




Mom and Dad went to the movies.

"I have lots of fun games for you and Grace."




Gramps took out one of the games to play.

"Sure," said Gramps.


"I love popcorn."

I got a bowl for the popcorn.






Gramps put the pot on the stove.

Then we went back to play the game.






"I hear the popcorn popping," said Grace. "When can we eat it?"
