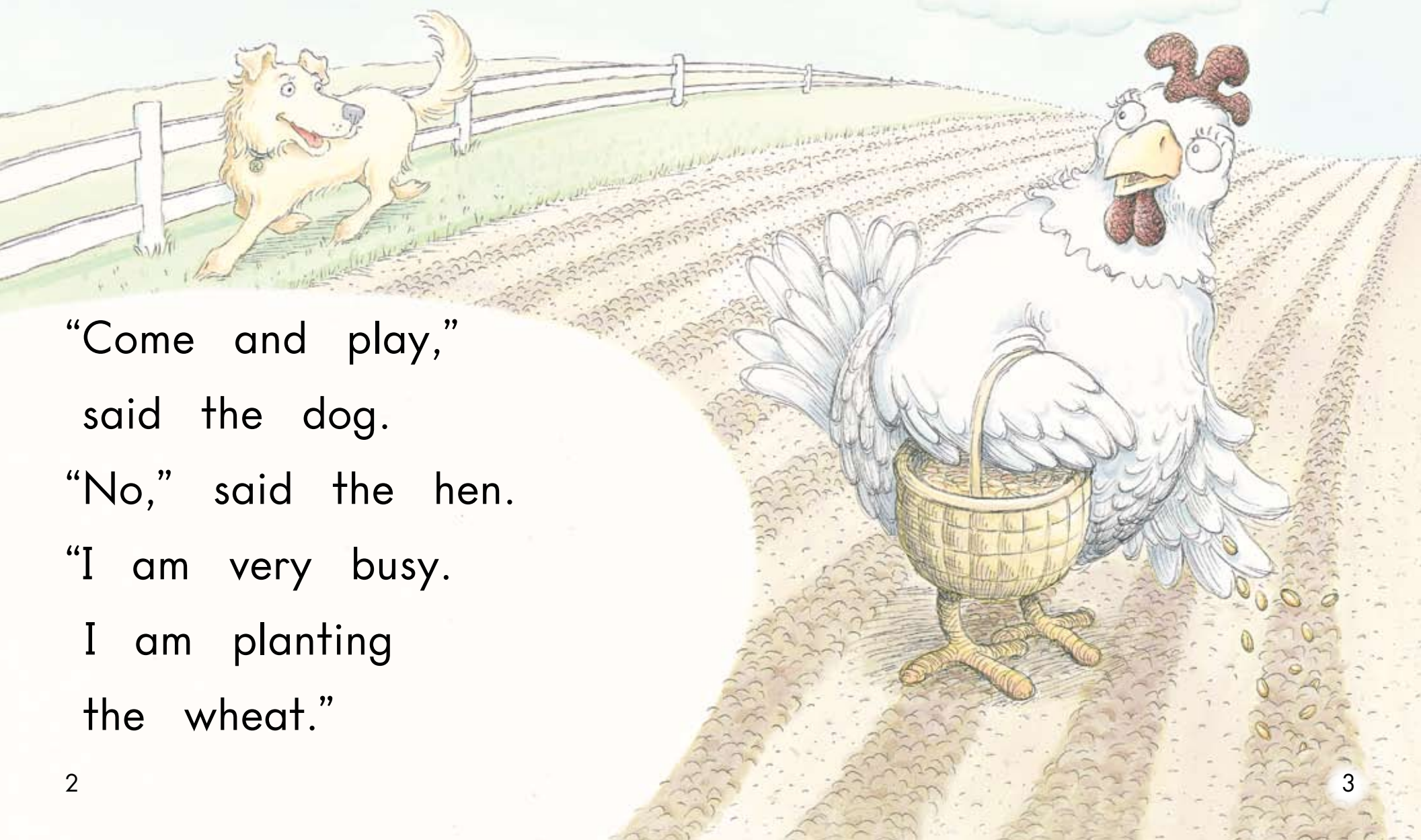

