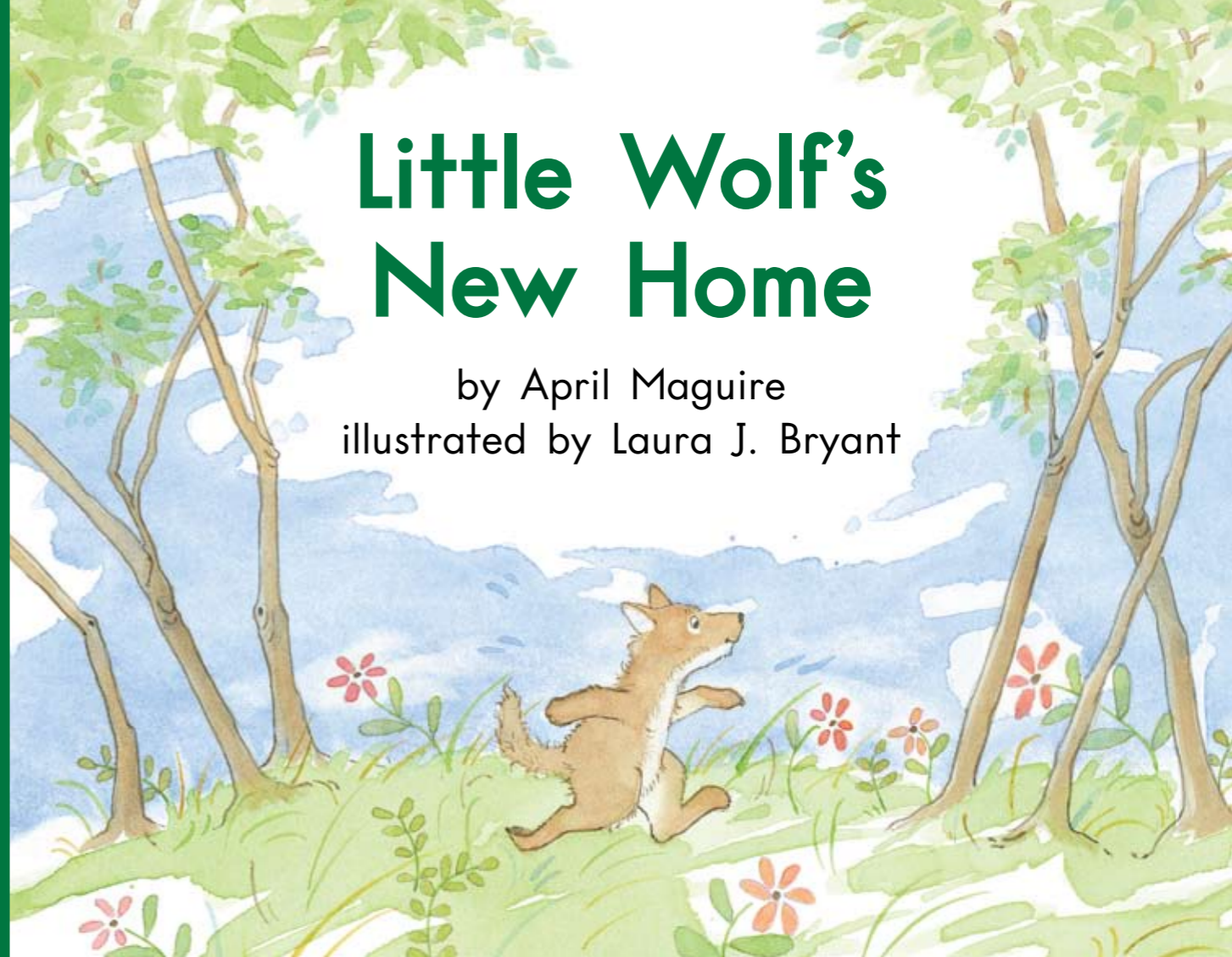

better home.

