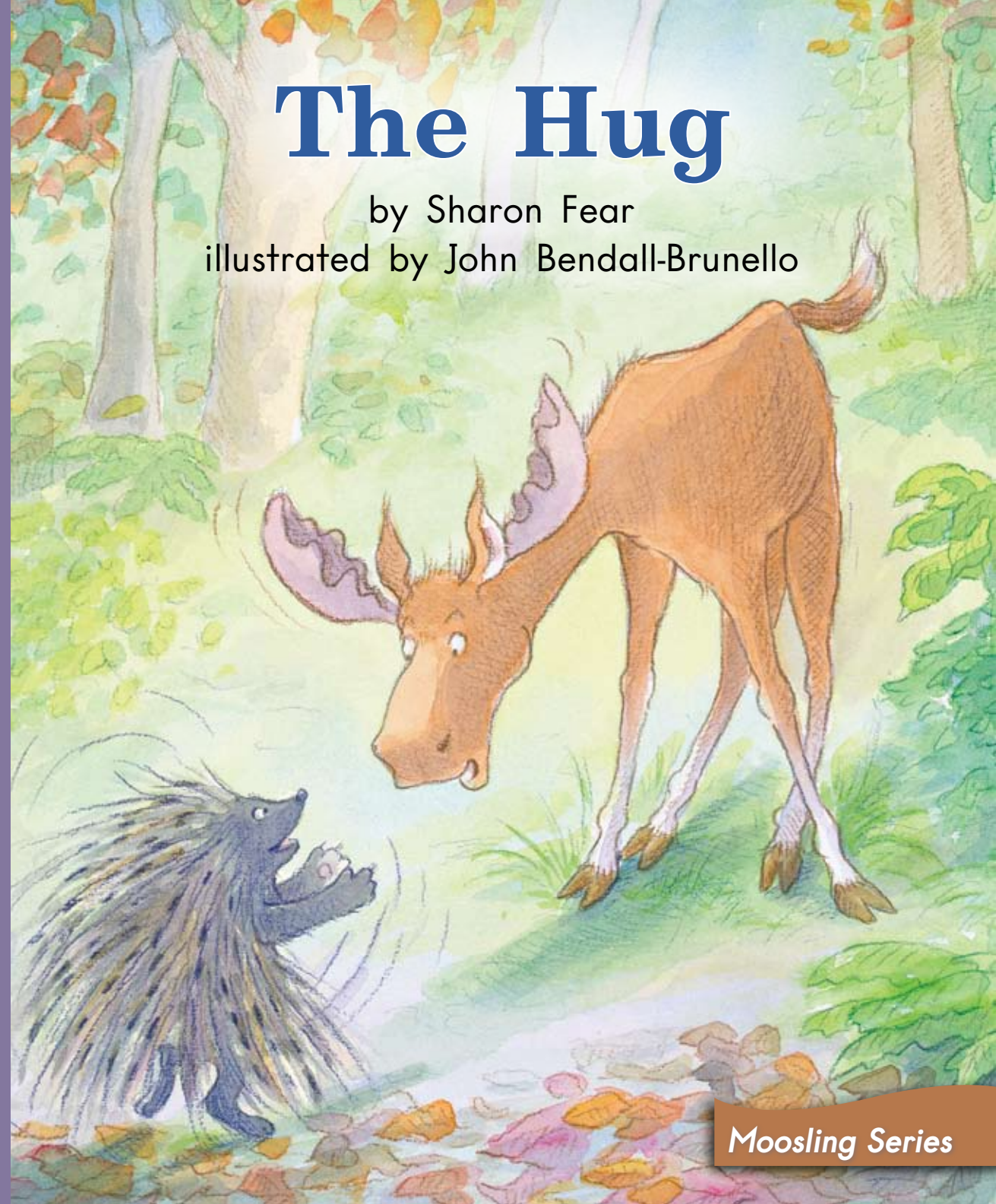

“Will you hug me, Hoot?”



