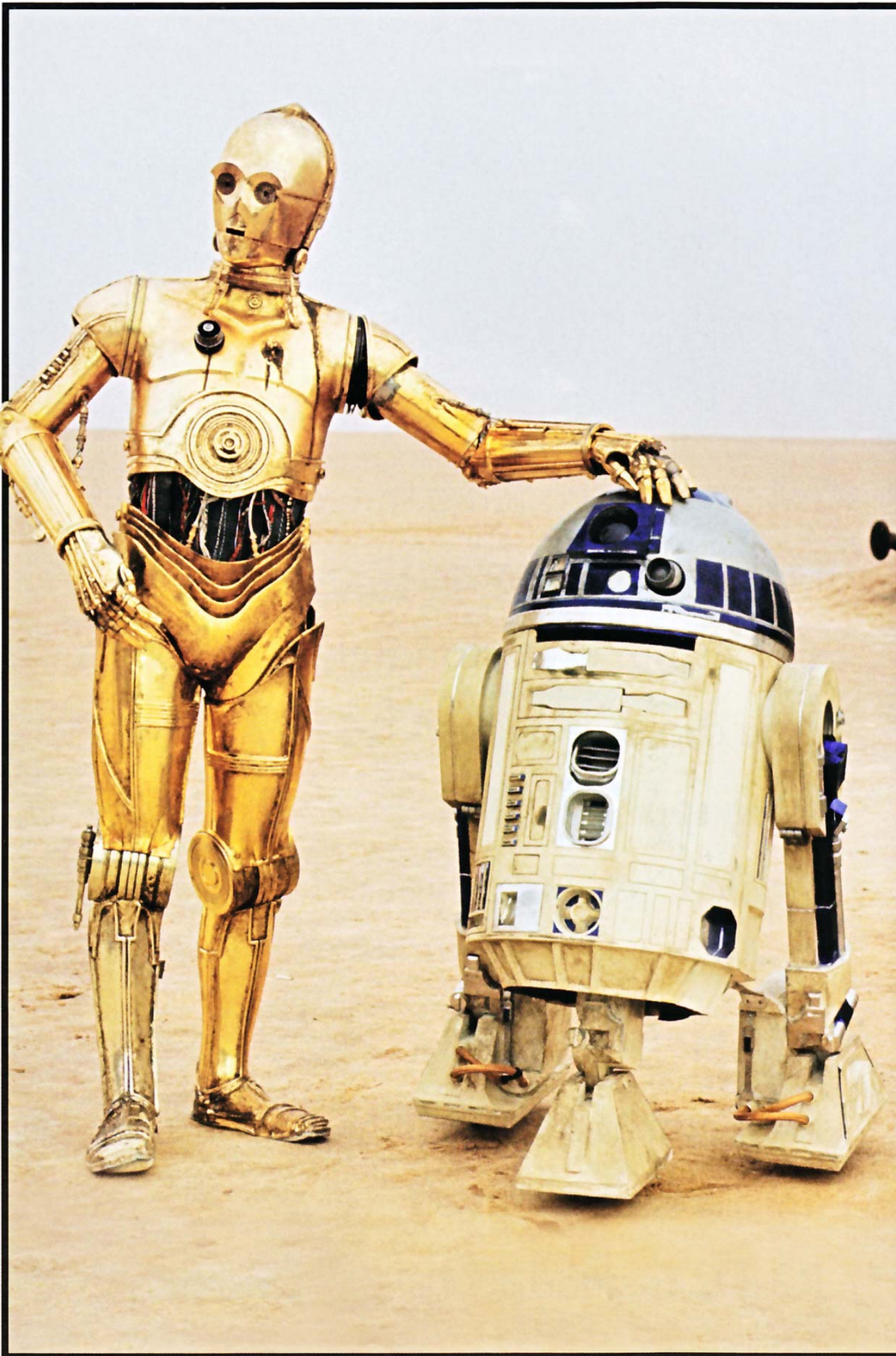

Uncle Owen nearly bought a droid called R5-D4. But it was faulty and its head blew up. So Owen chose trusty R2-D2 instead.



