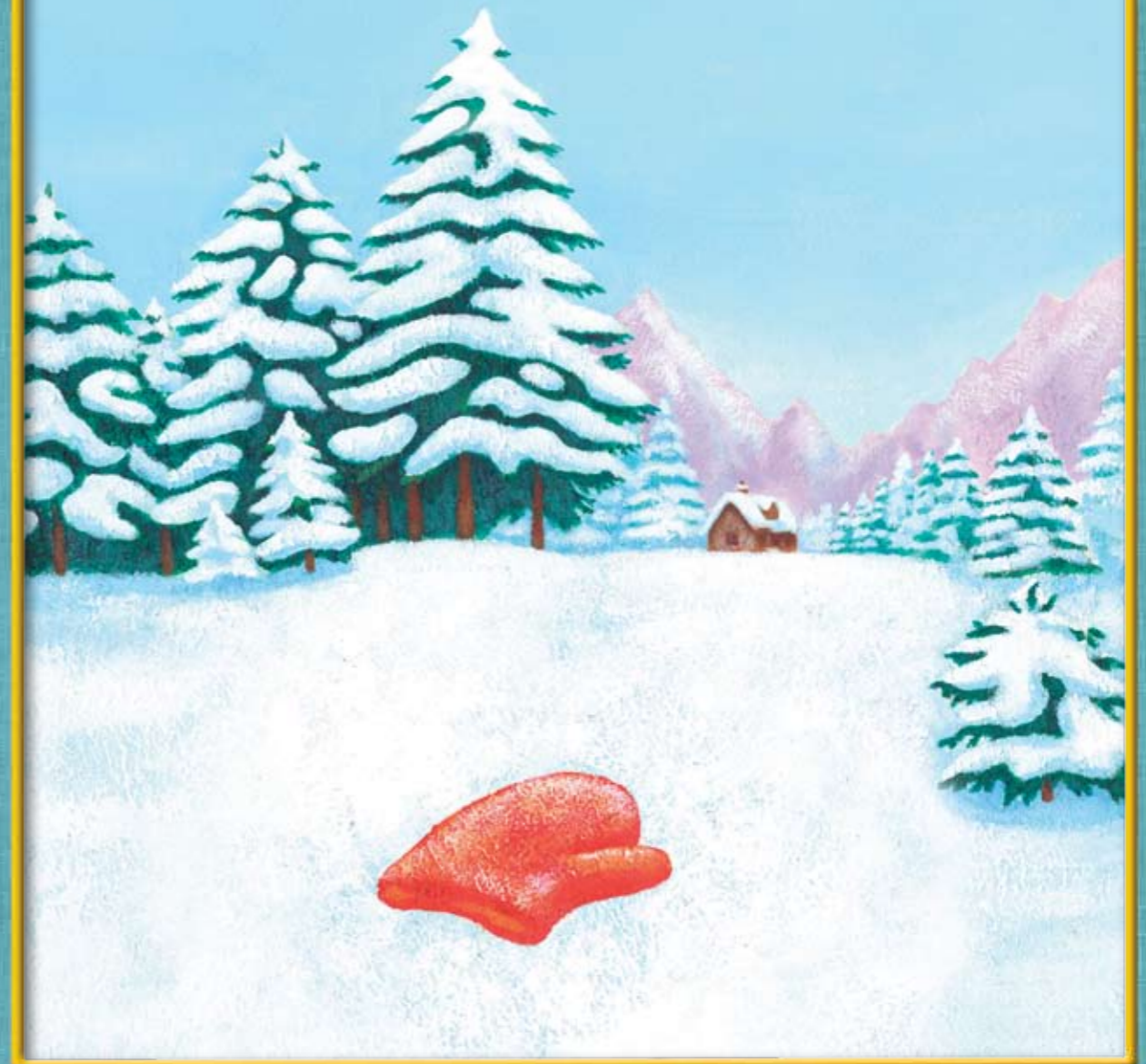

