Is it for you and Mother?”

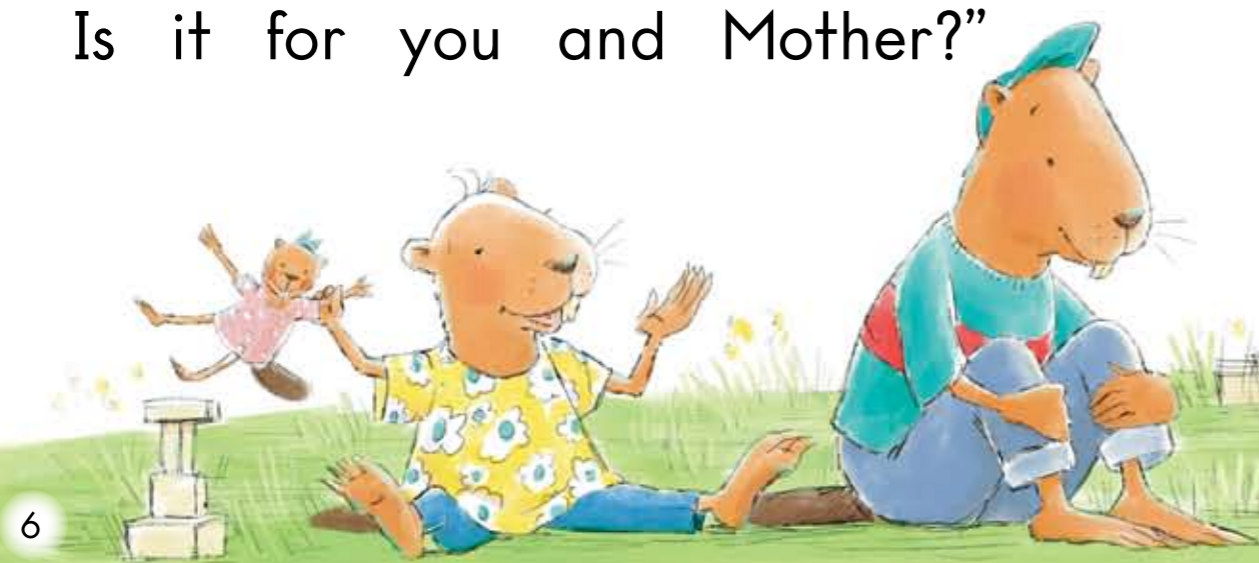
Father Beaver said,
