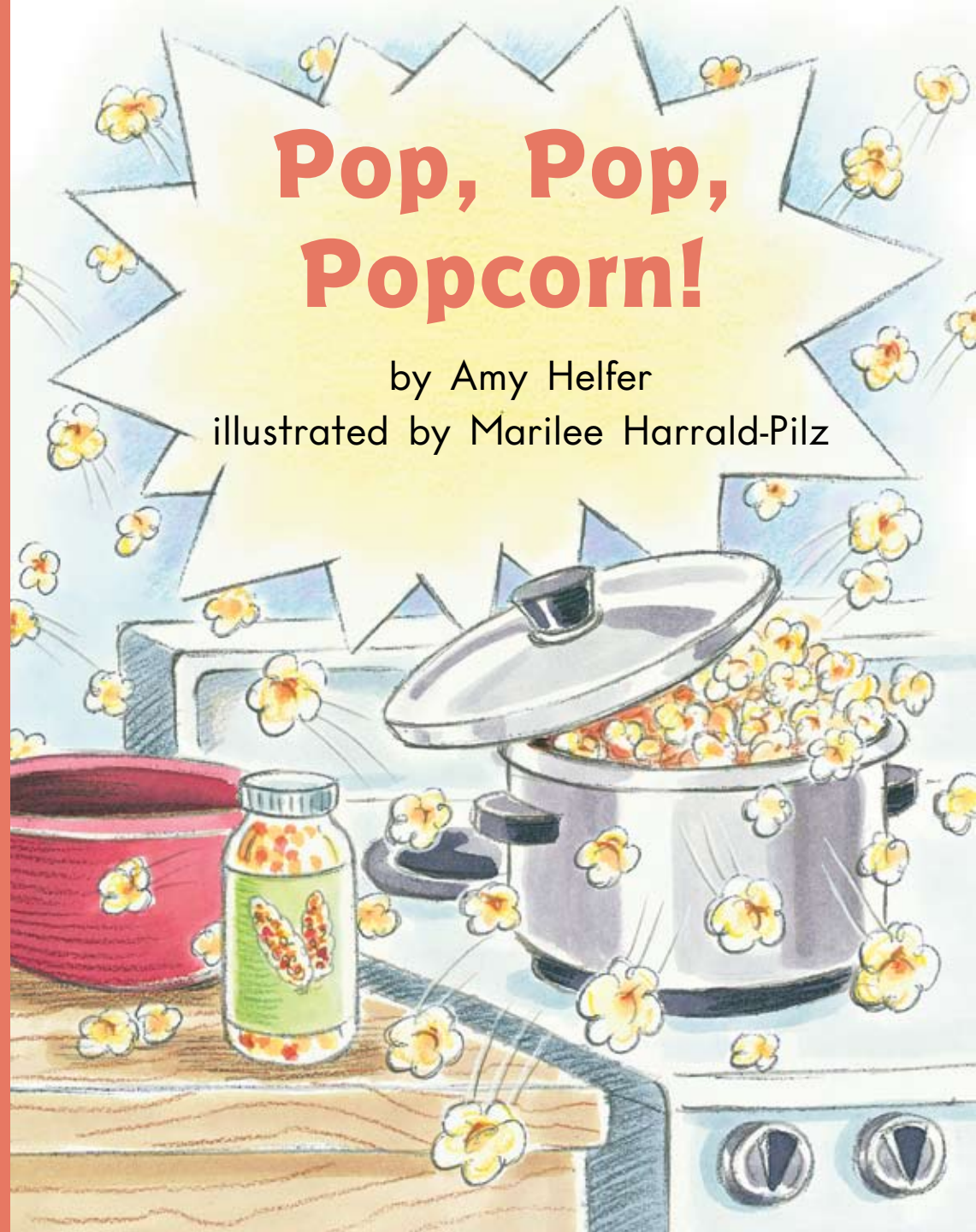