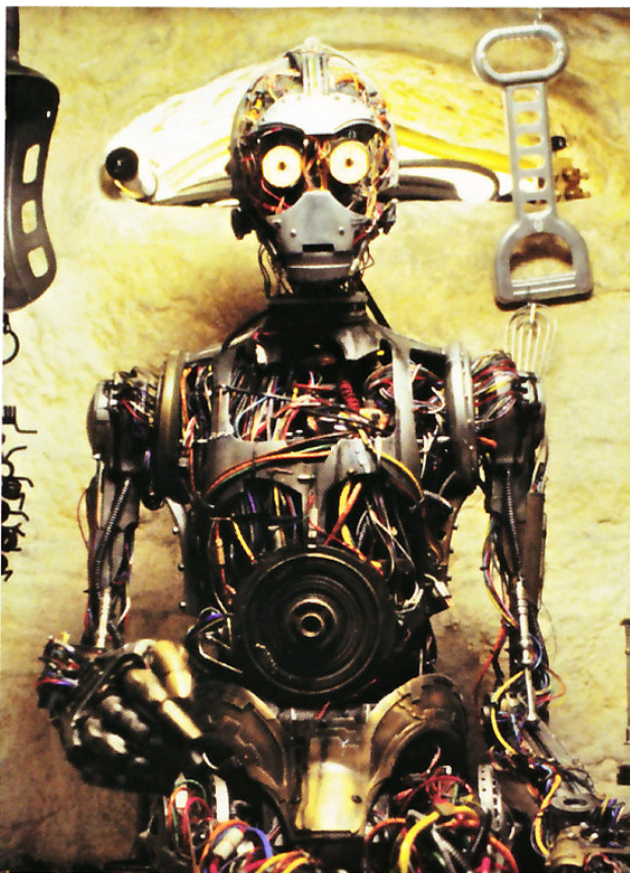

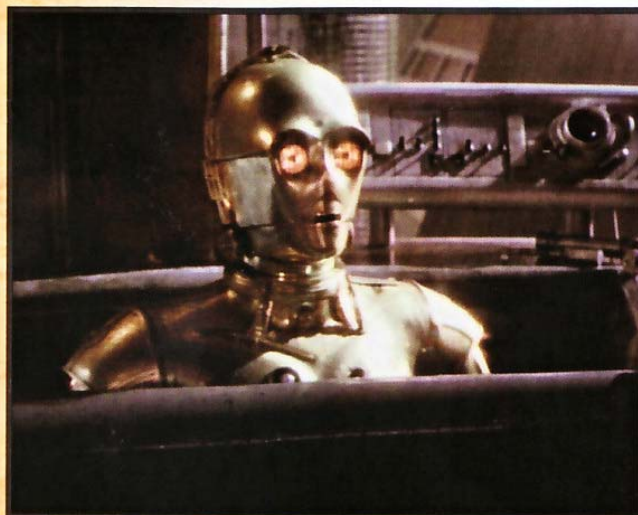

C-3PO and R2-D2 have had lots of adventures together!