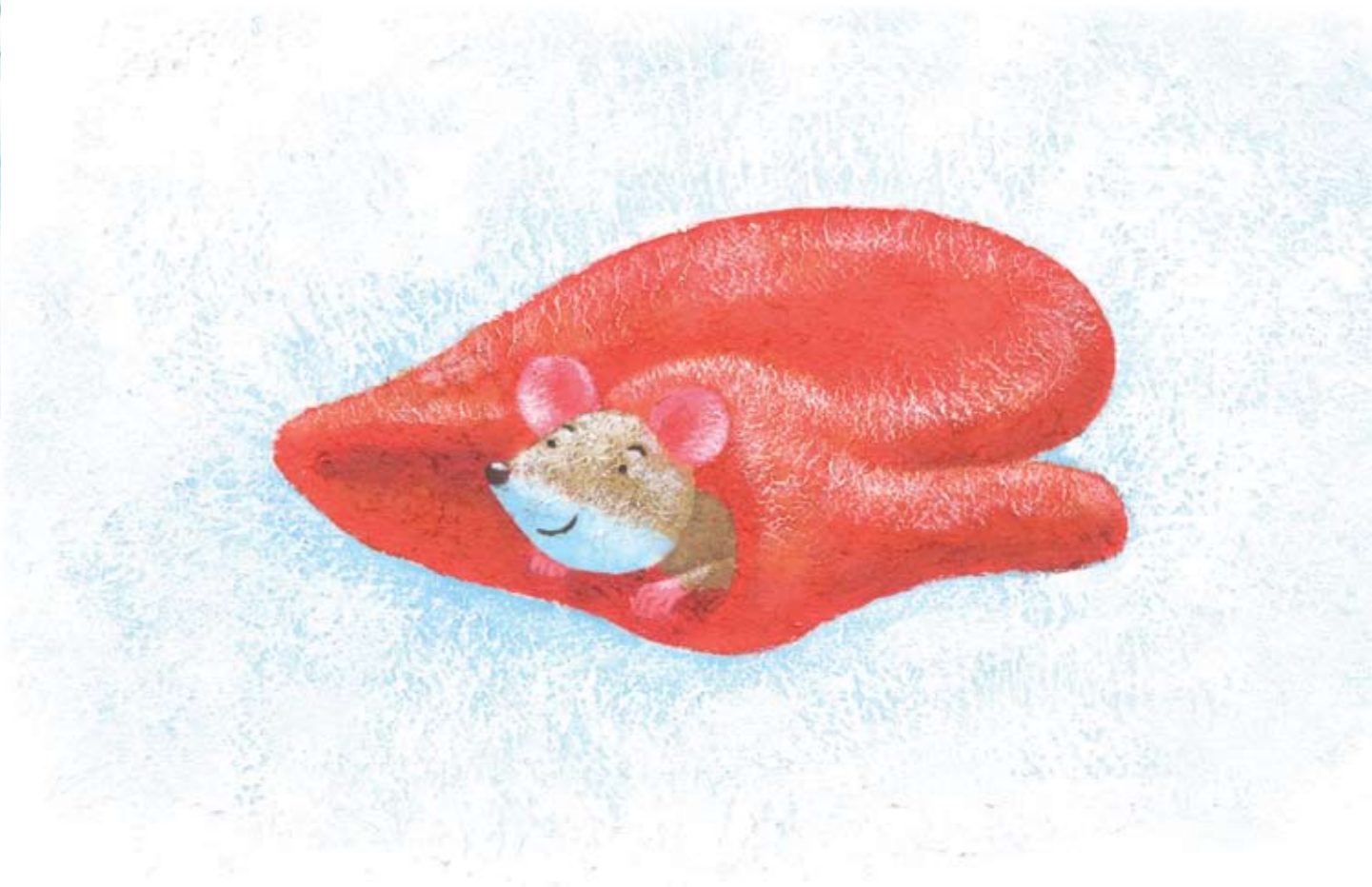

The raccoon went in.