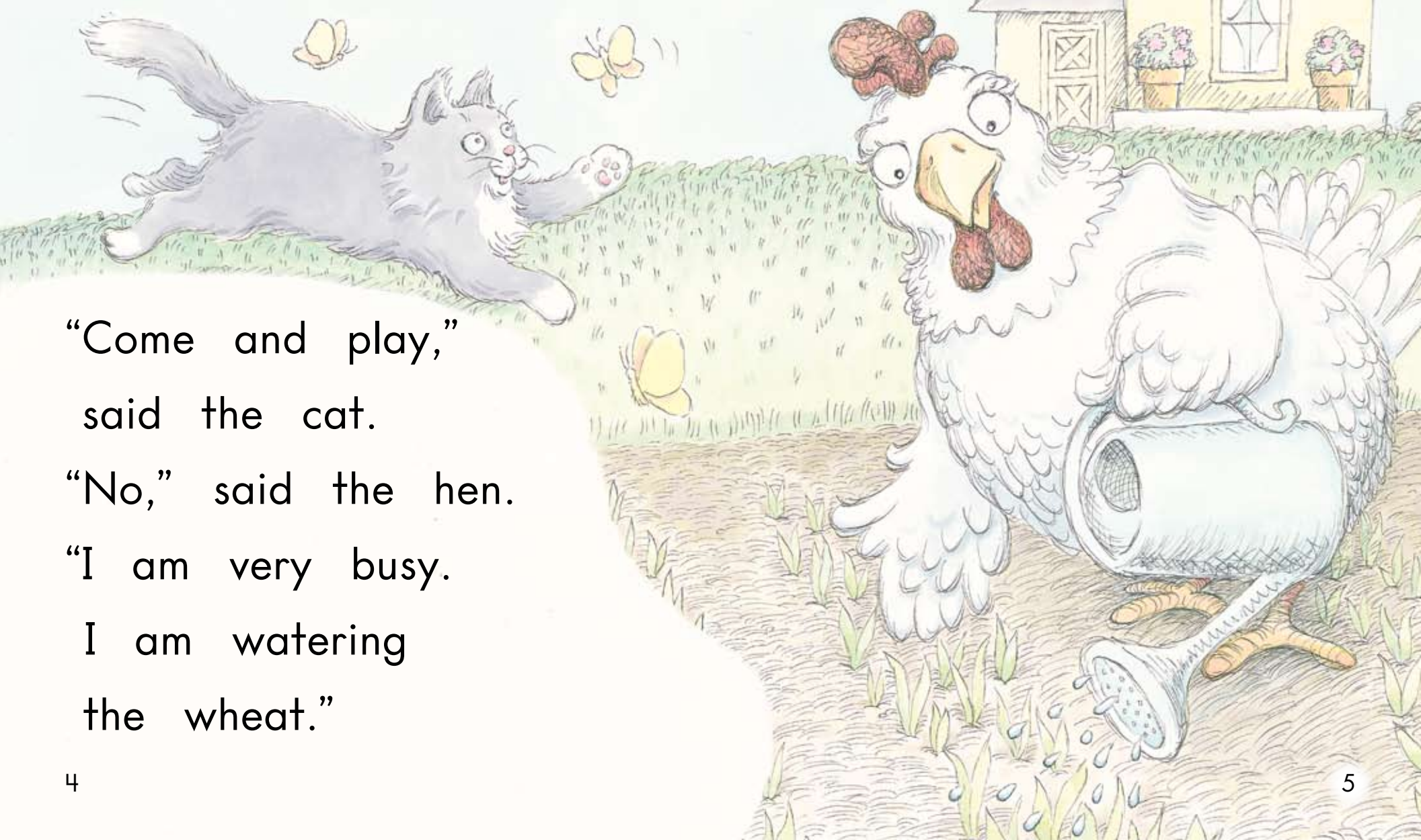


“Come and play,”

“No,” said the hen.