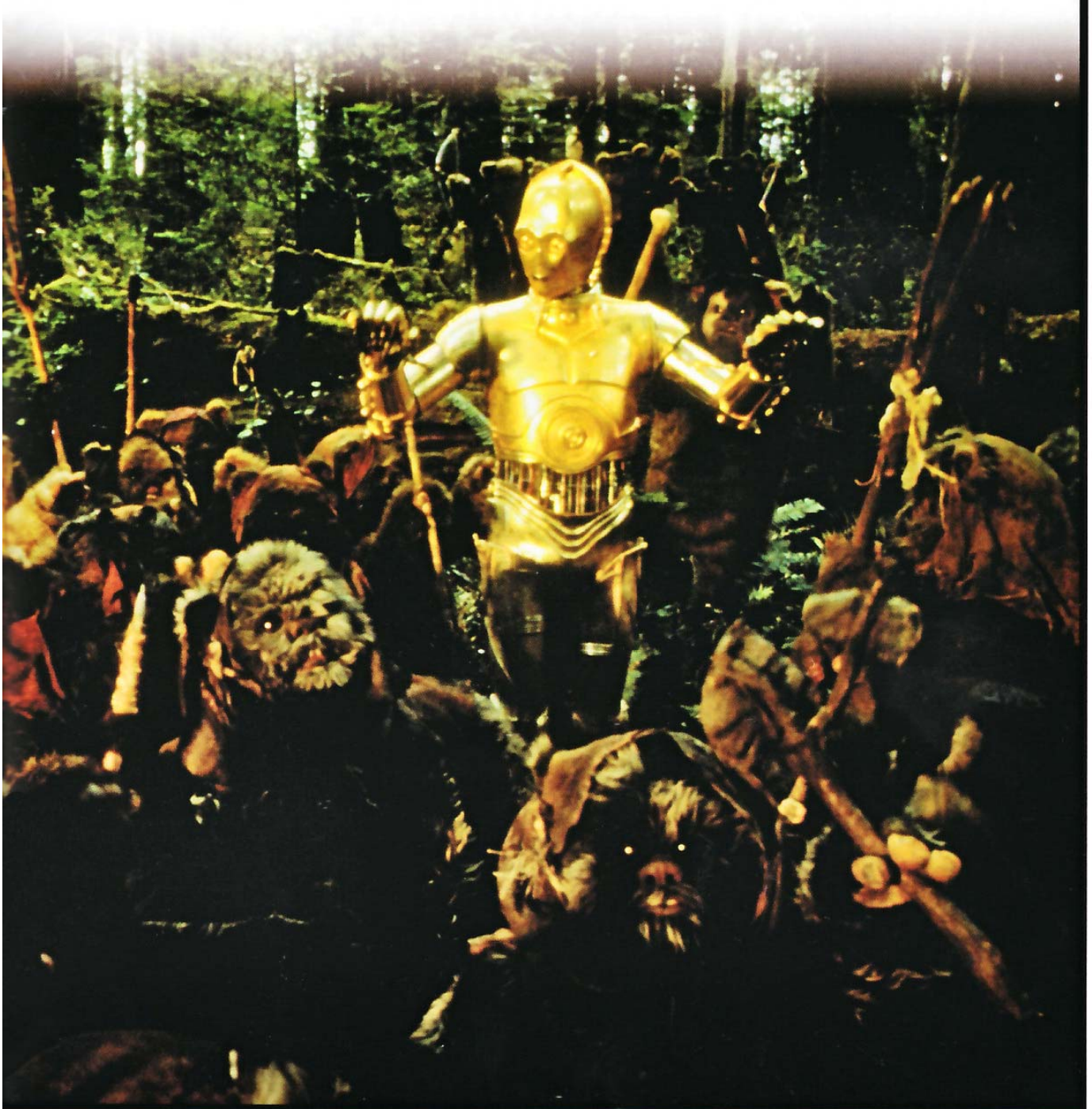
They once travelled to Jabba the Hutt's palace to rescue their friend Han Solo. But Jabba captured them.