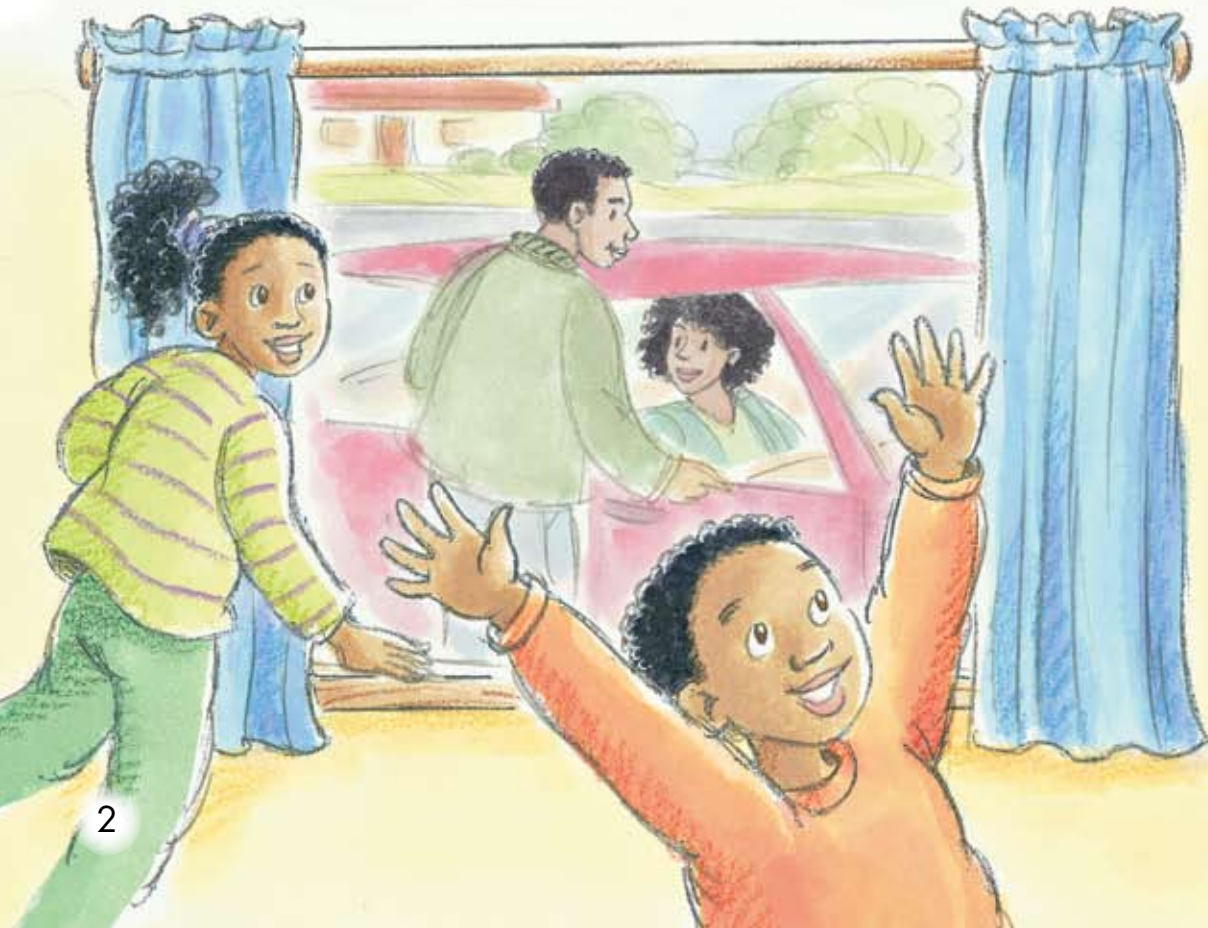

Pop, Pop, Popcorn!