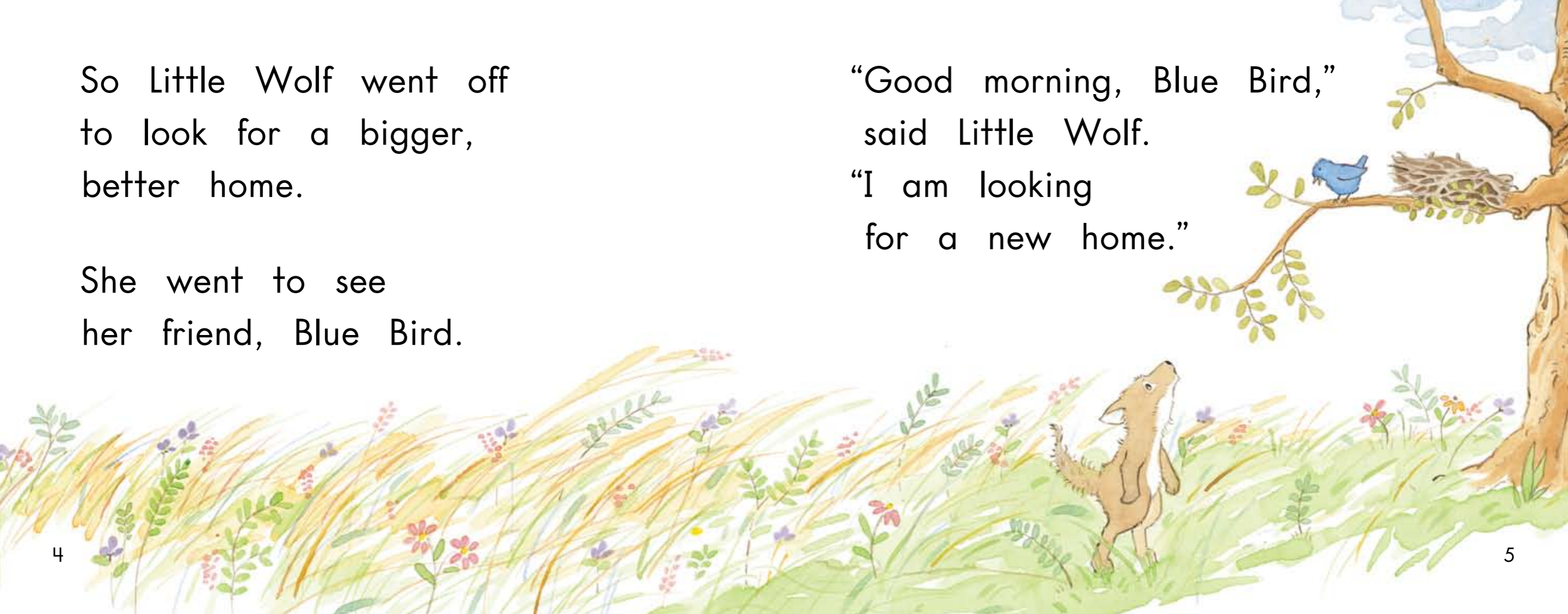


So Little Wolf went off

“A tree is a good home.”