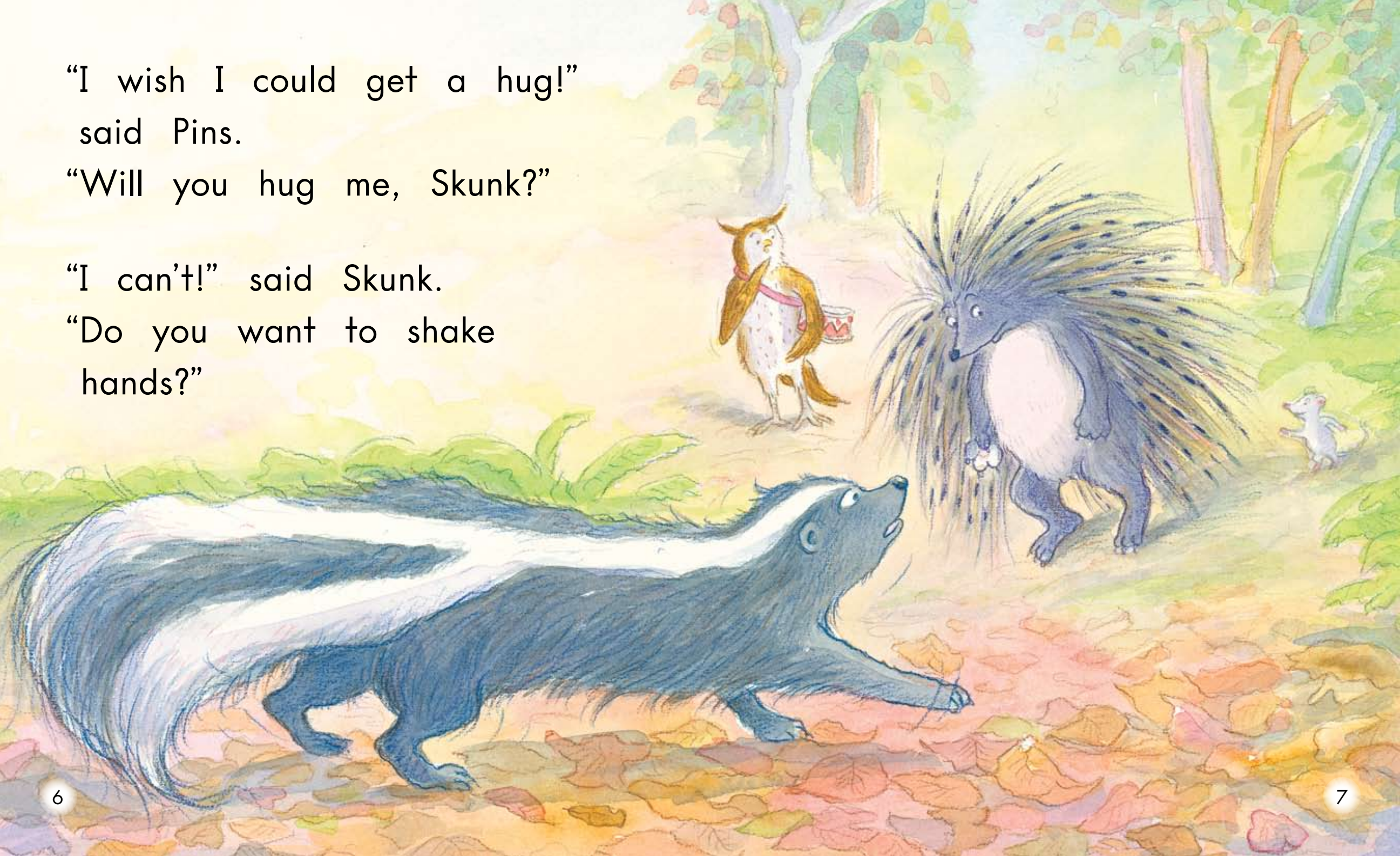
“I wish I could,” said Hoot.