His job is to capture people. Darth Vader

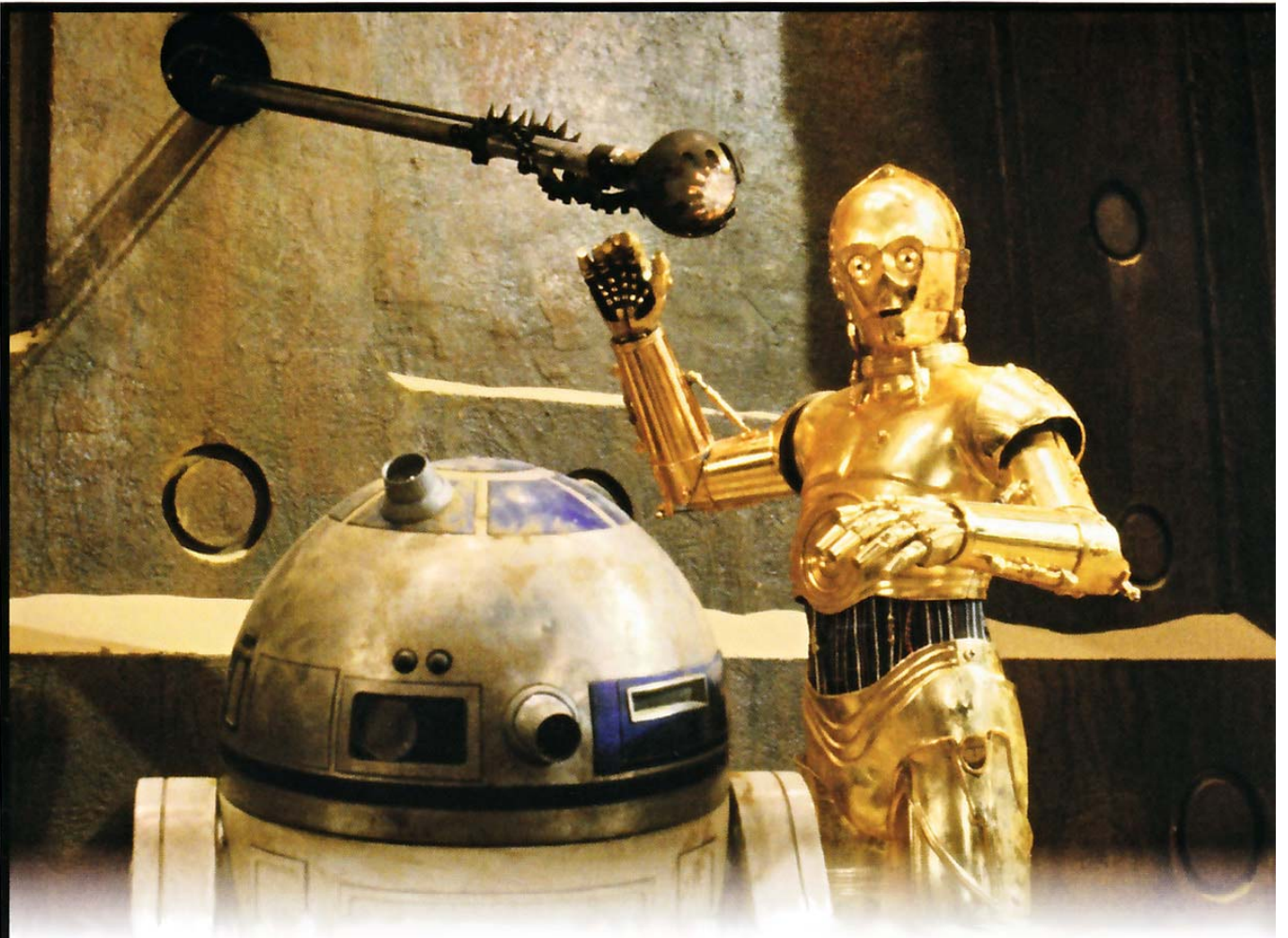
once wanted him to find and capture Han Solo.

Watch out for MSE-6 droids, also called mouse droids. These small cleaning and repair droids whiz by your feet – don't trip over one!