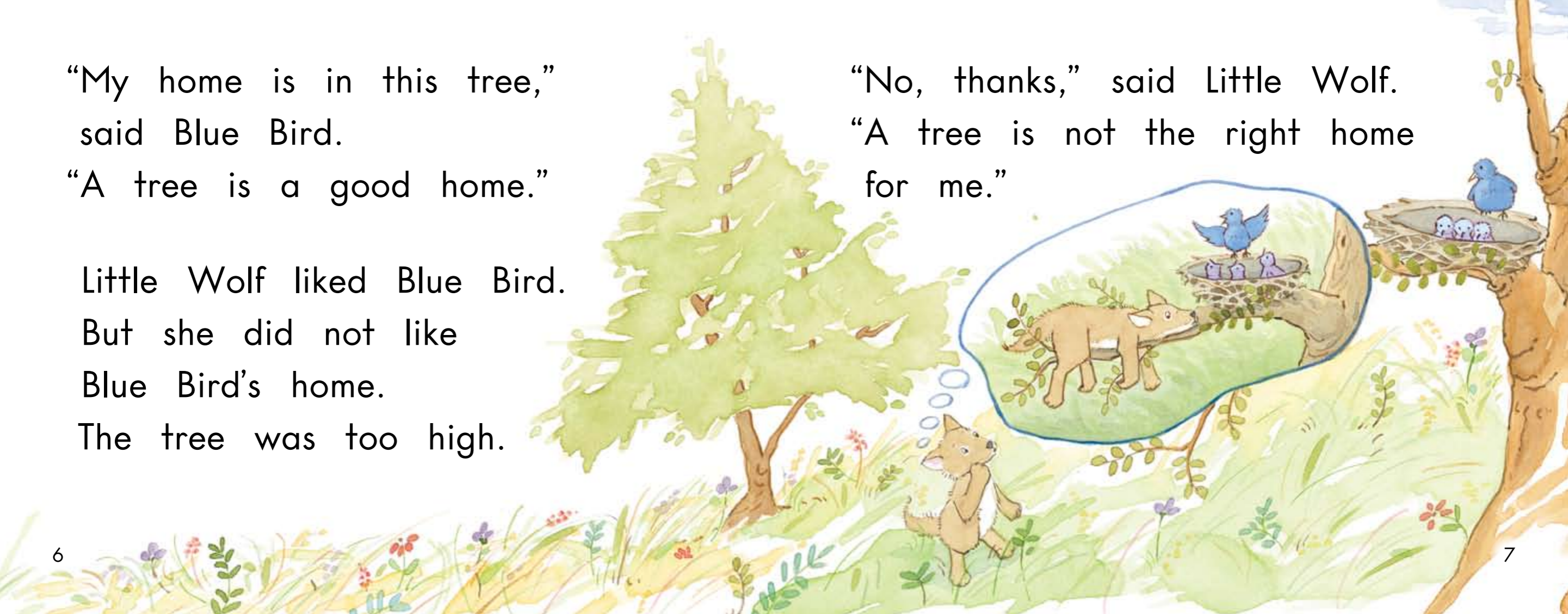
Little Wolf liked Blue Bird.

“Well,” said Bear.

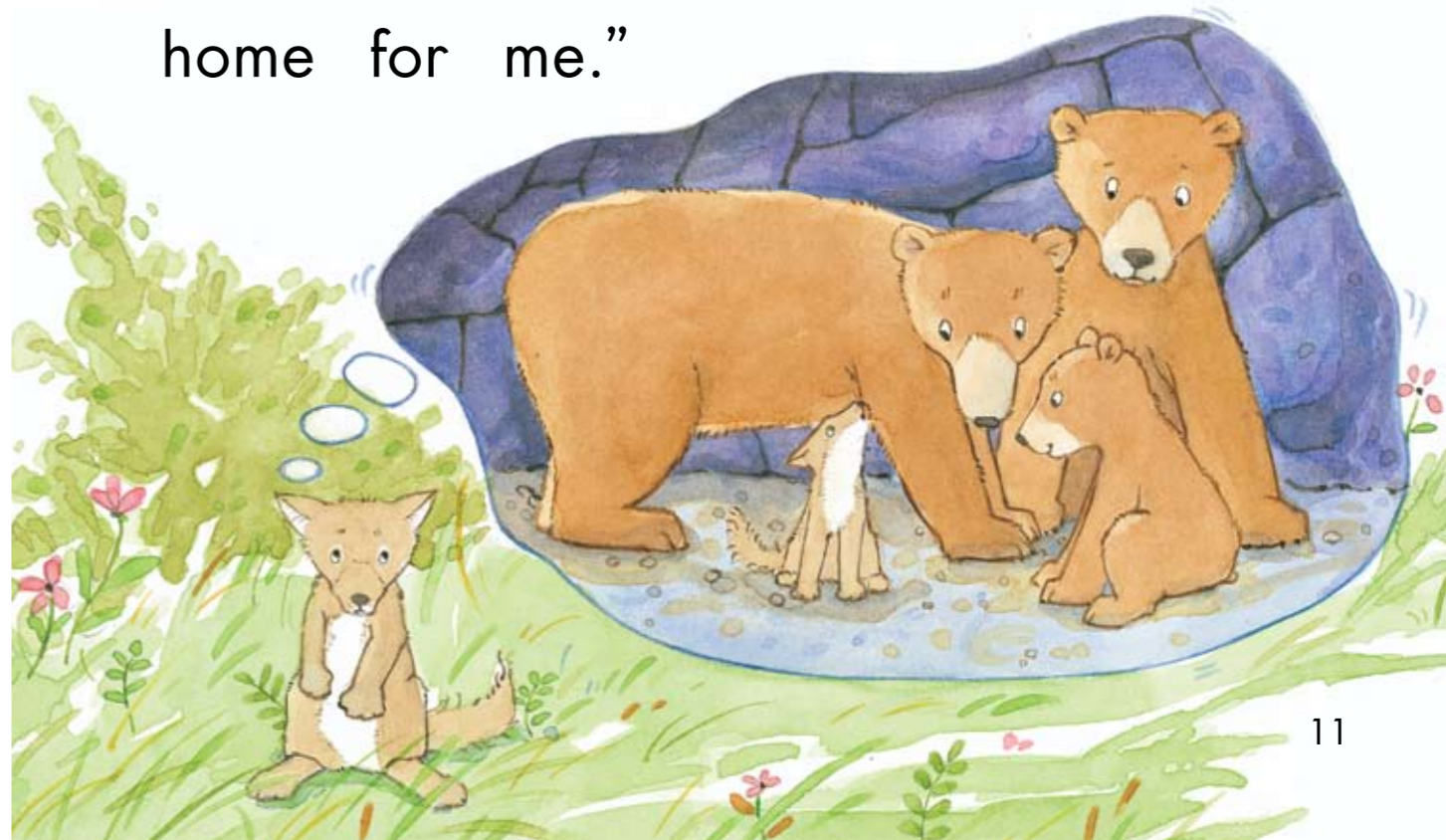
“A cave is a good home.”