said Mouse.

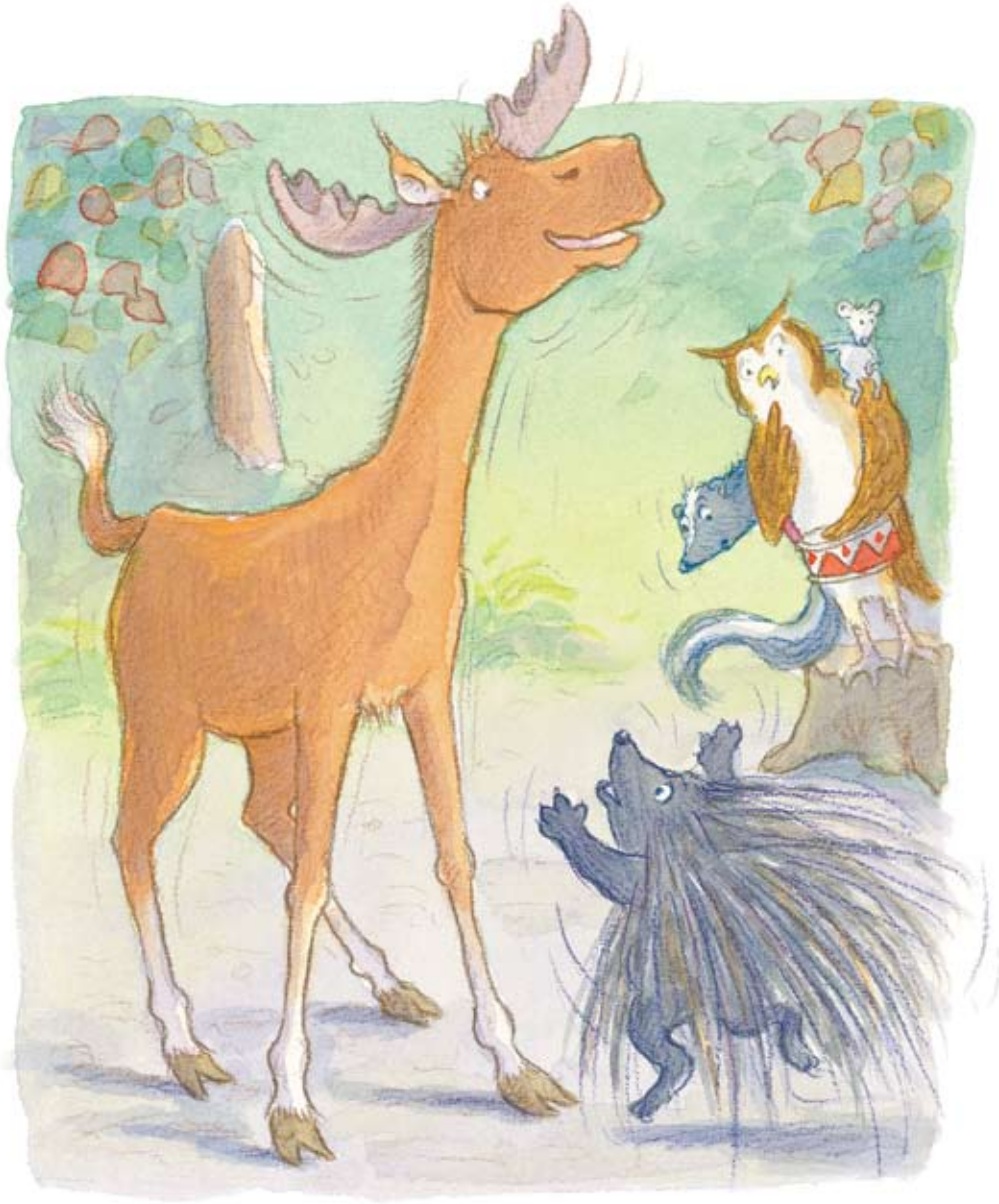


Little Pins played the drum.