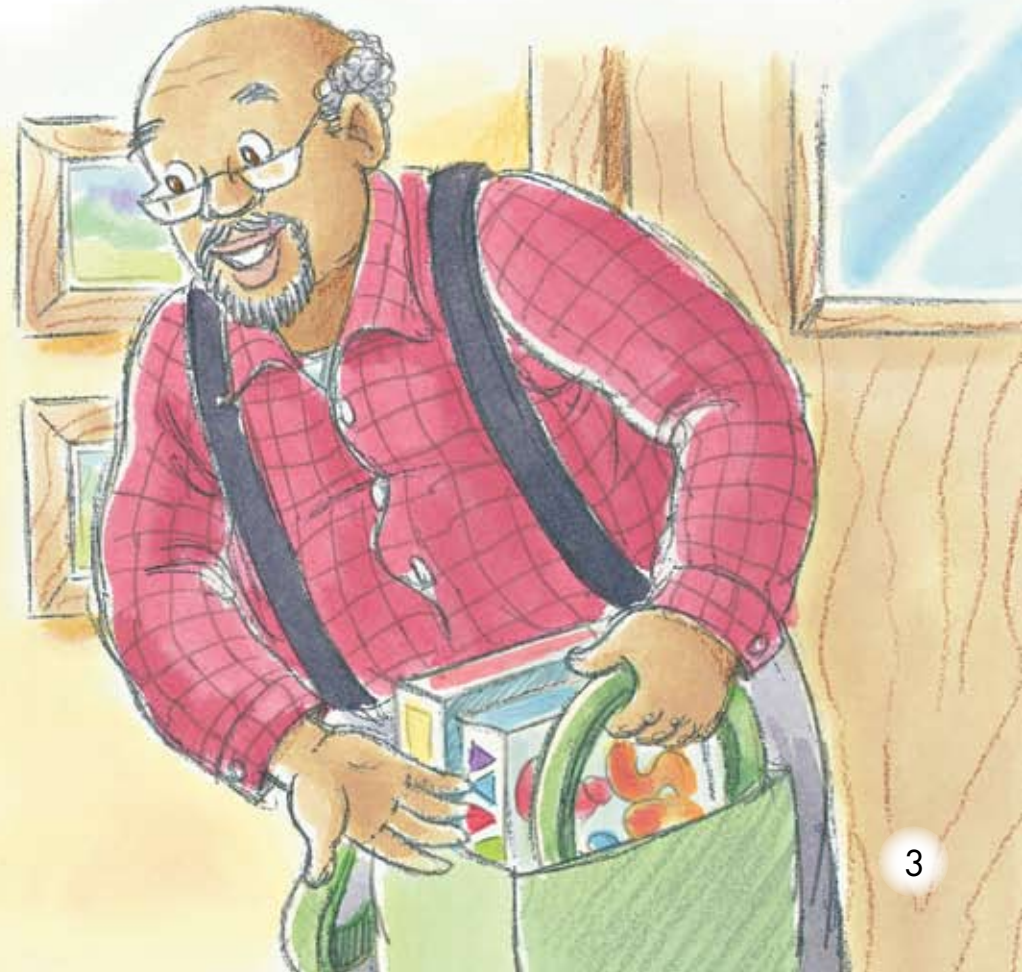

“So do I,” said Grace.