home for me.”

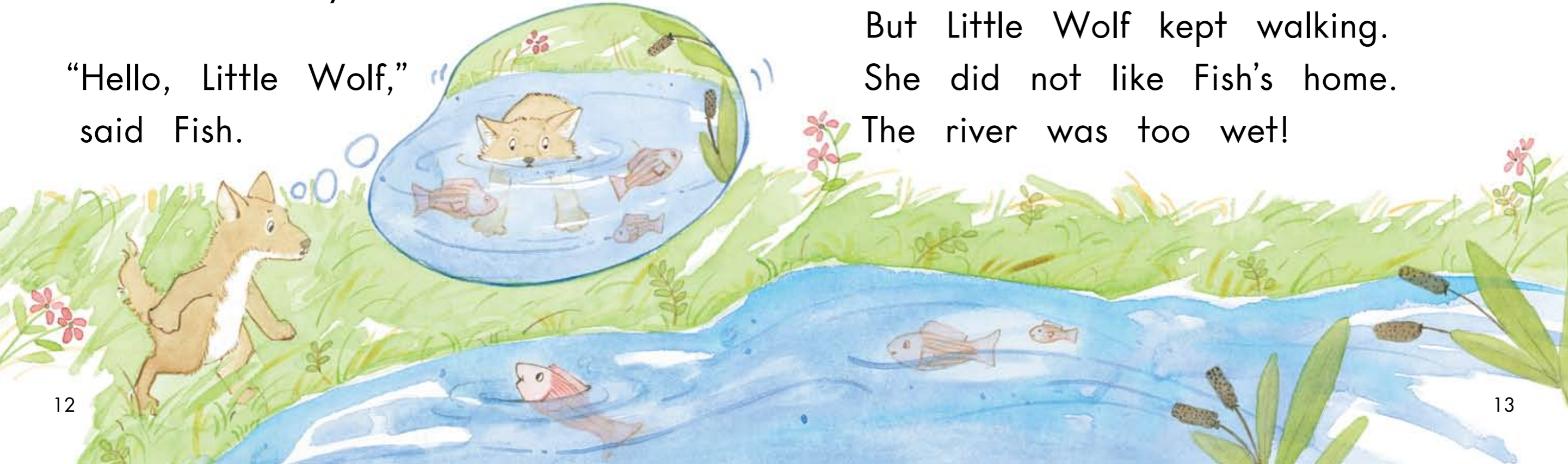


Little Wolf walked on and on.
She walked by a river.