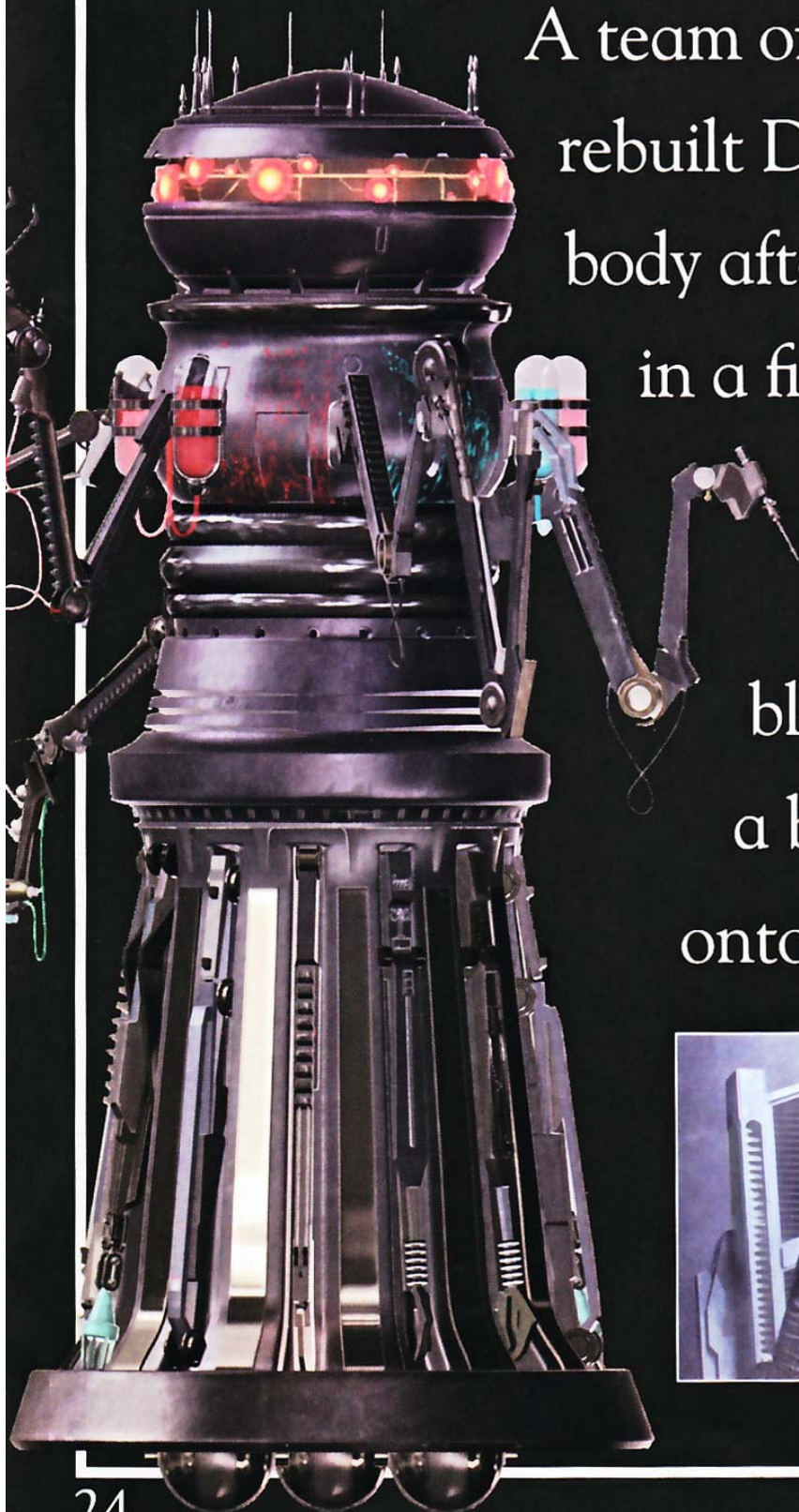


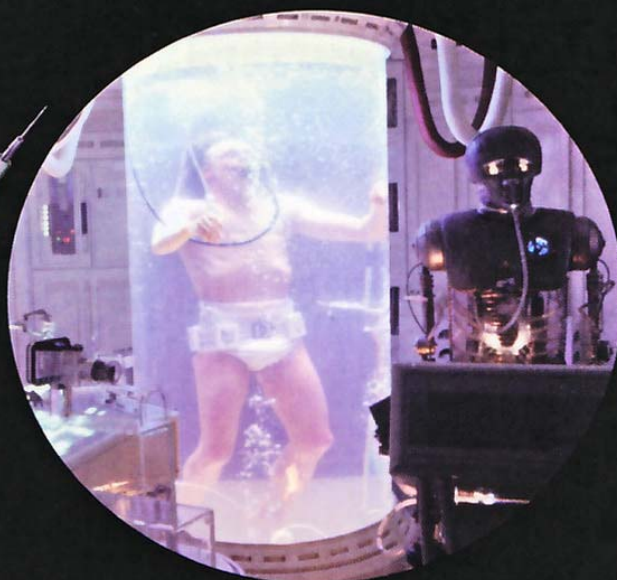

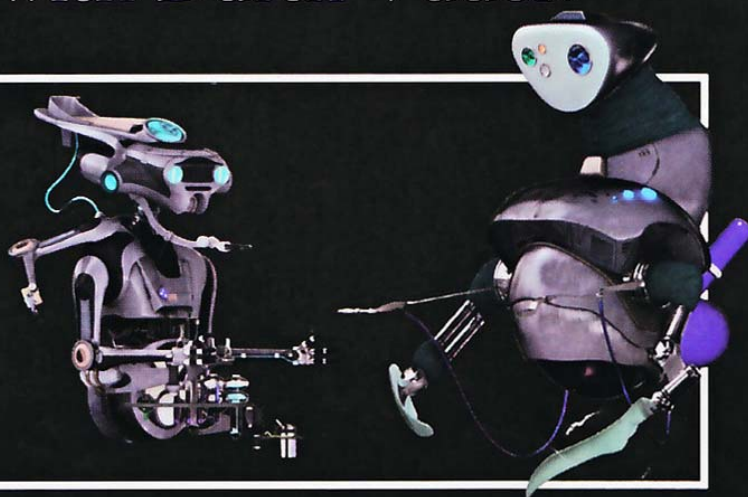

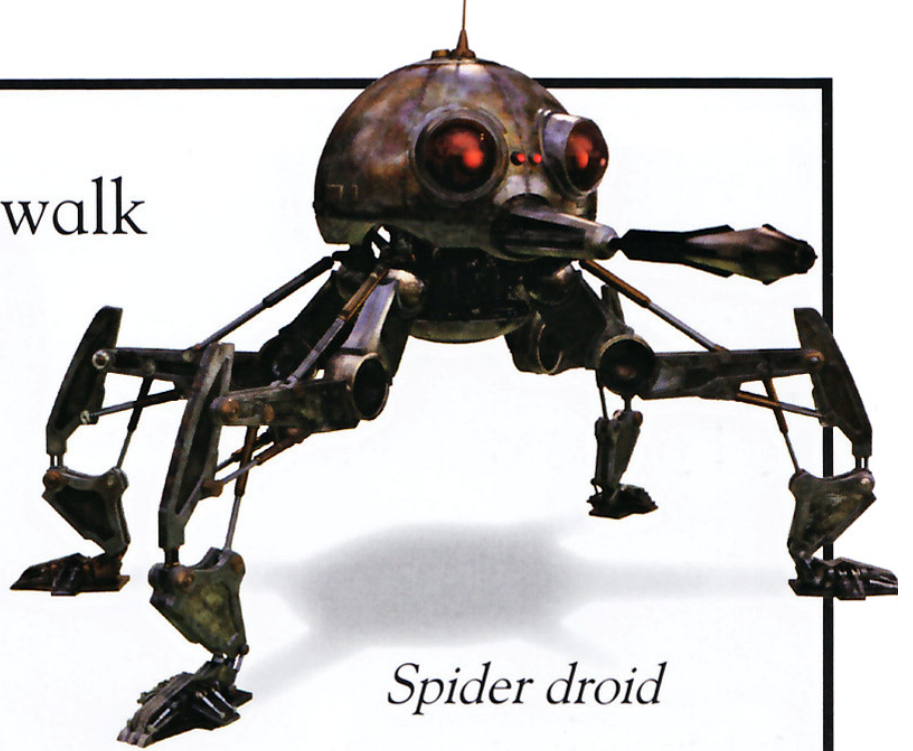