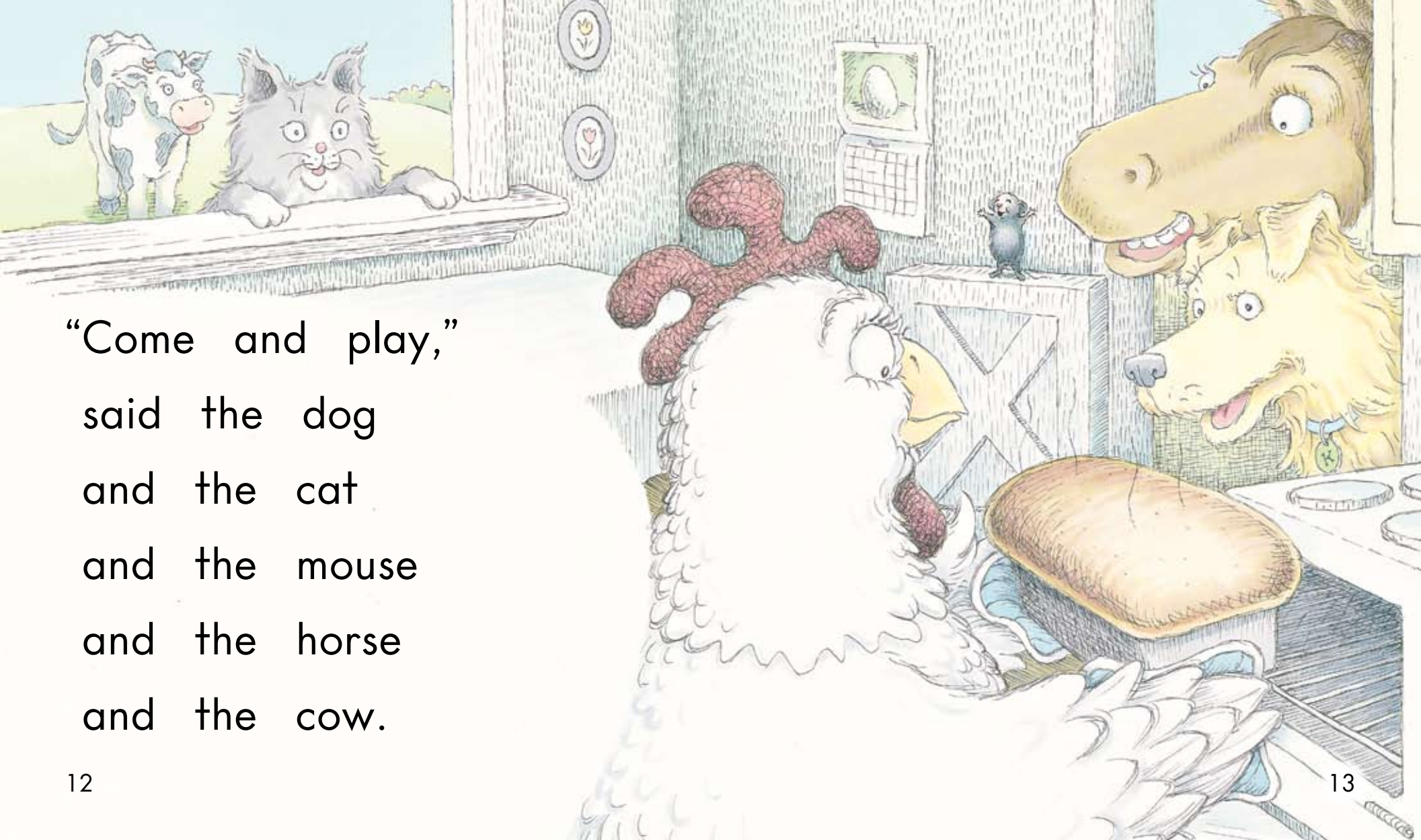
“I am very busy.