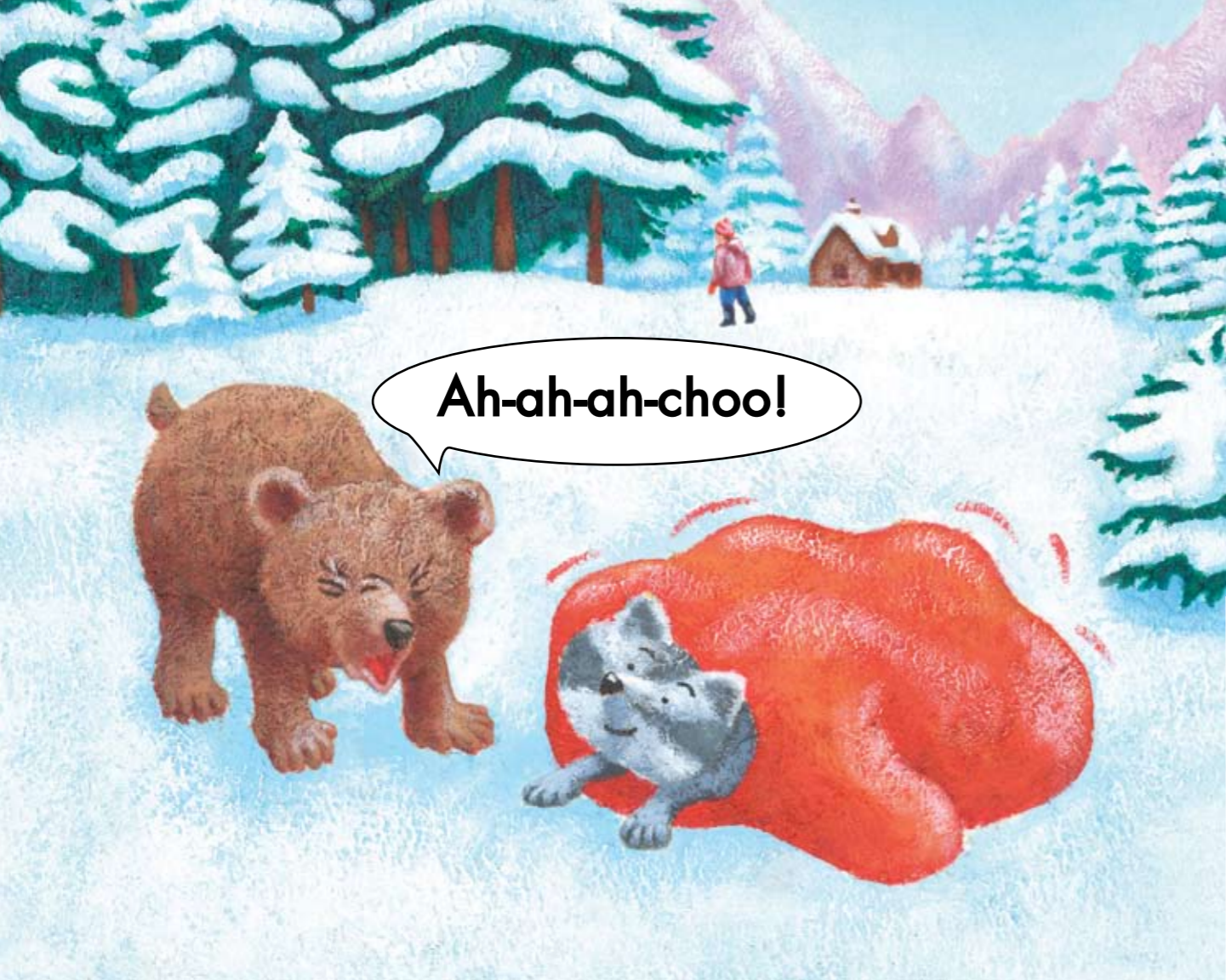
“I like it in here,”