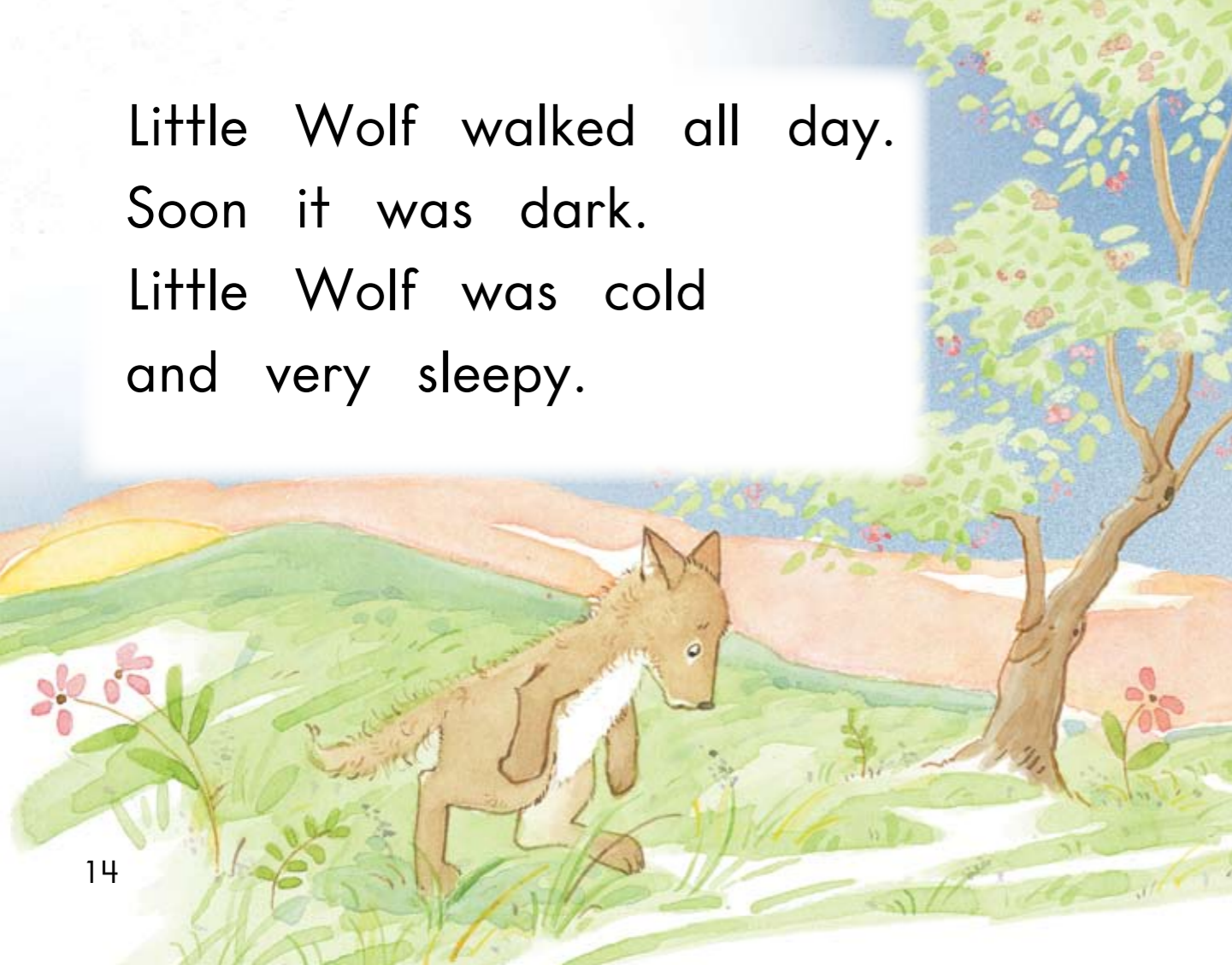
“Hello, Little Wolf,”