“No,” said the hen.

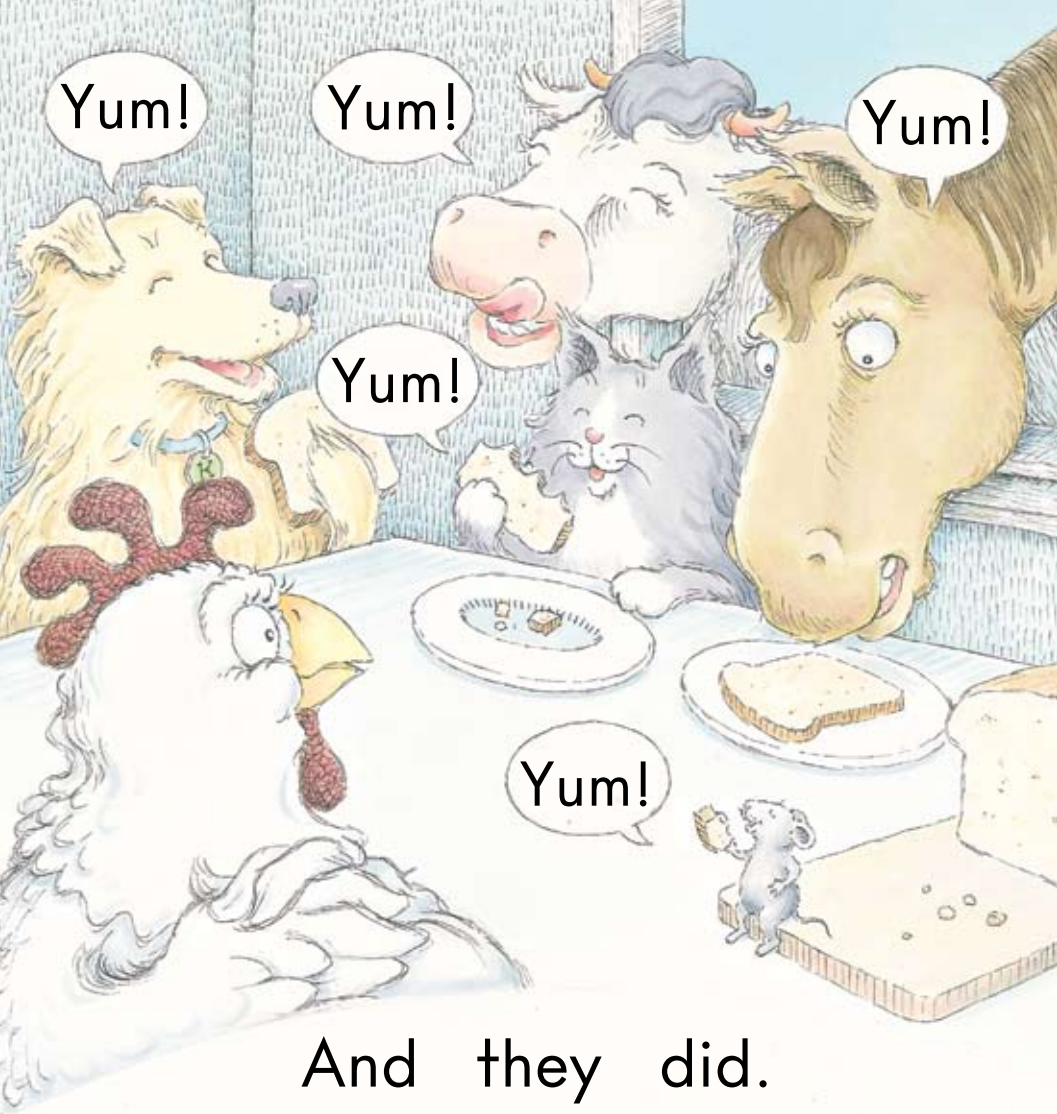
“I am very busy.