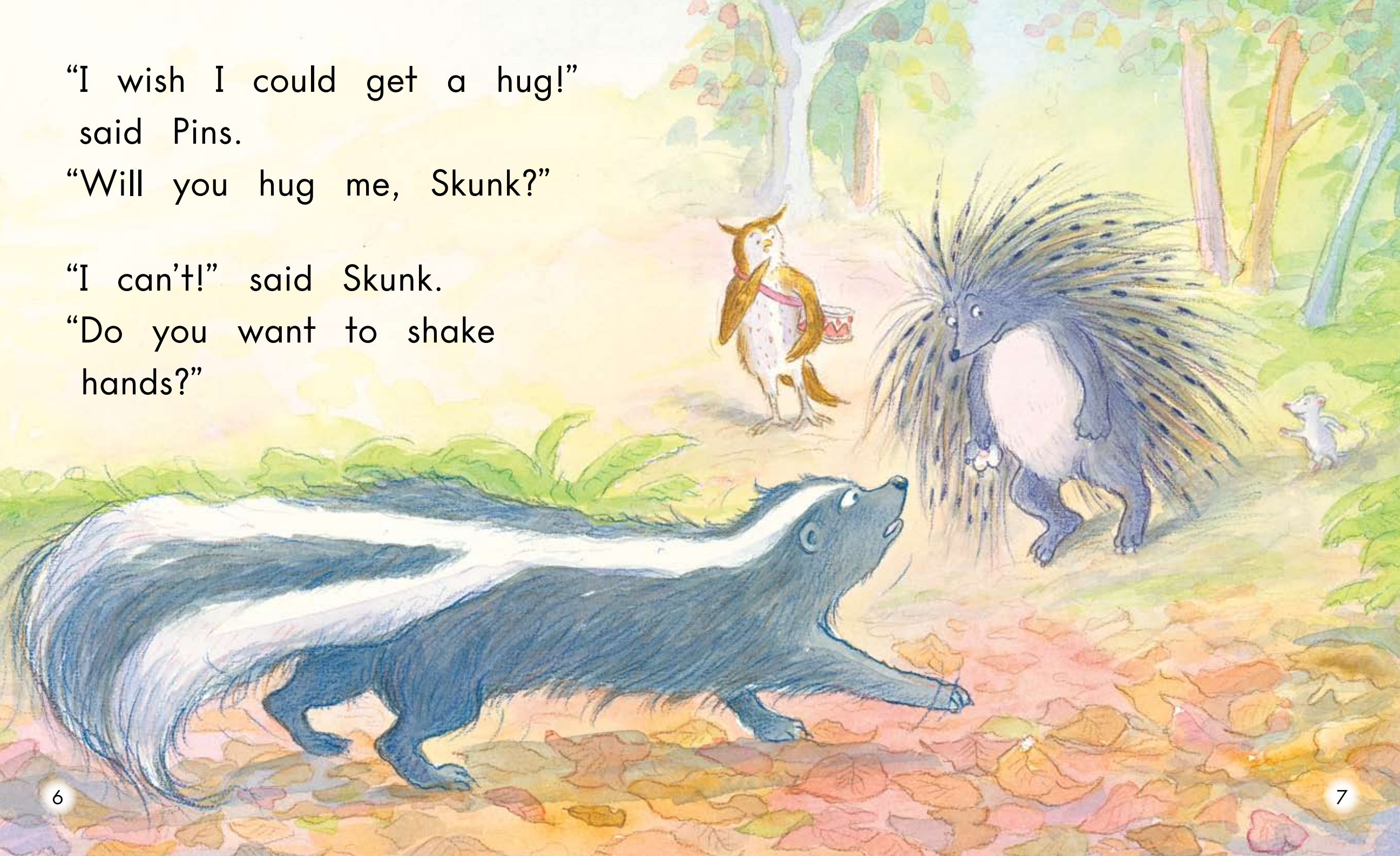

said Mouse.