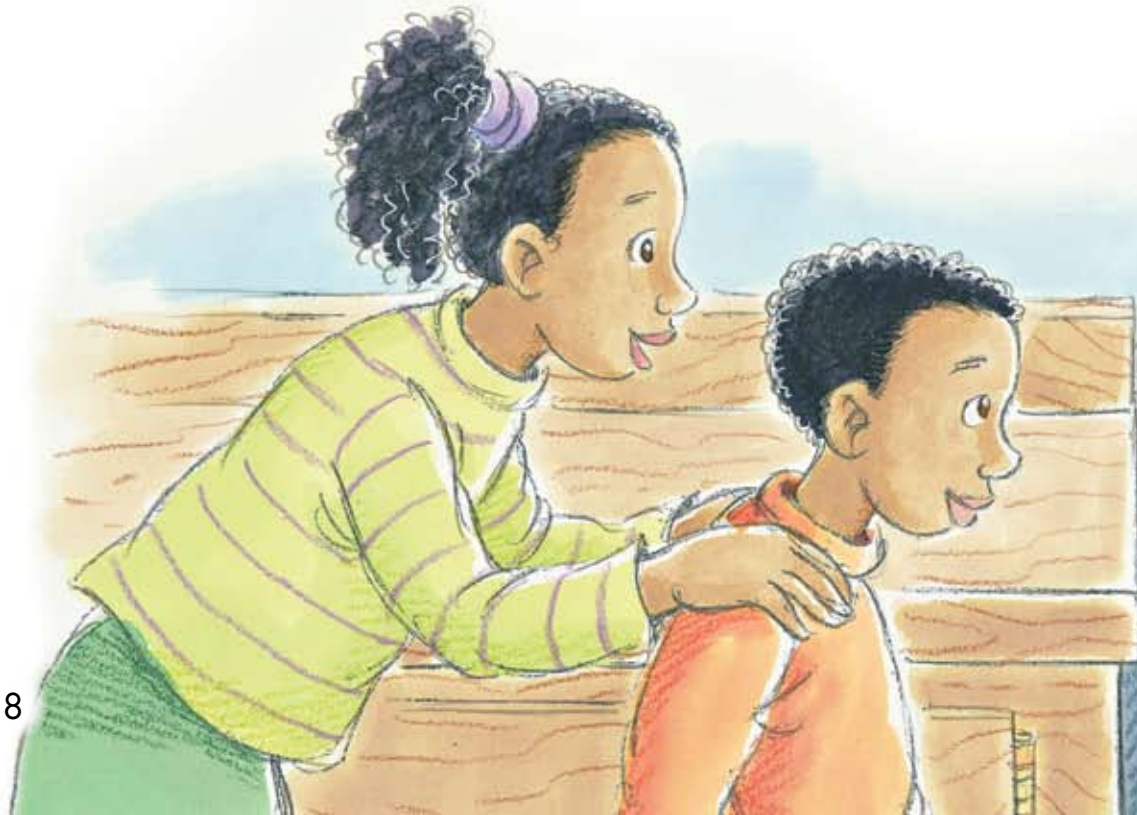
Gramps got the popcorn.

and popcorn into the pot.

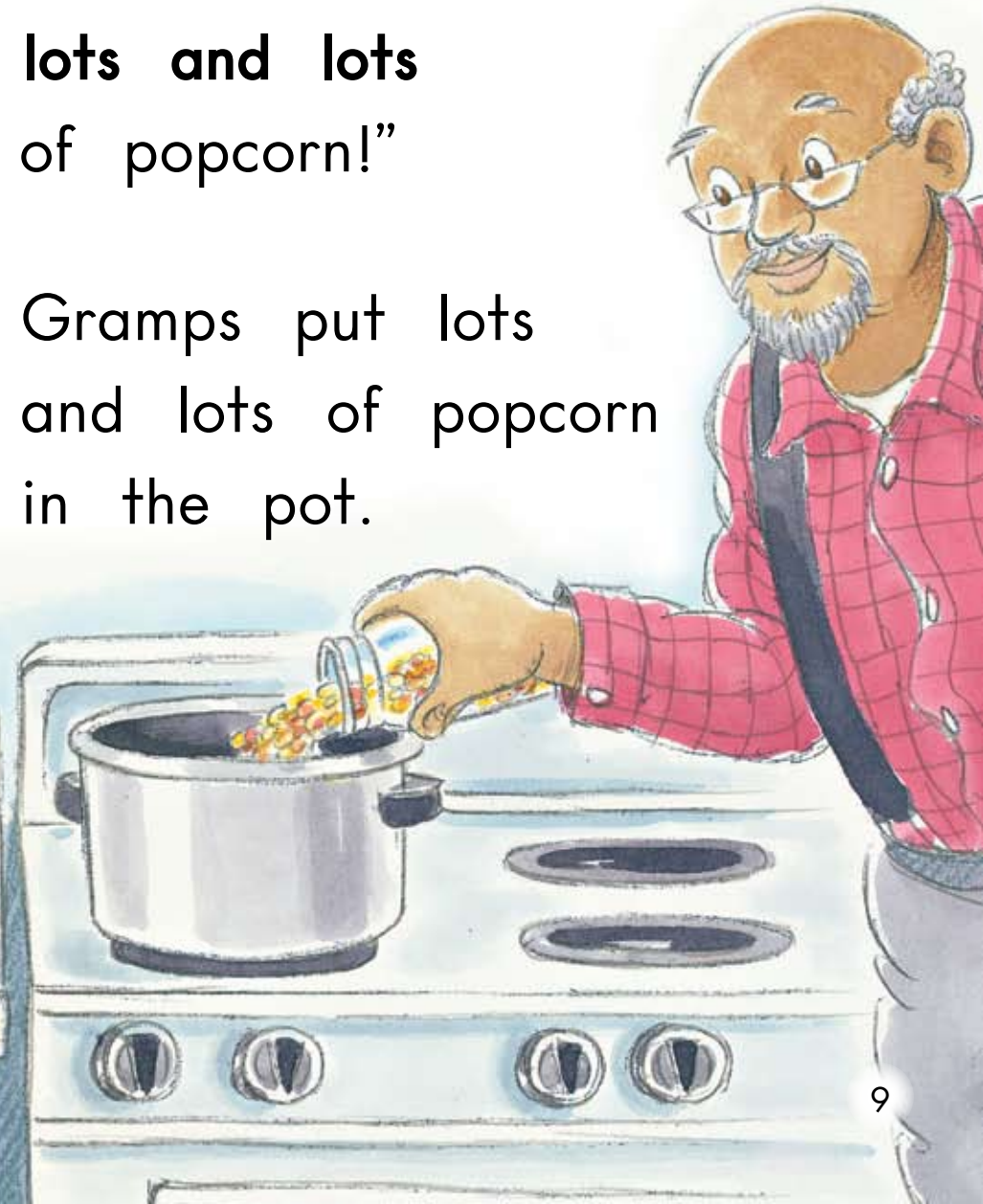
“We love popcorn,”