Spider droids walk

Their dome-shaped

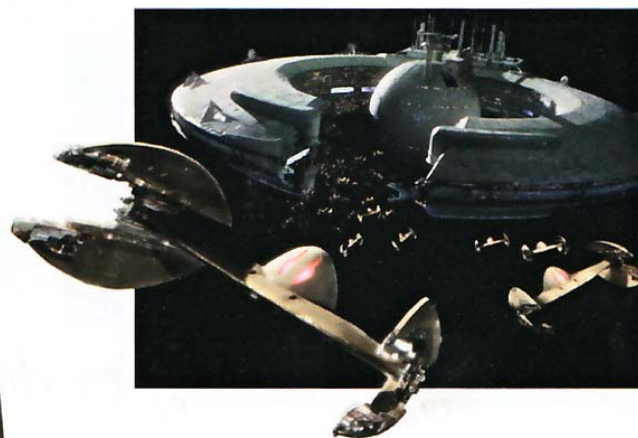
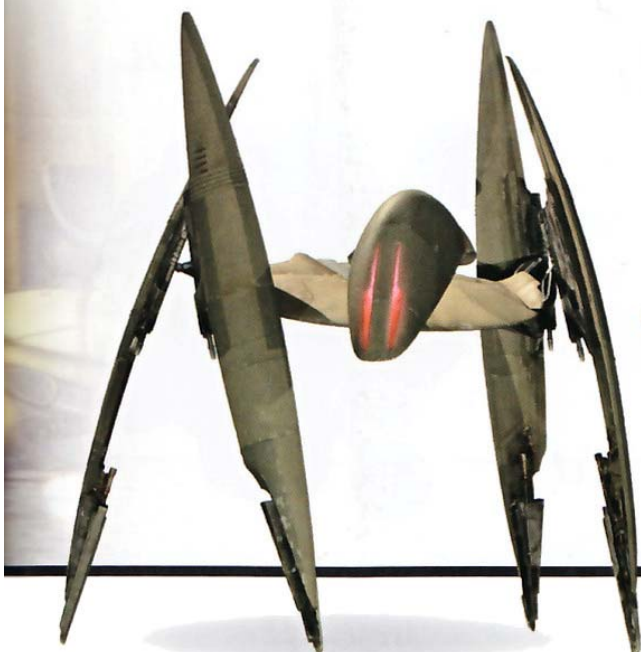
heads are

Droid starfighters can fly in space, with their guns blazing. They can also walk into battle on the tips of their wings. Either way, watch out!