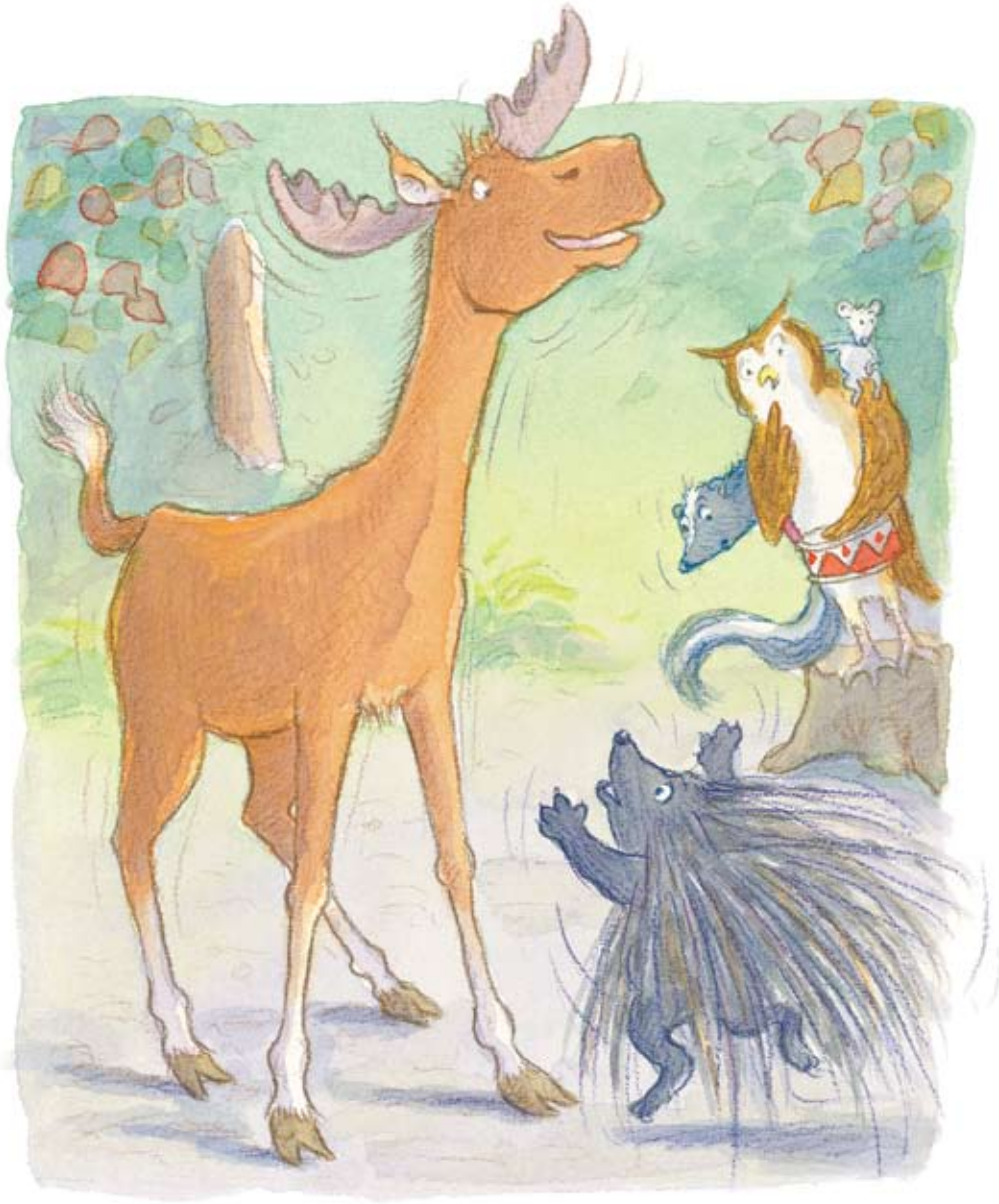