popcorn in the pot.

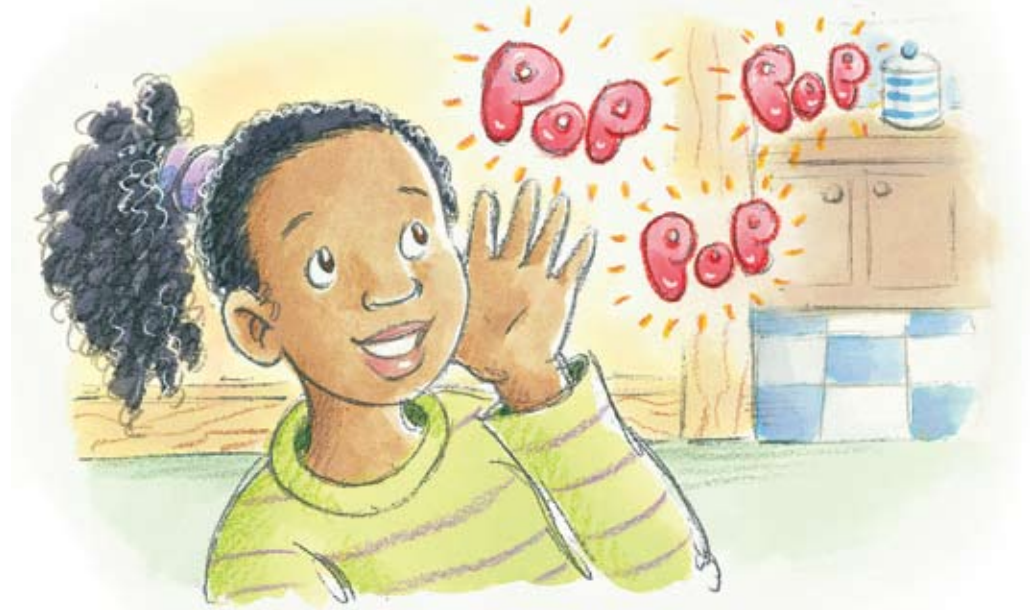


I said, “We like