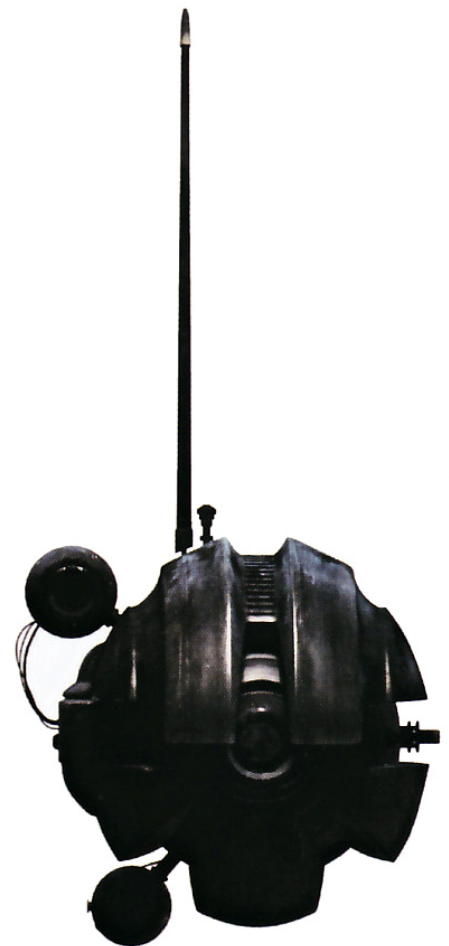


Spy Droids

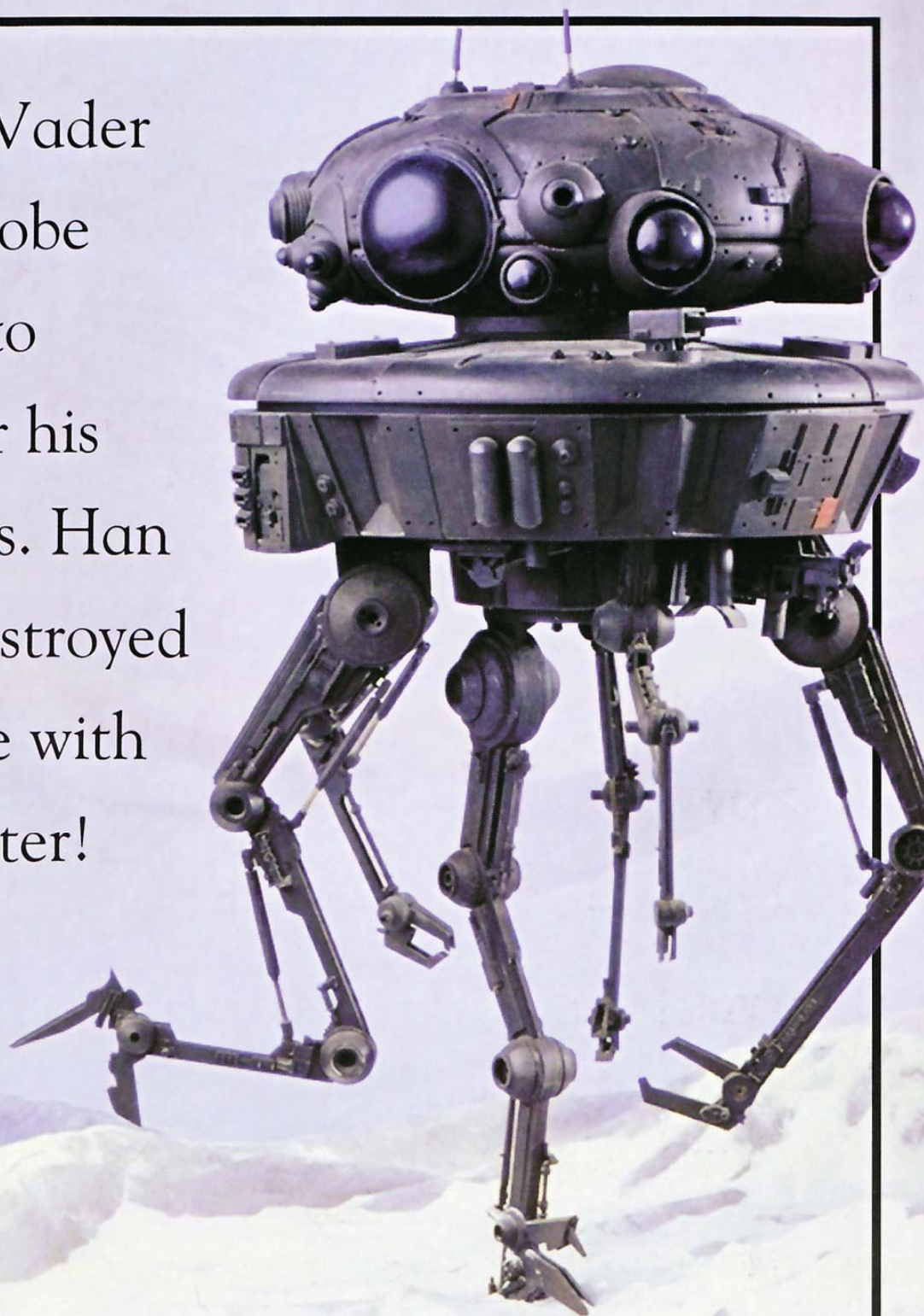
These spy droids might be watching you!

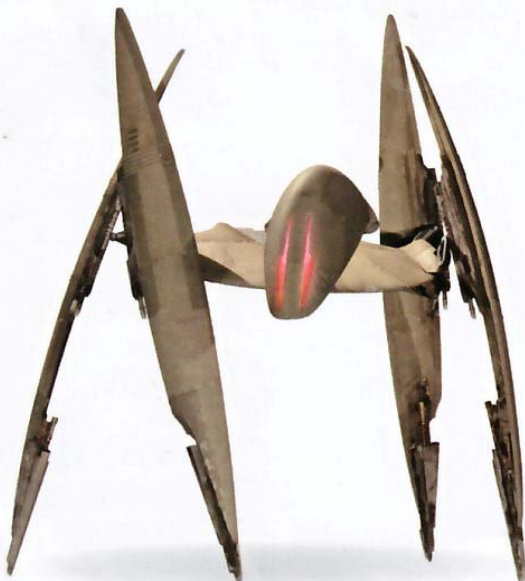

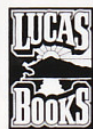
